# Introduction

- ▶ The aim of this report is to provide a second global insight into the composition of **VOD catalogues in the 27 Member States of the European Union** (hereafter EU27), the first since the United Kingdom left the European Union, looking at both film and TV content with **7 research questions** addressed:
  - ▶ What is the average and median size of TVOD and SVOD catalogues, for film and TV content?
  - ▶ What are the regions of origin of unique titles in VOD catalogues?
  - ▶ What are the shares of films and TV content by region of origin in VOD catalogues?
  - ▶ On average, what is the country and service circulation of unique titles by region of origin?
  - ▶ Which players offer the largest number of film and TV content, and what are the shares of this content by region of origin?
  - ▶ What is the share of national and EU27 non-national works in VOD catalogues?
  - ▶ Which EU27 production countries are the main exporters of film and TV titles on VOD in the EU27?
- ▶ For film data, 138 TVOD catalogues and 185 SVOD catalogues were analysed based on JustWatch, Filmtoro, La Pantalla Digital and EUROVOD catalogue data. The data was collected in May 2020 and the titles were matched through databases with their countries of production.
- ▶ For TV content, the analysis was based on JustWatch data from 160 Subscription Video-On-Demand (SVOD) catalogues in 20 EU countries and on 47 Transactional Video-On-Demand (TVOD) catalogues in 14 EU countries. The data was collected in May 2020 and the TV titles were matched through databases with their countries of production.

# Methodology

- ▶ A film is defined as a feature film, fiction film, documentary or other film content available in the “Film” / “Movie” section of the VOD catalogues part of the sample.
- ▶ For the TV content section, all content classified under as “TV” on VOD services is considered.
- ▶ The contents were analysed as unique and cumulated titles (for films), and as unique and cumulated seasons or episodes (for the TV content) available on VOD.
- ▶ For the **origin of a title, only the first country of production was considered**. The production countries are based on data collected from the European Audiovisual Observatory’s LUMIERE database on admissions to films in Europe, IMDb and the Movie database.
- ▶ **4 regions of origin for a title are considered**: ‘EU27’ titles have an EU27 country as first production country, ‘Other European’ (EUR OBS) titles have as a first production country a European country part of the European Audiovisual Observatory, ‘US’ titles from the United States of America and ‘Other region’/‘Other international’ titles from all other countries.
- ▶ The shares included in this report are only indicative and minor identification errors might have occurred.
- ▶ Please quote this report as “Film and TV content in VOD catalogues – 2020 edition”, European Audiovisual Observatory.

## Main findings – Film and TV content

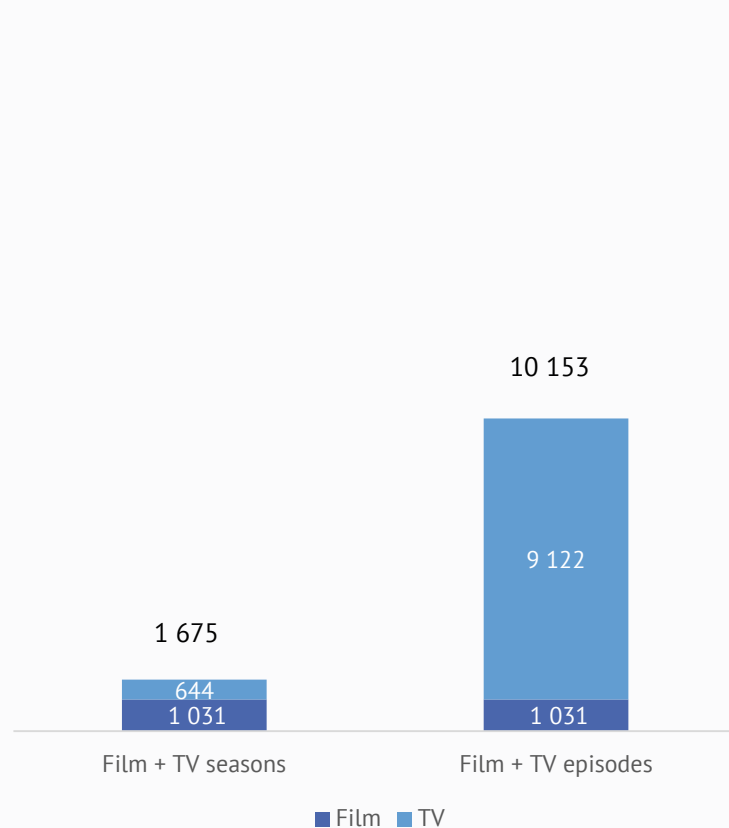
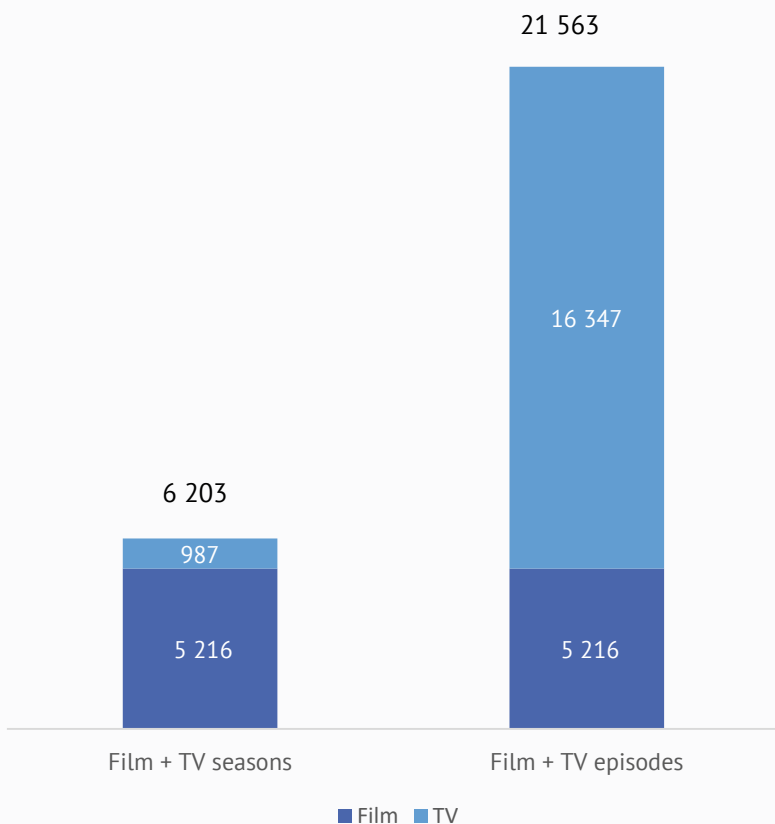
This section builds on the analysis of film + TV content put together, on TVOD and SVOD. The samples for film and TV content being partially different, these results should be taken as indicative.

# Average size of catalogues: the impact of choice of indicators on the results

- ▶ On average, there were more film titles than TV seasons, mainly on TVOD (5 times more).
- ▶ Considering TV episodes, TV content offer was on average nine times bigger than film offer on SVOD, and 3 times bigger on TVOD.

Size of SVOD catalogues in **average** number of content

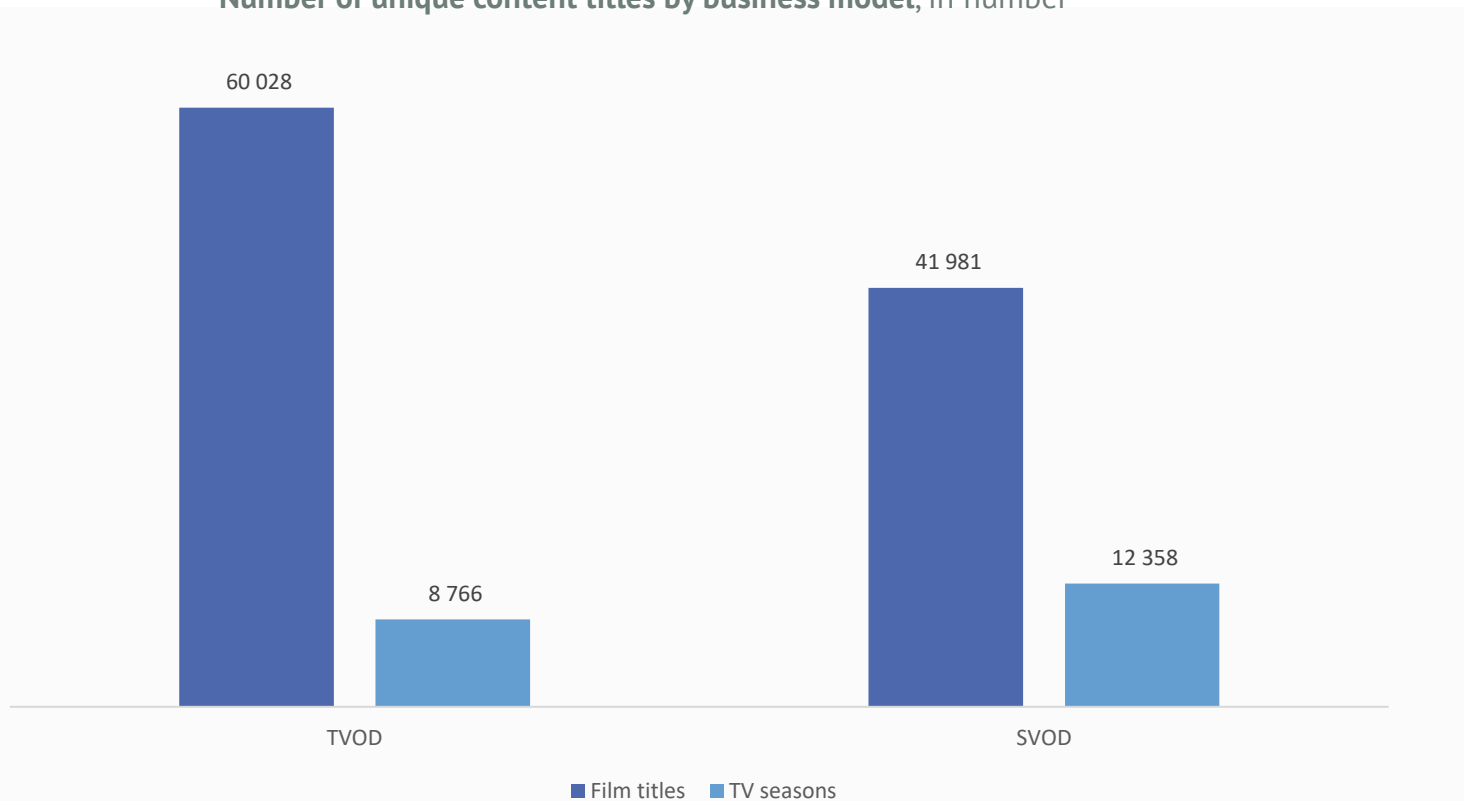

# Bigger offer of unique film titles than of unique TV seasons on VOD

- ▶ The offer of unique film titles was 7 times higher than the offer of unique TV seasons on TVOD, and 3 times higher on SVOD.
- ▶ Proportionally, TVOD was more film-oriented and SVOD was more series-oriented.
- ▶ The presence of more niche TVOD services than SVOD services, specialised in art-house films, also increased the number of unique film titles on TVOD.

Number of unique content titles by business model, in number

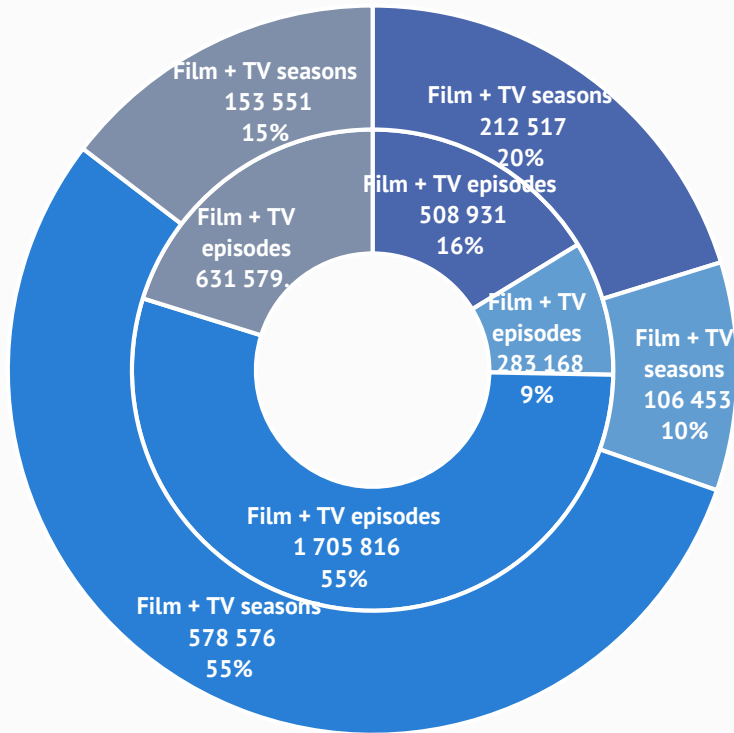

# Origin by region of Films and TV seasons and of Films and TV episodes – all VOD

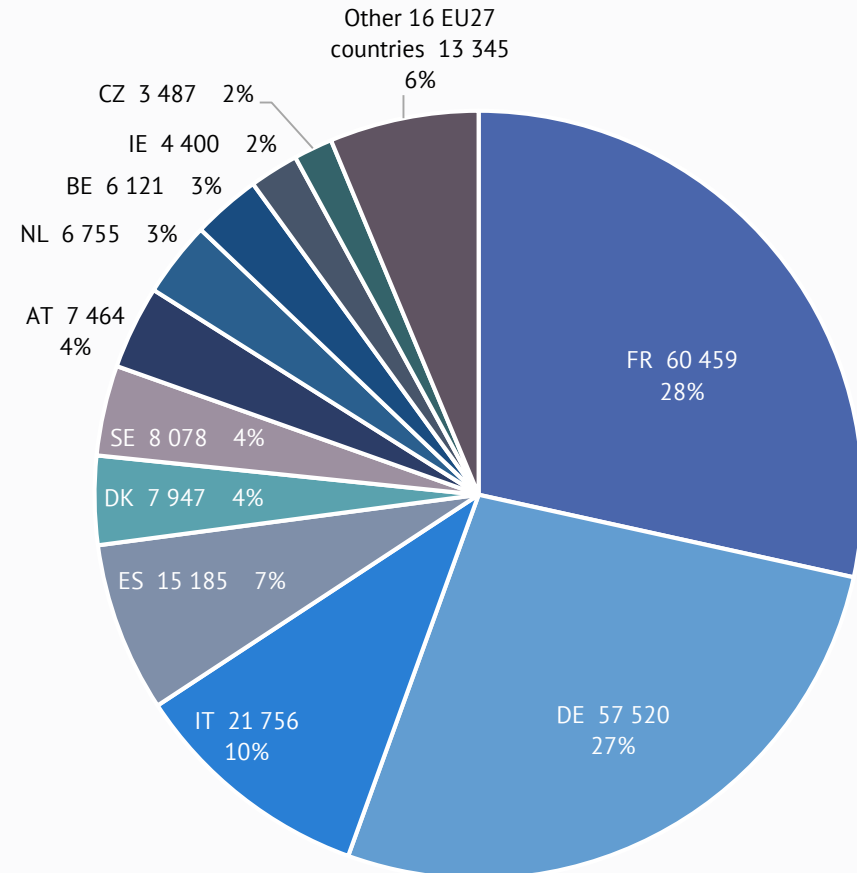
- ▶ On VOD (TVOD and SVOD), EU27 content represented 20% when films and TV seasons were counted, 16% if films and TV episodes were considered.
- ▶ EU27 films and TV seasons originated mainly in France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Denmark, Sweden and Austria with 84% of all EU 27 TV seasons and films.

Origin of EU27 Film and TV seasons found on VOD



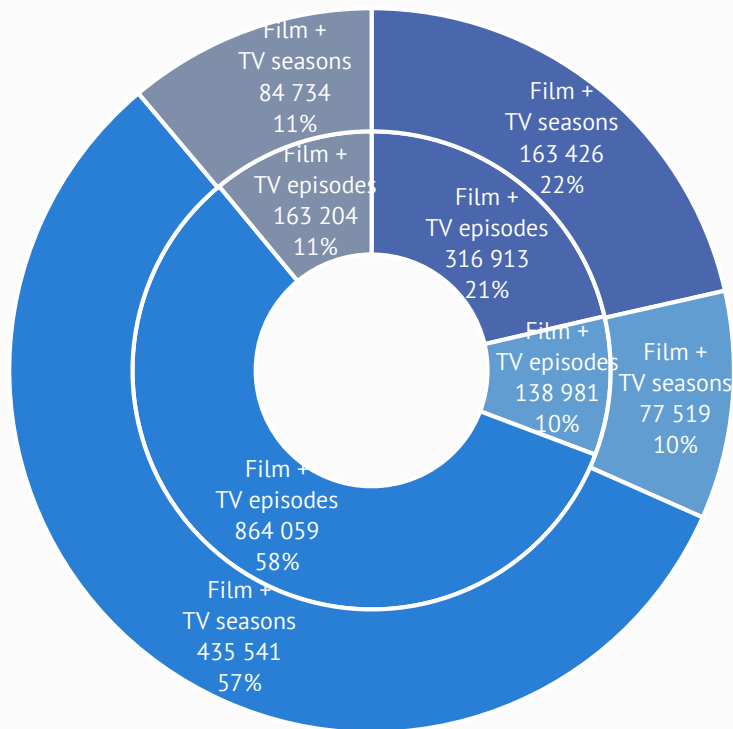

# Origin by region of Films and TV seasons, of Films and TV episodes

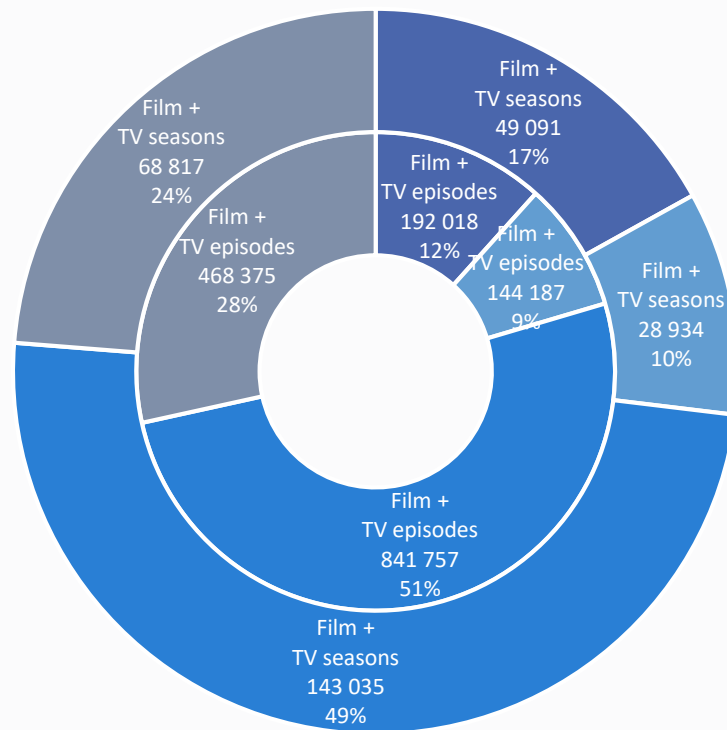
- ▶ On TVOD, EU27 content represented 22% when films and TV seasons were counted, 21% if films and TV episodes were considered. On SVOD, the share of EU27 content was 17% when considering films and TV seasons but fell to 12% when counting films and TV episodes: European TV series are shorter in episodes than other origins series.
- ▶ After Brexit, British content moved under the Other European category, decreasing EU27 shares by 8% in average.
- ▶ On SVOD, content from regions other than Europe or the US were second in share and showed longer in episodes.

Origin of Film and TV seasons or episodes found on SVOD



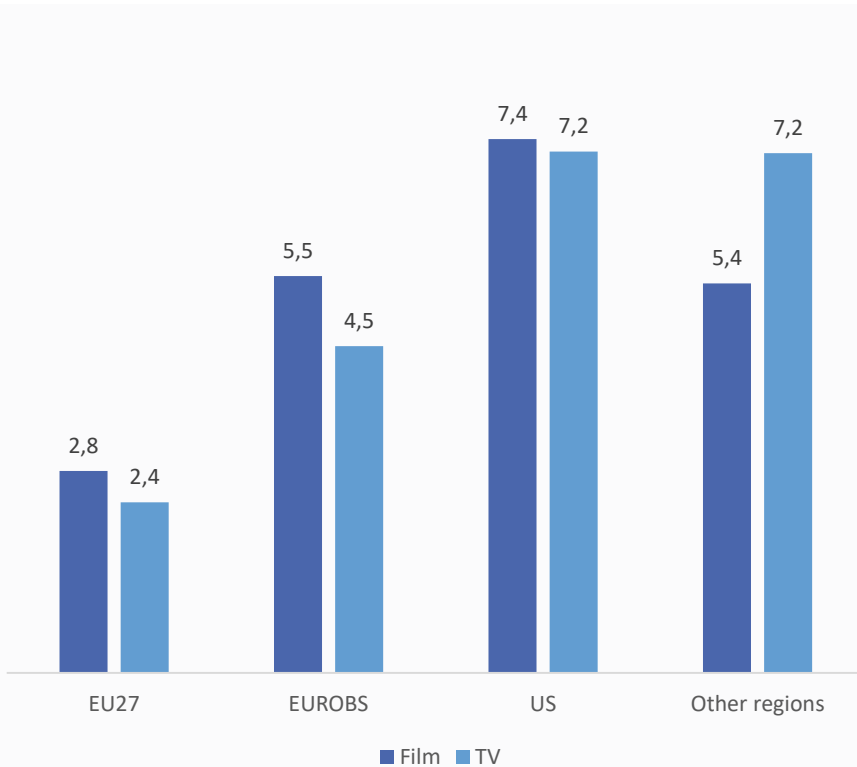

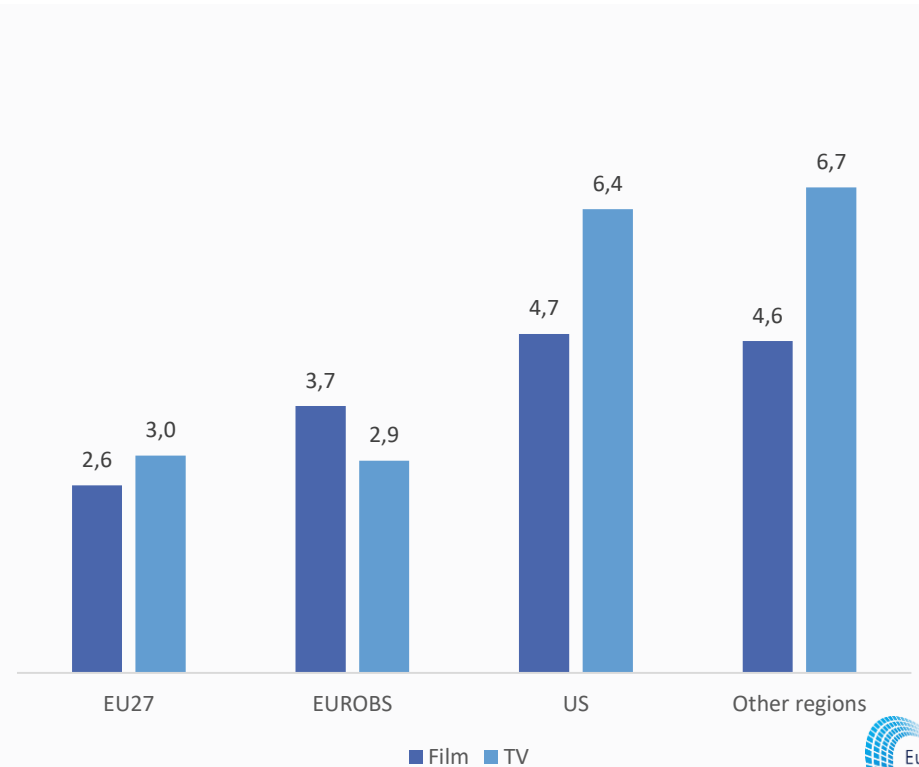
# Country circulation of unique content by region and by business type (SVOD-TVOD)

- ▶ EU27 content circulated in less countries than content from all other regions.
- ▶ EU 27 Films circulated more than TV content on TVOD, but less on SVOD.

Circulation on TVOD by number of **countries**



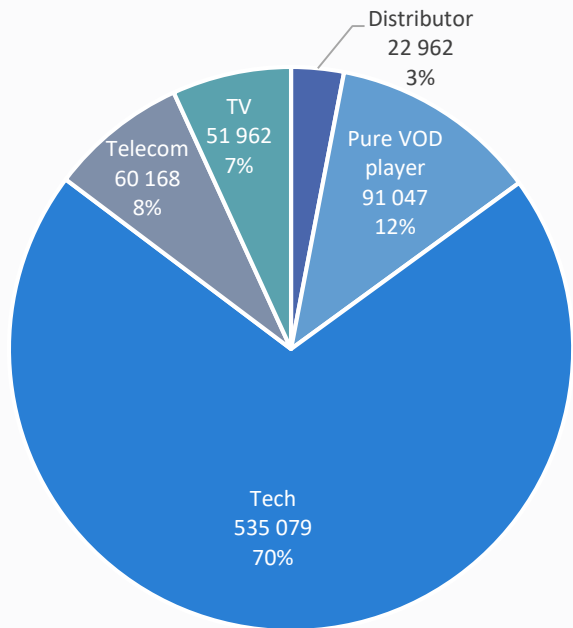
Circulation on SVOD by number of **countries**



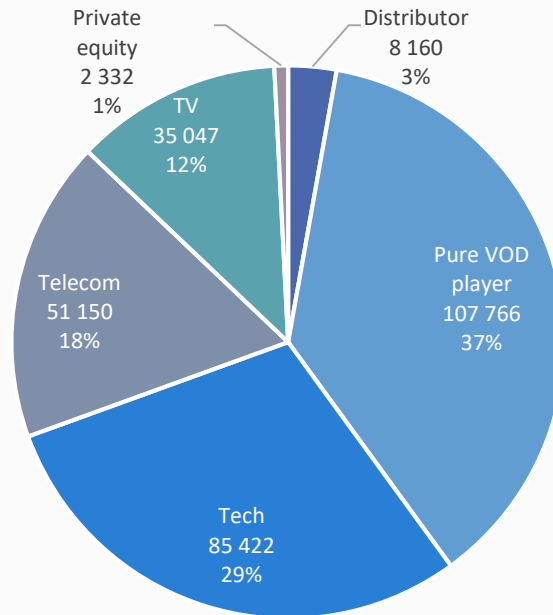
# Tech and pure VOD players offer the largest amount of film and TV season

- ▶ On TVOD, the bulk of film titles and TV seasons (70%) was found in catalogues of tech players.
- ▶ On SVOD, pure VOD players and tech players offered two thirds of all film titles and TV seasons.
- ▶ For both business models, over 70% of the works available are offered by tech and pure VOD players while service operated by incumbent TV and Telecom players made up 30% of the content offer on SVOD and 15% on TVOD.

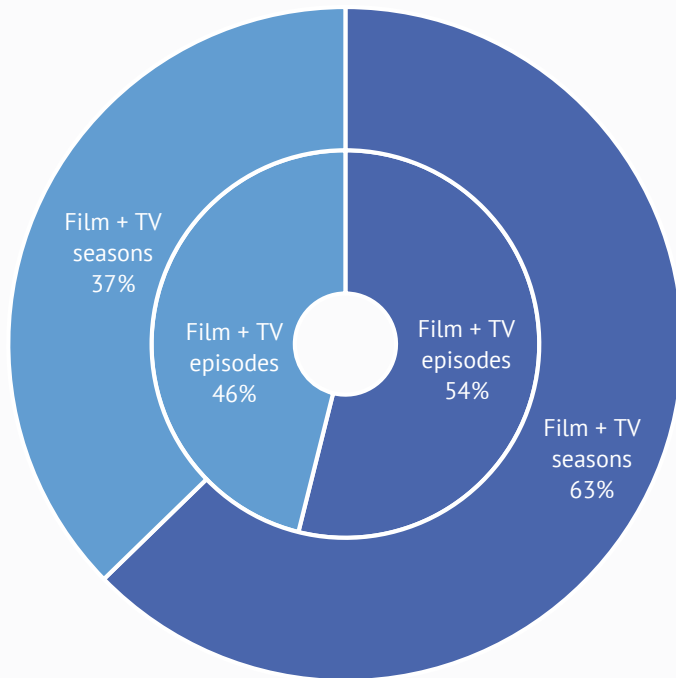

# Share of national and EU27 non-national Films and TV content in catalogues

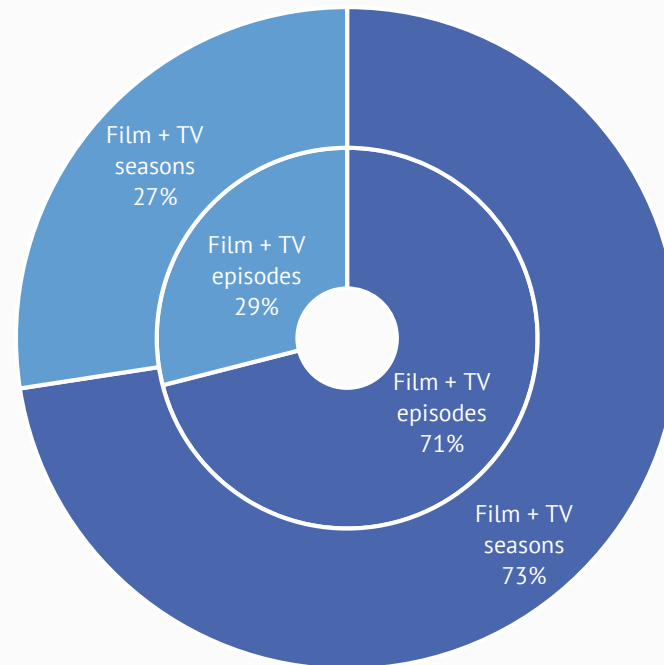
- ▶ **EU27 non-national film and TV content** represented the largest share of EU27 content, on both types of services but especially on **SVOD** where it represented close to three fourths of the EU27 content offer.

Share of EU non-national and national content on SVOD

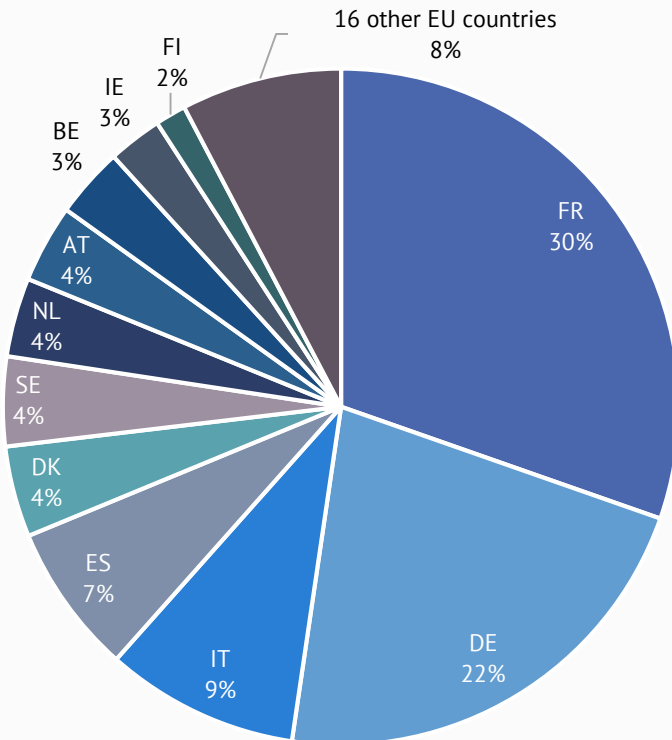

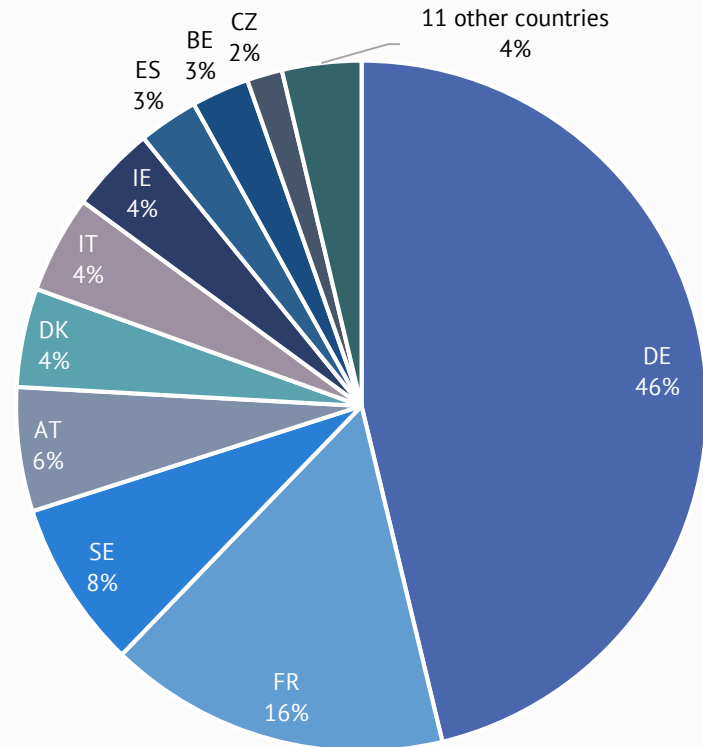
# EU27 non-national content exported on TVOD: French films and German TV seasons

- ▶ The most exported EU27 film titles on TVOD were French, while almost half of the exported TV content offer on TVOD was German.
- ▶ While EU-4 were the top exporting countries for films on TVOD, this was not true for TV content.
- ▶ Nordic content (SE, DK) also reached export success, notably for TV seasons.

Origin of EU27 non-national TV seasons on TVOD

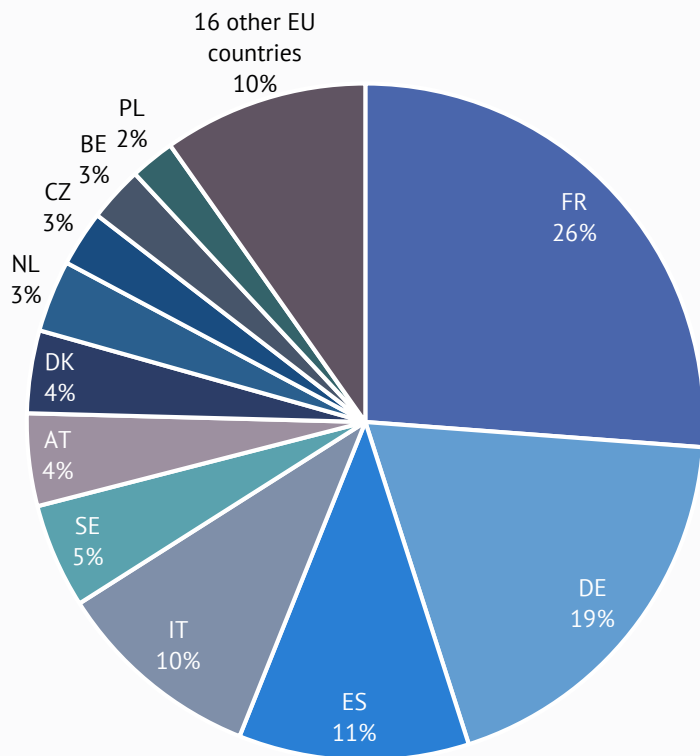

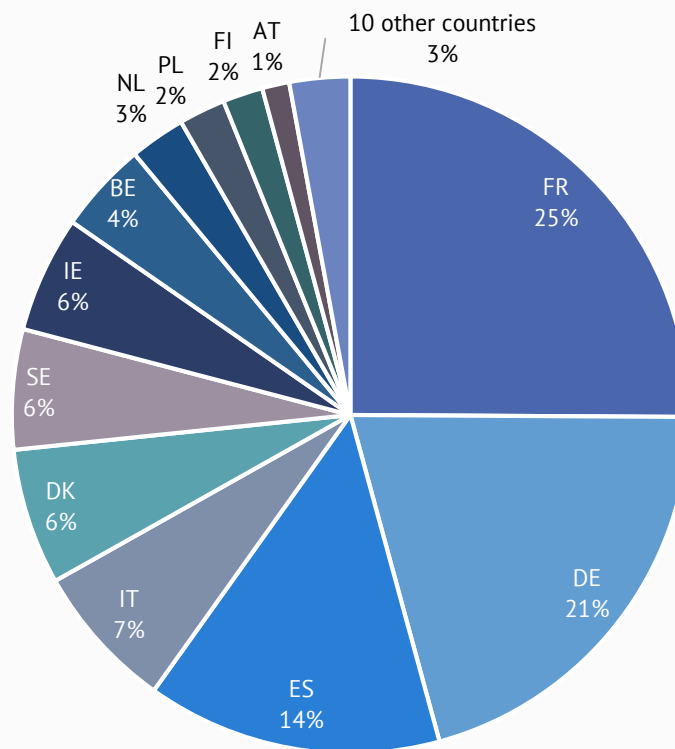
# EU27 non-national content exported on SVOD: from EU4, mainly French and German

- ▶ On SVOD, the most exported titles, for both films and TV seasons, were French (around 25%).
- ▶ German, Spanish and Italian titles complete the top EU-4 export countries, both for films and TV seasons on SVOD, all four providing in both cases over two thirds of the offer on SVOD.
- ▶ Films and TV seasons from other origins included Nordic, Irish, Belgian and Dutch content.

# B.1 – Size of film catalogues

## TVOD services were more focused on films than SVOD services

- ▶ On average, a higher number of films and higher median films in catalogues for TVOD services, suggesting that TVOD services are selling recent and catalogue films in their vast catalogues while SVOD services propose a smaller, ever changing, selection of films and a broad repertoire of TV content.

## Multi-country services had, for both business models, larger film catalogues

- ▶ Be it for TVOD or SVOD, multi-country services had a higher average and median number of films in their catalogues than national services.
- ▶ But national TVOD services had still a higher average and median number of films than SVOD services, multi-country or national.

## Huge variances in sizes of catalogues reflect different approaches – curation versus large choice

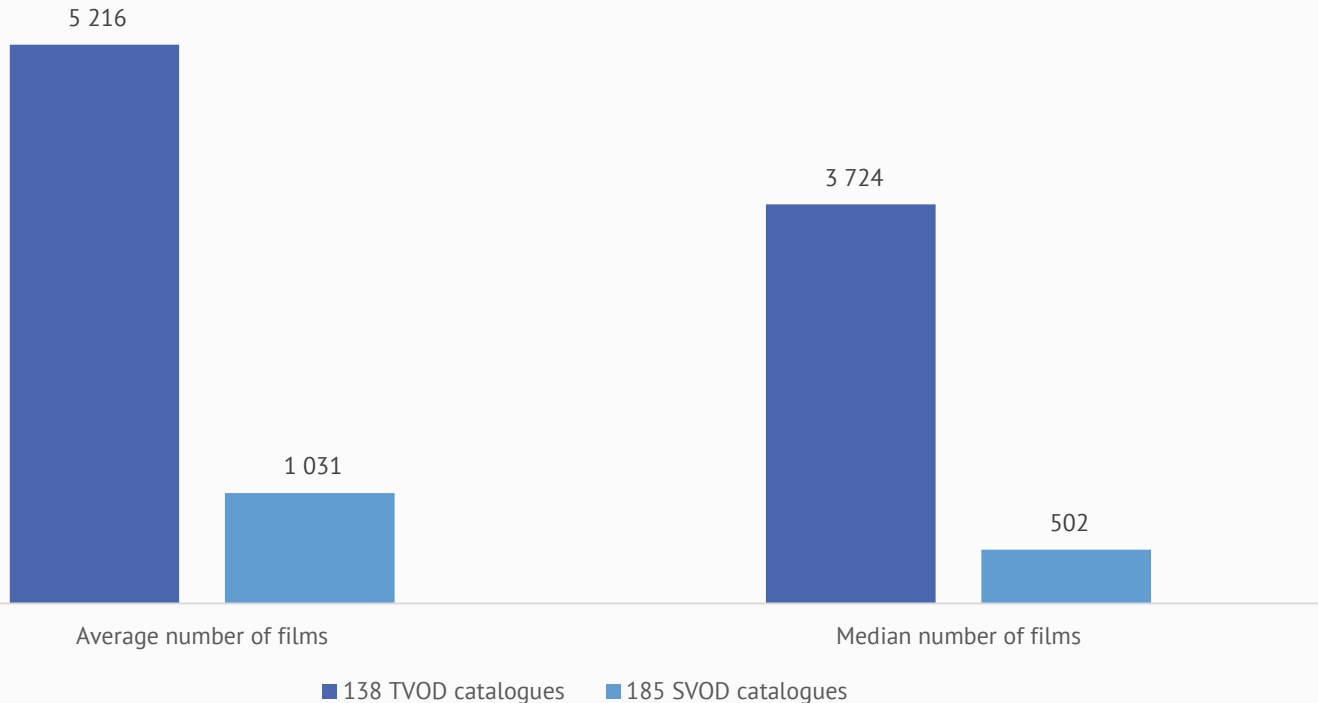
- ▶ While multi-country TVOD services seemed to focus on offering a large choice to their customers, proposing recent and catalogue films, several national TVOD and SVOD services had more a logic of curation.
- ▶ Minimum Guarantee for TVOD services and license fees for SVOD services might also be an economical criteria in proposing a fewer number of films.
- ▶ The bulk of films available on both TVOD and SVOD are less than 10 years old in 2020 with over 50% films produced in or after 2010.



# Strong differences between TVOD and SVOD catalogues in the number of films

- ▶ The median TVOD catalogue had more than 7 times as many films than the median SVOD catalogue.
- ▶ On average, TVOD catalogues had more than 5 times as many films than SVOD catalogues.
- ▶ TVOD services were more film-focused whereas SVOD services relied more heavily on TV content.

Average and Median size of film catalogues by business model, in number of films

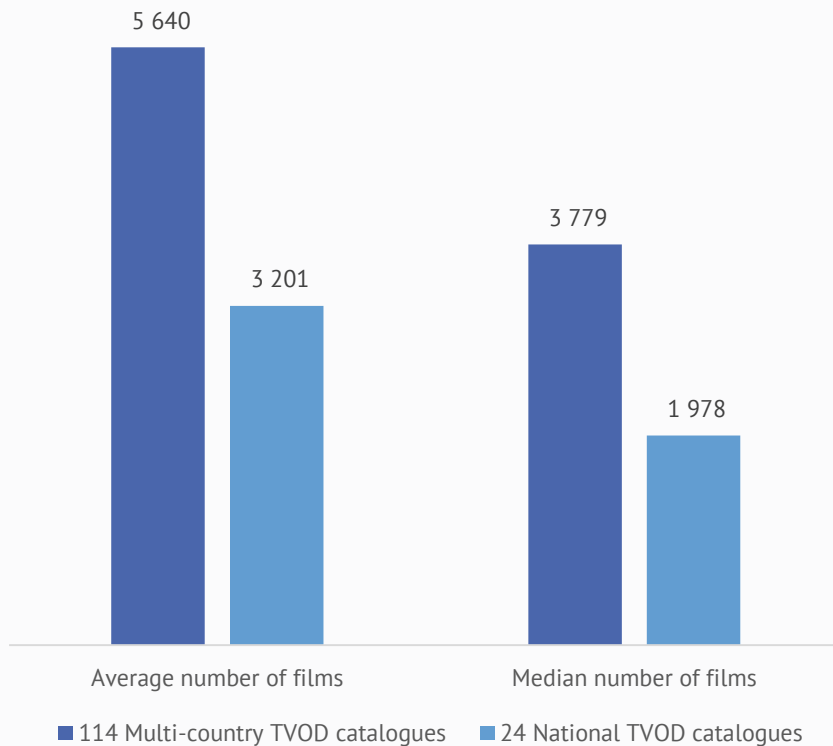

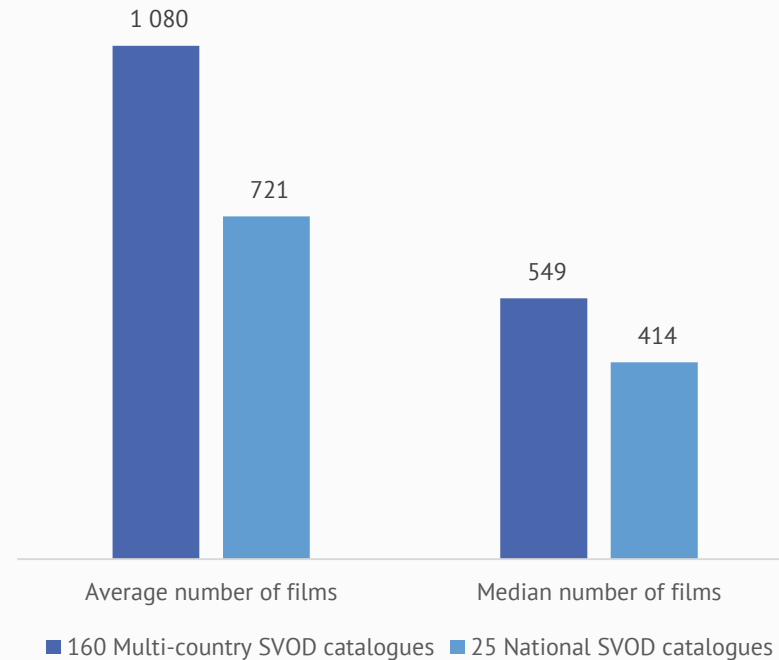
# Also strong differences between national and multi-country catalogues

- ▶ Be it on TVOD or SVOD, **multi-country catalogues had a larger number of films than national services**, with an average difference of 2 439 films for TVOD services and 359 films for SVOD services.
- ▶ TVOD catalogues, multi-country and national, showed a larger film offer than SVOD catalogues.

Size of SVOD film catalogues, in number of films

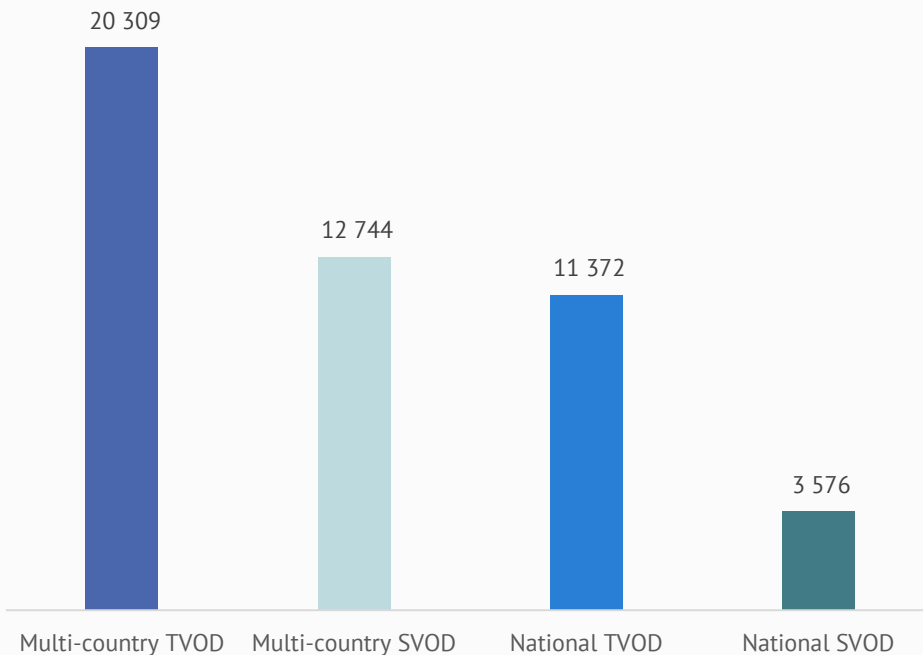

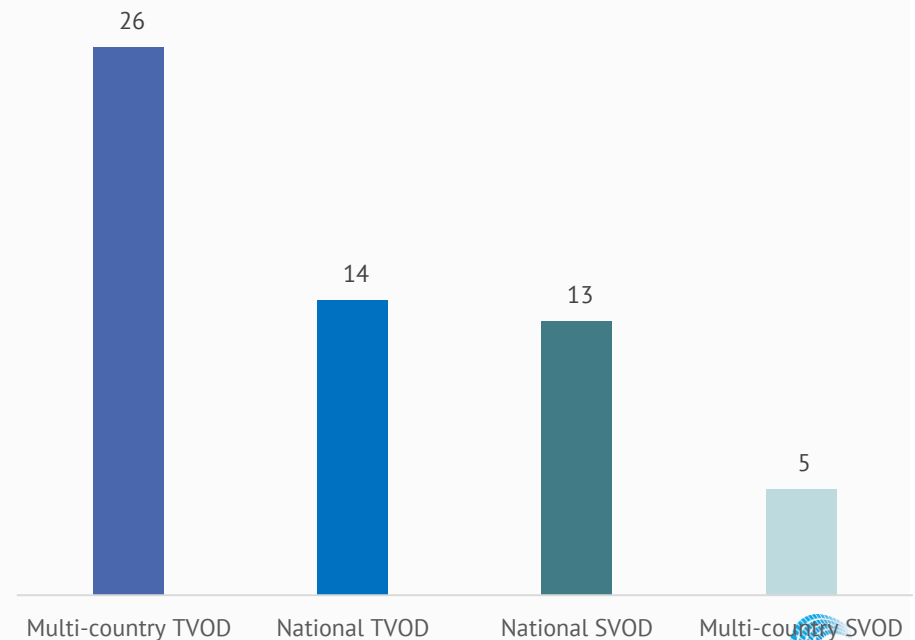
# And huge disparities in the number of films for TVOD and SVOD services

- ▶ The maximum and minimum number of films show that **multi-country TVOD (and some SVOD) services were more focused on a high amount of films** than other service types.
- ▶ The disparities in the maximum and minimum number of films between the same types of services show however that some services might also have been **more focused on curation** of films or had an **offer more focused on other types of content** than films (TV content, niche content).

**Maximum** number of films in catalogue by business model



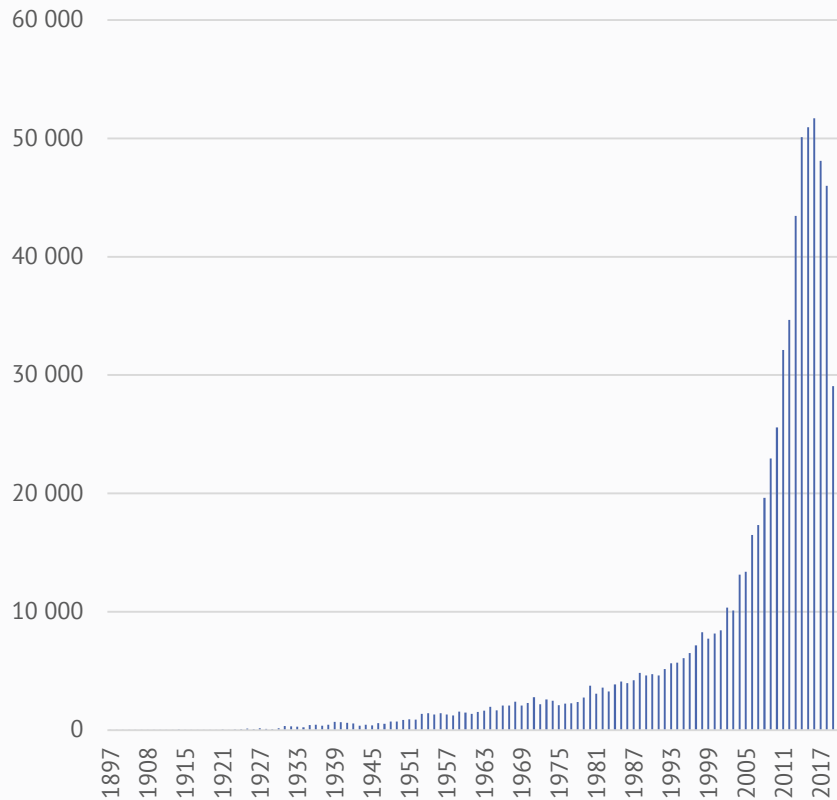
**Minimum** number of films in catalogue by business model



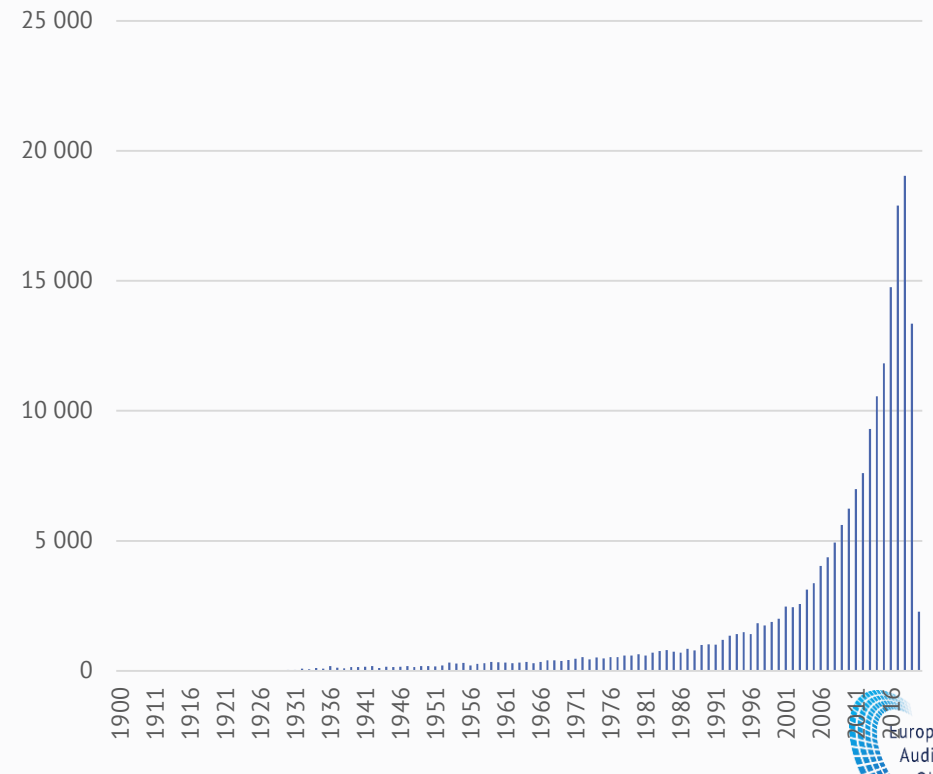
# The bulk of films available on both TVOD and SVOD were less than 10 years old

- ▶ More than 50% of all films available on SVOD were produced in 2013 or later and 63% were less than 10 years old in 2020.
- ▶ More than 50% of all films available on TVOD were produced in 2012 or later and 58% were less than 10 years old in 2020.

## B.2 – Unique film titles available in VOD catalogues

On TVOD and SVOD combined, over **75 000 unique film titles** were available

- ▶ EU27 unique film titles represented 36% of all unique film titles with 26 658 titles.
- ▶ US film titles were the most represented with 27 600 titles or 37% of overall unique titles.
- ▶ Other European titles made up 9%, with British titles making up 75% of all EUR OBS titles.

### A larger choice of unique titles on TVOD

- ▶ With over 60 000 titles, TVOD services had a larger film title offer than SVOD services with 41 981 titles.

### And also a larger offer of EU27 unique film titles on TVOD services

- ▶ With 38% of all unique titles being of EU27 origin, representing 22 648 unique film titles, TVOD services offered a larger choice than SVOD services' 12 838 unique EU27 film titles or 31% of all film titles available on SVOD.

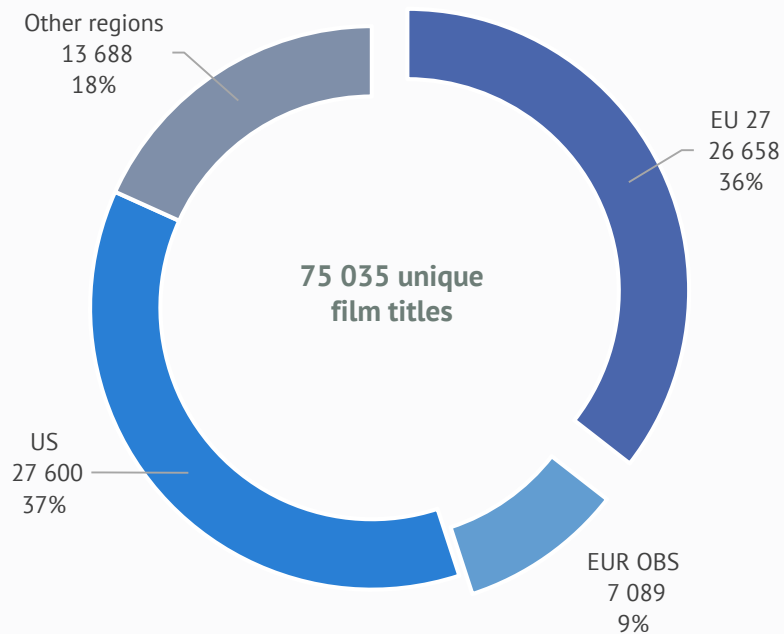
### French, German, Italian and Spanish titles make up the bulk of EU titles, both on TVOD and SVOD

- ▶ With 28% of EU27 titles, French titles were the most found titles on TVOD, followed by German titles with 22%, Italian with 14% and Spanish with 8%.
- ▶ On SVOD, German titles represented 22% of all EU27 titles, French 18%, Italian 17% and Spanish 8%.
- ▶ The rest of the top production countries' origin of EU27 titles, both on TVOD and SVOD, were Belgian, Danish, Austrian, Swedish, Dutch, Czech and Polish titles.
- ▶ The rest of 16 EU countries made up 6% of all titles on TVOD and 8% on SVOD with just over 1 000 titles on both types of services.
- ▶ The top 11 EU27 countries produced 94% of all unique EU27 titles on TVOD and 92% on SVOD.

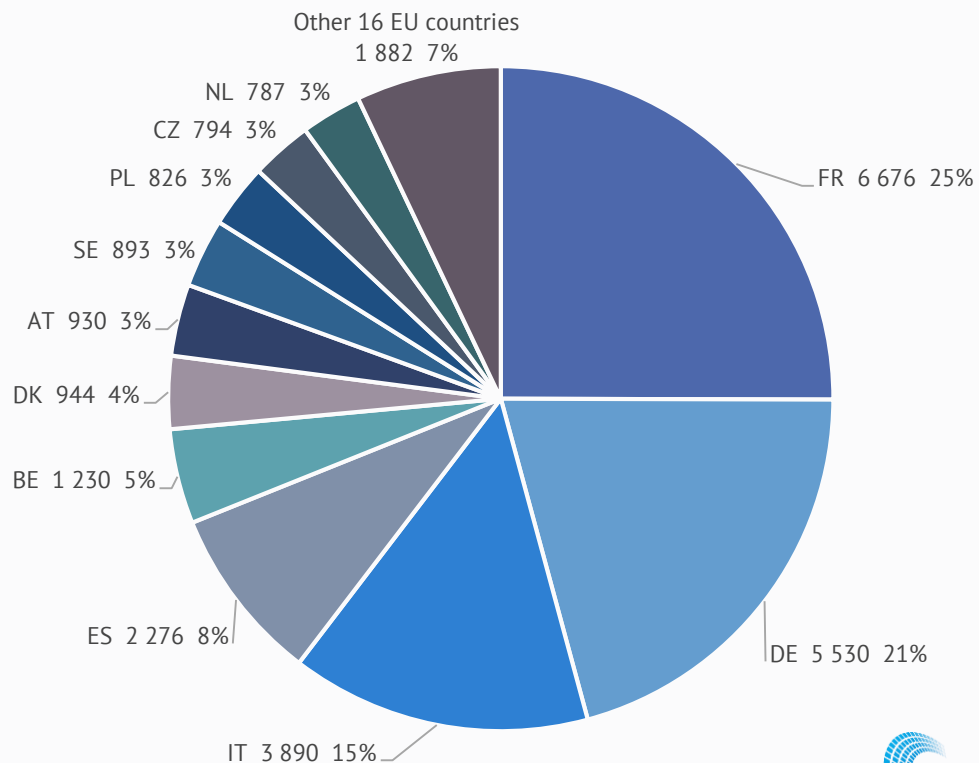
# Total number of unique film titles available in VOD catalogues

- ▶ 75 035 unique films titles were available to customers on both types of services
- ▶ For EU27 films, French, German, Italian and Spanish titles represented 69% of all unique EU27 film titles.

Origin of **unique** EU27 film titles in VOD catalogues by country of origin



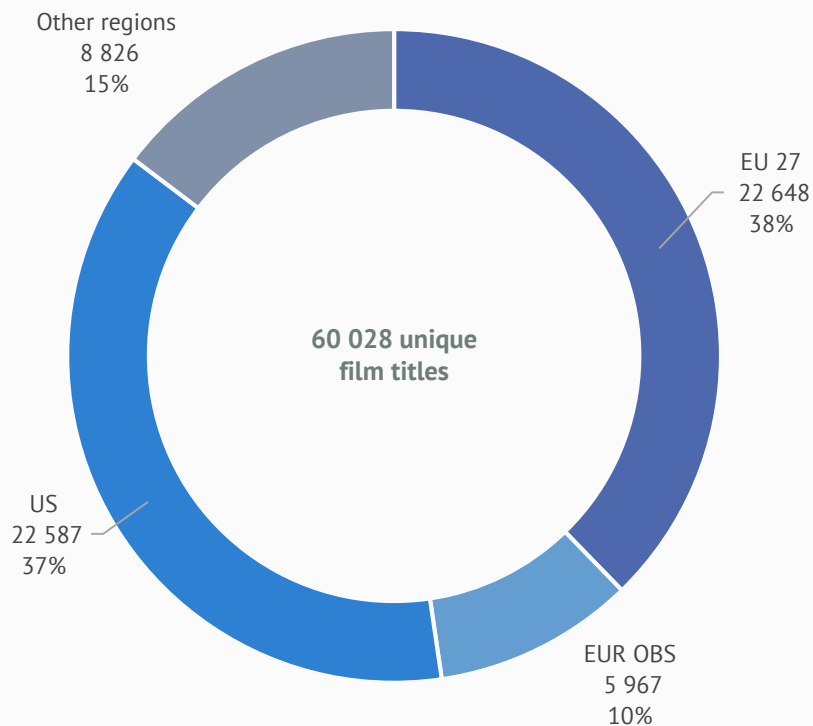

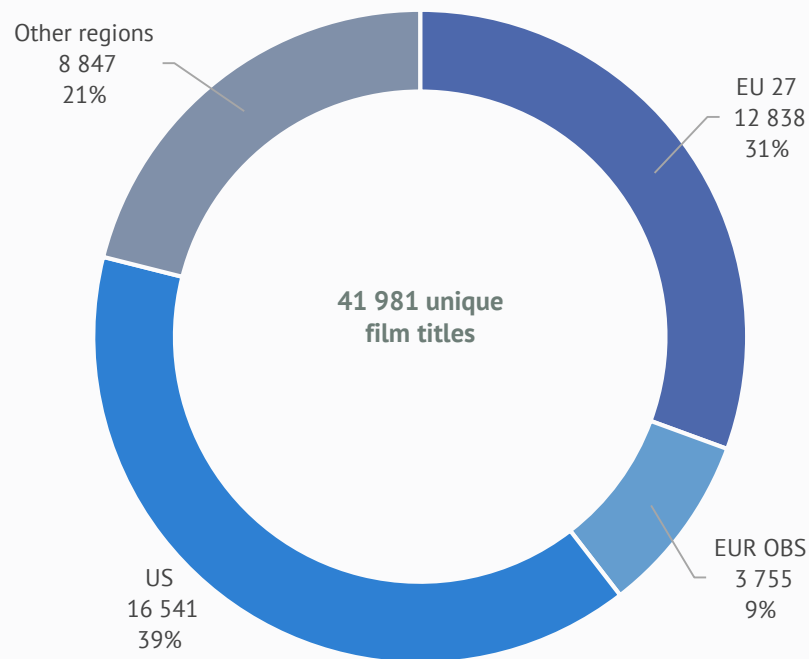
# A larger choice of unique titles on VOD

- ▶ TVOD services offered the highest number of total unique films titles, with over 60 000 titles available.
- ▶ On TVOD services, EU27 unique film titles represented 38% of all unique titles, on SVOD 31%.
- ▶ On both types of services, US titles represented just under 40% of all titles.
- ▶ Other European titles, with the integration of British titles, made up around 10% on both types of services

## Origin of unique film titles in SVOD catalogues



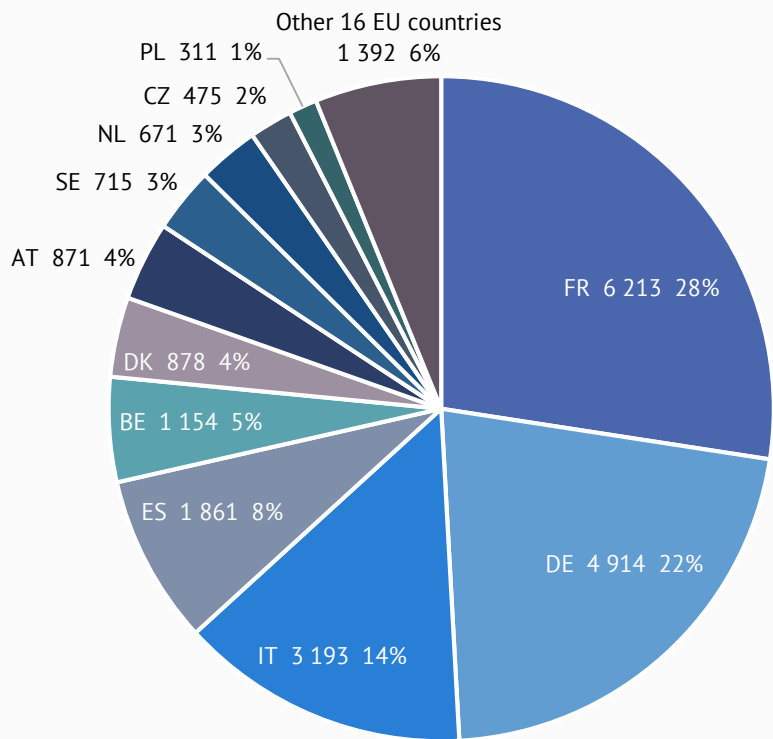

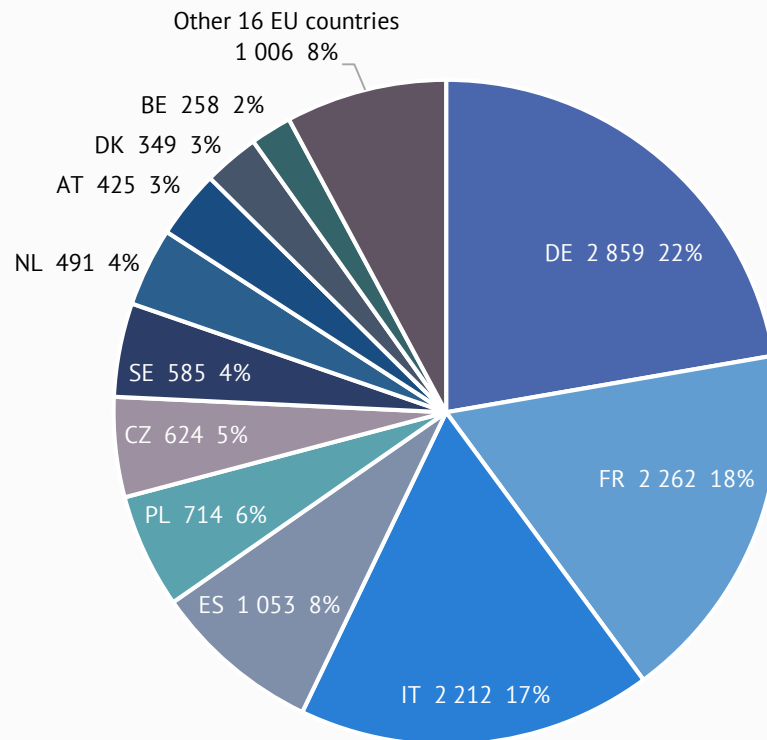
# Differences in the origin of EU titles by business model

- ▶ On TVOD, French titles are the most represented EU27 titles while on SVOD German titles took the lead.
- ▶ The podium was completed for both business models by Italian titles and followed by Spanish titles.
- ▶ Also, the top 11 production countries were the same for both type of services and all the other 16 EU27 countries accounted for less than 10% of titles available.

Origin of unique EU27 film titles in SVOD catalogues

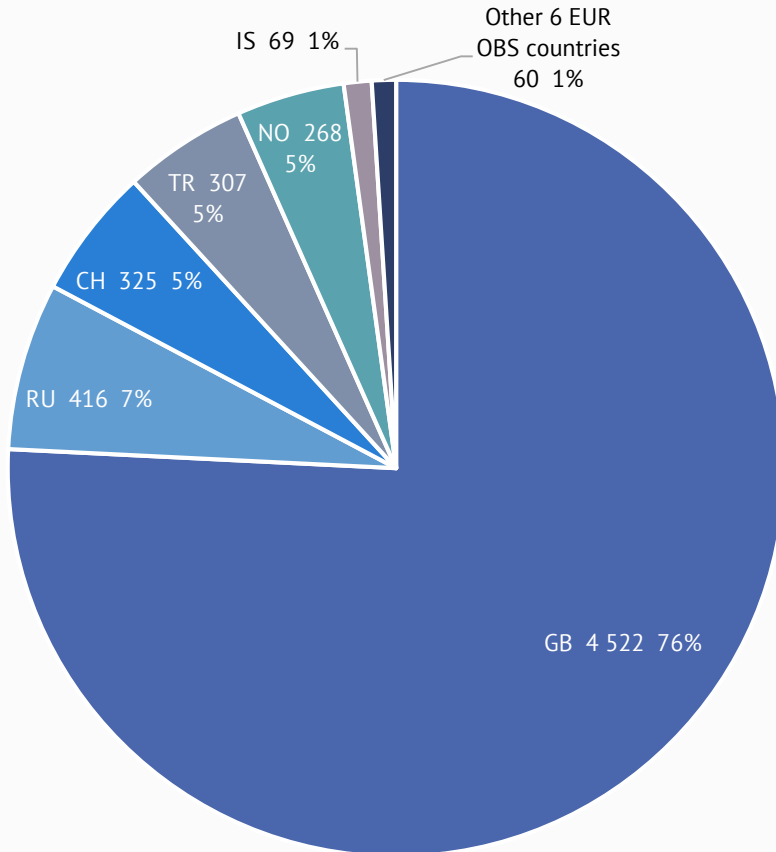




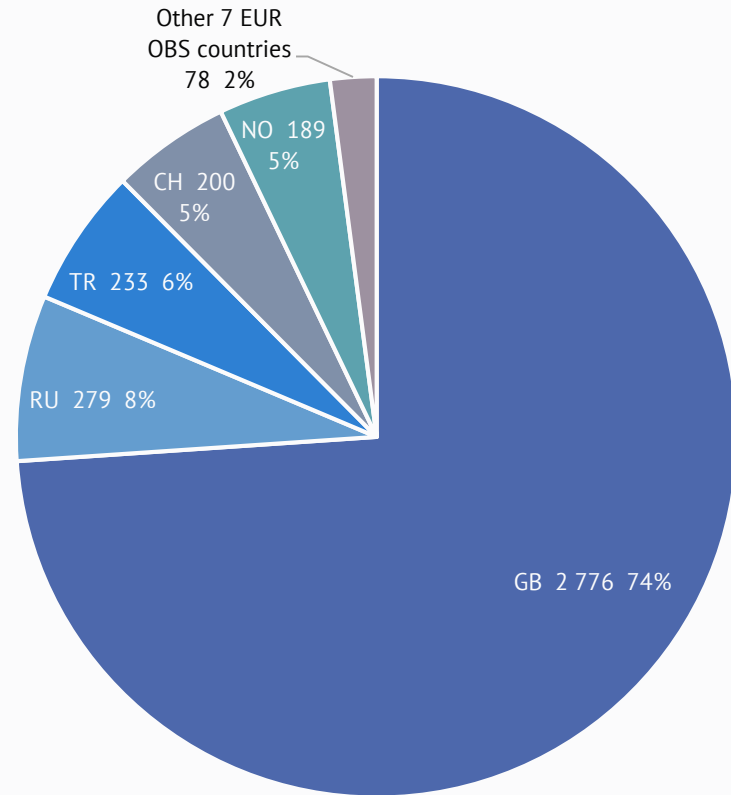
# The importance of GB titles in other European film titles

- ▶ British titles represented for both types of services around  $\frac{3}{4}$  of all other European titles available.
- ▶ Russian, Turkish, Swiss and Norwegian titles completed the Top 5 of other European titles.
- ▶ The shift of British titles from EU-28 to other European titles had also a significant impact on the share of EU27 titles for both types of services compared to previous reports on the share of EU films.

## B.3 – Origin and circulation of films

### 21% of all films found in 138 TVOD and 185 SVOD catalogues were of EU27 origin

- ▶ Titles from other European countries made up 10% on TVOD and 8% on SVOD, mainly from the United Kingdom.
- ▶ US titles made up 58% of films on TVOD and 48% on SVOD.
- ▶ Films from other regions had a much larger share on SVOD with 23% than on TVOD with 11%.

### For both business models, national services offered more EU27 films than multi-country services

- ▶ In the 24 national TVOD catalogues, EU27 films represented 43% of all films, on national 25 SVOD services their share was 40%.
- ▶ Other European films for both types of national services made up 9% of the film offering, here again largely composed of films of the United Kingdom.
- ▶ US films represented 38% of all films on national TVOD services and 42% on national SVOD services.

### EU27 films on multi-country services made up 19% of all films in 114 TVOD catalogues and 160 SVOD catalogues

- ▶ Other European films accounted for 10% on TVOD and 8% on SVOD.
- ▶ US films accounted for the lion share with 60% on multi-country TVOD catalogues and 49% on SVOD.
- ▶ Films of other regions accounted for 11% on TVOD and 24% on SVOD.

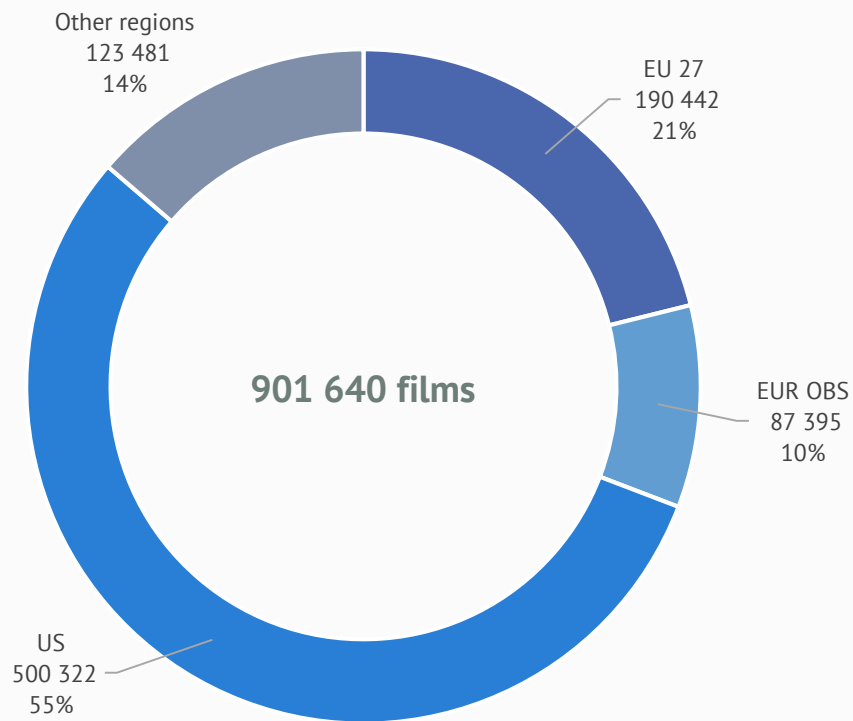
### On average, an EU27 film title was available in 2,8 countries on TVOD and in 2,6 countries on SVOD

- ▶ Other European film titles were available on average in 5,5 countries on TVOD and 3,7 countries on SVOD.
- ▶ This circulation compares to 7,4 countries for US titles on TVOD and 4,7 countries on SVOD.
- ▶ On services, the circulation of EU27 titles was 6,5 TVOD services on average and 3 SVOD services on average compared to 17,3 TVOD services and 5,5 SVOD services for US titles.
- ▶ The circulation on SVOD services is also limited by the necessity to acquire rights for each country which is not the case for TVOD services.

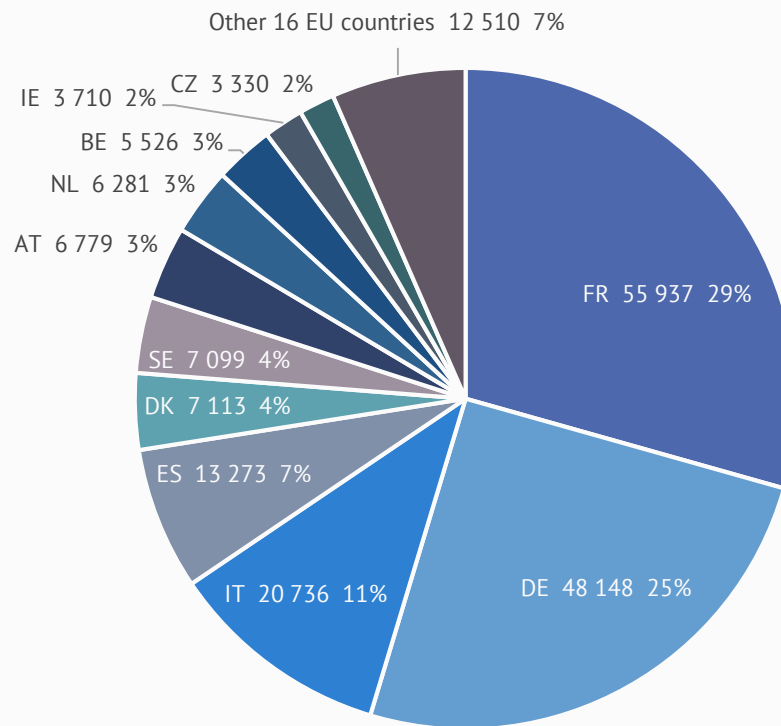
# 21% of all films in VOD catalogues (TVOD and SVOD) were of EU27 origin

- ▶ In total, over 901 640 films were available in the 323 VOD catalogues (TVOD and SVOD) of the sample.
- ▶ EU27 films represented 21% of all films available, while other European films accounted for 10%.
- ▶ The biggest EU27 production countries were France with 29% of all EU27 films, followed by Germany with 25%, Italy with 11% and Spain 7%. These 4 countries accounted for 72% of all EU27 available in the 323 VOD catalogues.
- ▶ US films with 55% accounted for the lion share of films available in VOD catalogues.

Origin of EU27 films in 323 VOD catalogues by country of origin



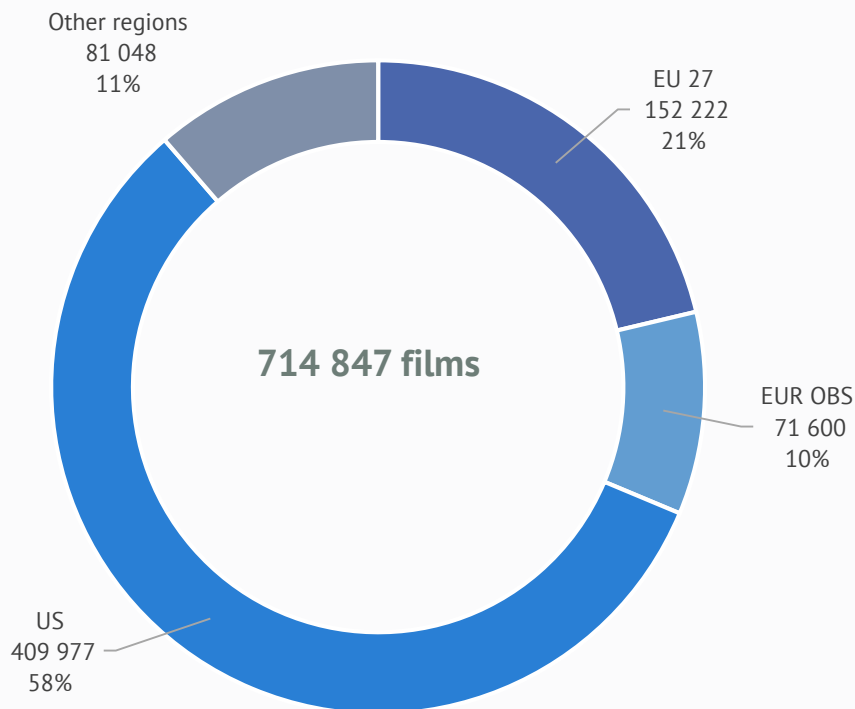

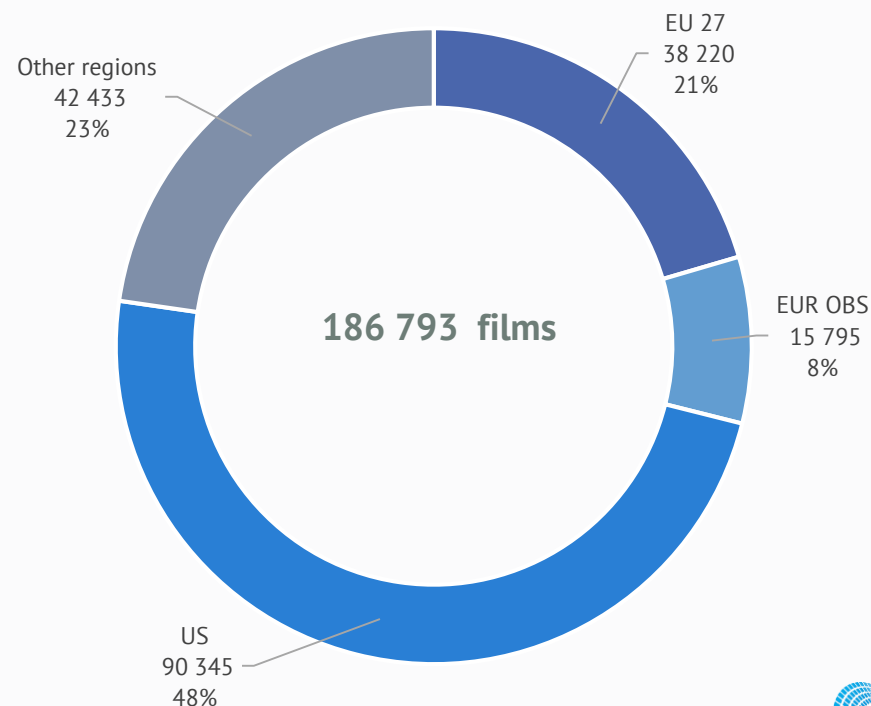
# 21% of all films on TVOD and SVOD are of EU27 origin

- ▶ In terms of availability, EU27 films represented 21% in all TVOD catalogues and 21% in SVOD catalogues
- ▶ Other European films represented 10% of all films on TVOD and 8% on SVOD services
- ▶ US films had a higher share in TVOD catalogues with 58% of all films and 48% in SVOD catalogues
- ▶ Films of other regions were better represented in SVOD catalogues with 23% compared to 11% in TVOD catalogues, showing the increased reliance of SVOD services on productions from around the world to complete their catalogues.

## Origin of films in 185 SVOD catalogues



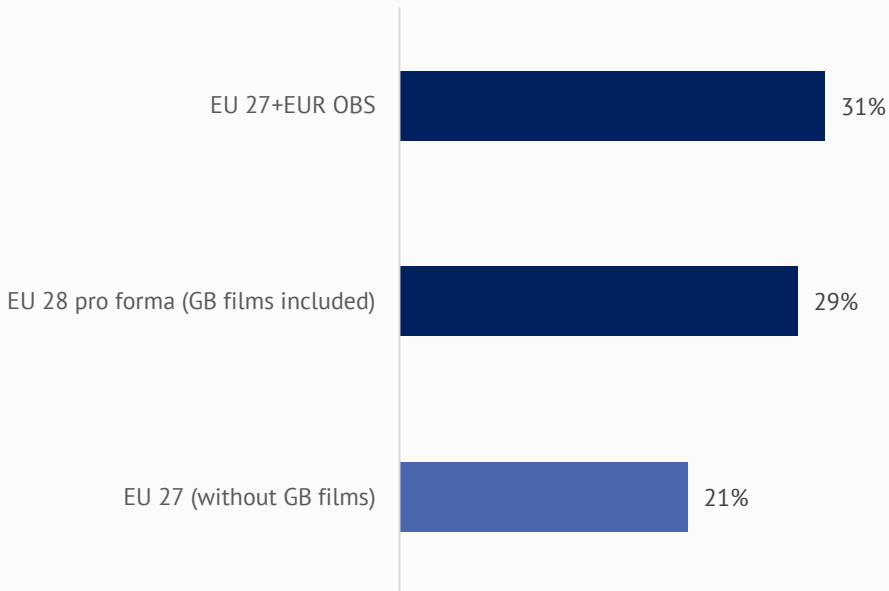

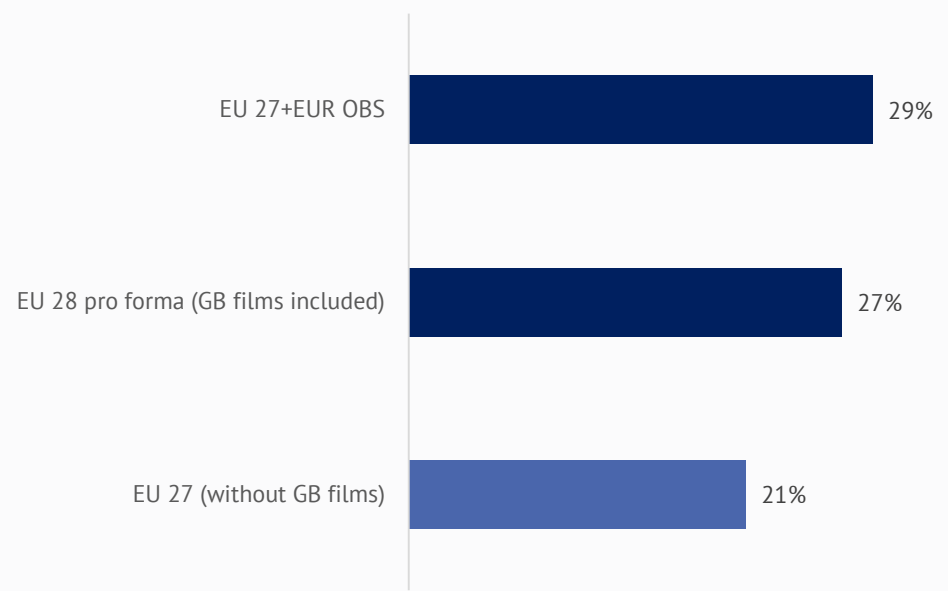
# The difference between the share of EU27 and the share of all European films is significant

- ▶ The share of European films varies strongly depending on which countries qualify as “European films”.
- ▶ If only EU27 countries are considered the share of European films was 21% for TVOD and SVOD.
- ▶ If other European countries are taken into consideration, the share is 31% for TVOD and 29% for SVOD.
- ▶ Compared to the pro forma share of EU28 films, the share of EU27 films is decreased by 8% for TVOD and 6% for SVOD.

## Origin of films in 138 TVOD catalogues



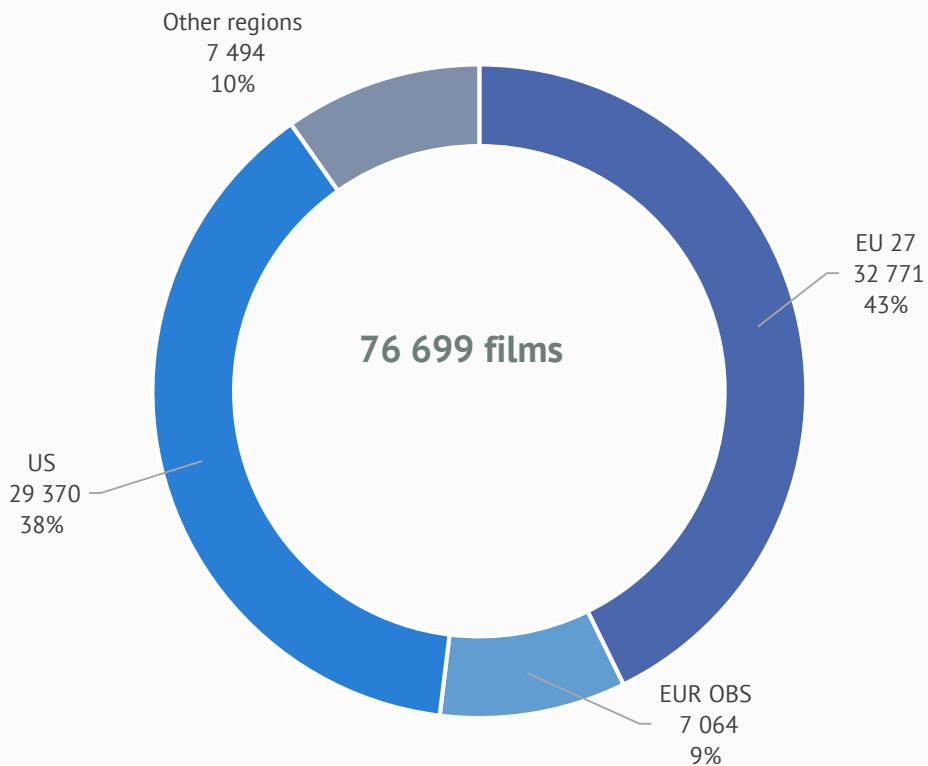
## Origin of films in 185 SVOD catalogues



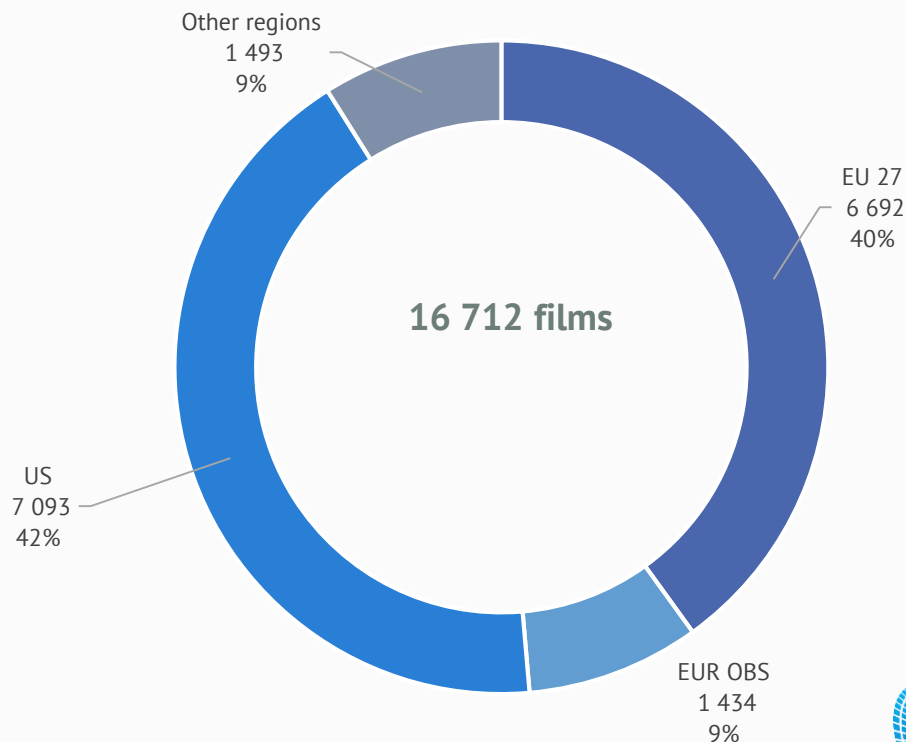
# National services had a high share of EU27 films

- ▶ **National services**, TVOD and SVOD, relied more on EU27 films to cater to national audiences than multi-country services.
- ▶ National TVOD and SVOD services complemented their film offering with films from other European countries and other regions.
- ▶ The reliance on US films was also lesser for national services than multi-country services.

Origin of films in 25 national SVOD catalogues

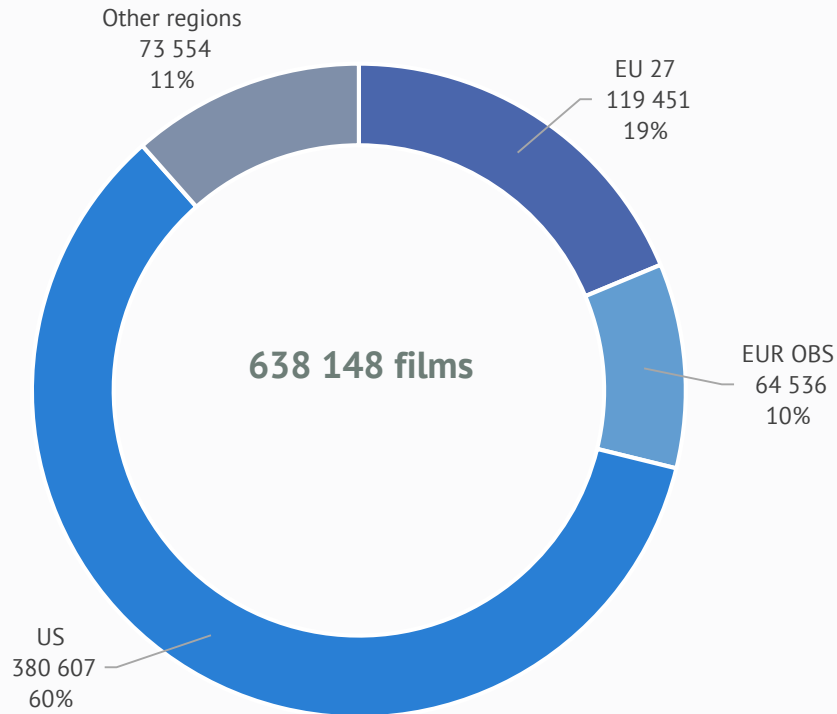

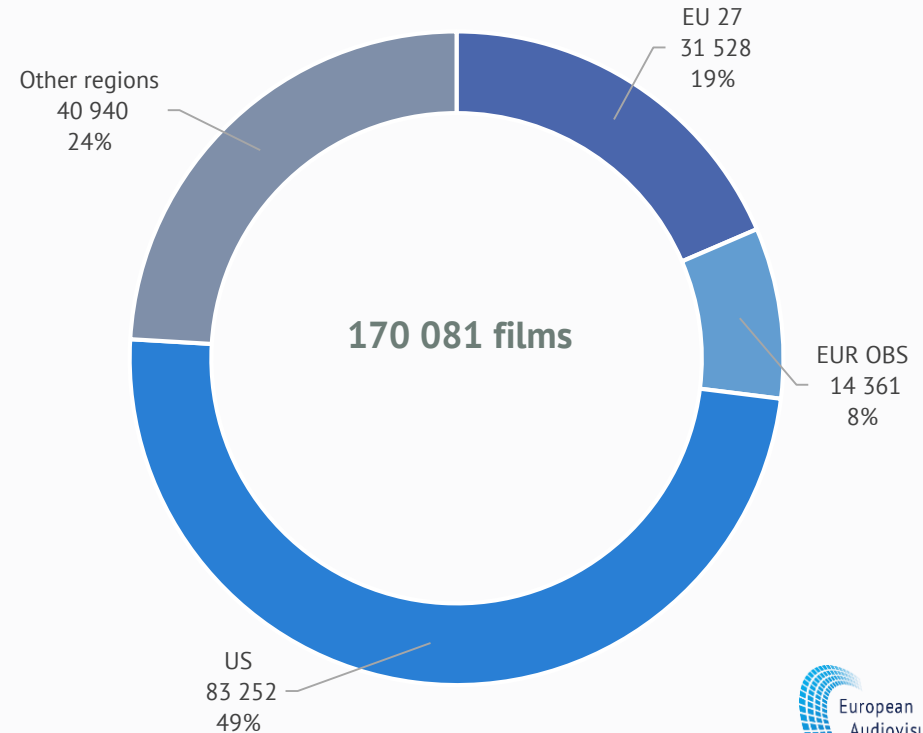
# While multi-country services rely more on US films and less on EU27 films

- ▶ Multi-country TVOD services relied more on US films than SVOD services, with a share of 60% for TVOD and 49% for SVOD.
- ▶ EU27 films represented 19% of all films on multi-country TVOD and SVOD services.
- ▶ SVOD catalogues had a relatively high share of films of other regions with 24%, compared to TVOD's 11%.

Origin of films in 160 multi-country SVOD catalogues

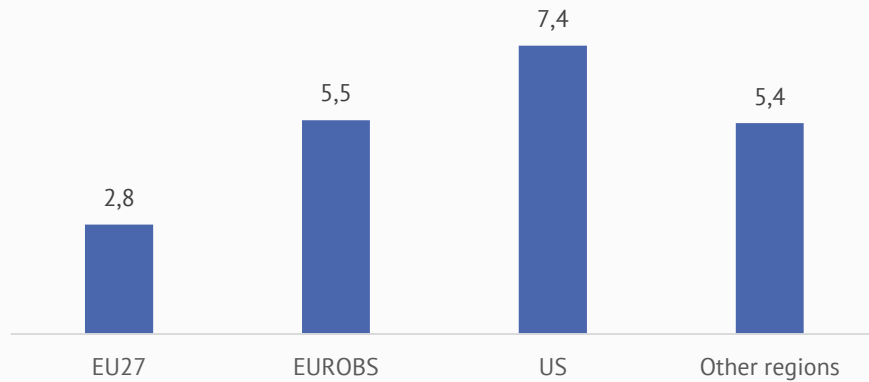

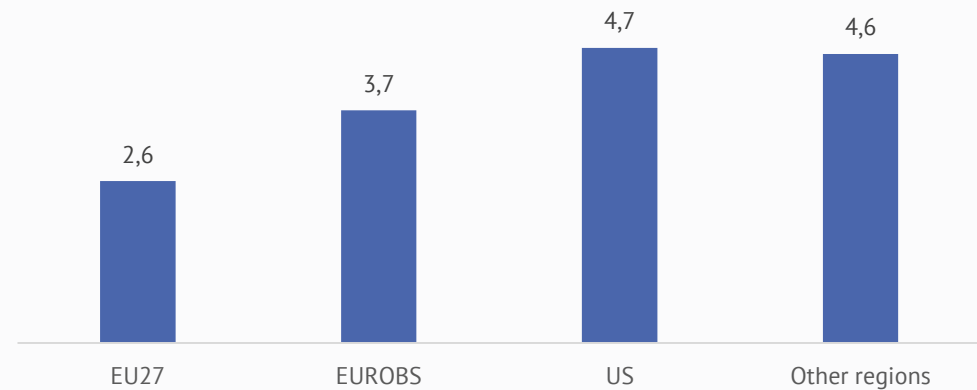
# Lower percentages of EU27 films is explained by a lesser title circulation in countries

- ▶ The lower share of **EU films in total compared to their share of unique films** (21% of all films on TVOD compared to 38% of all titles; 21% of all films on SVOD compared to 31% of all titles) **is explained by their lower circulation in countries**, with an average of 2,8 countries on TVOD and 2,6 on SVOD.
- ▶ **US and films of other regions travelled the best**, crossing borders more easily than EU27 films.

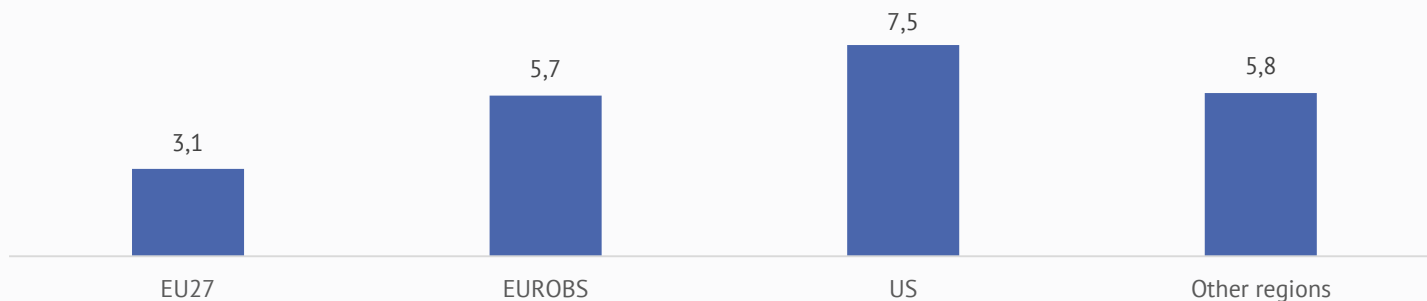
TVOD – Average circulation of titles in countries by region of origin

All VOD services – Average circulation of titles in countries by region of origin

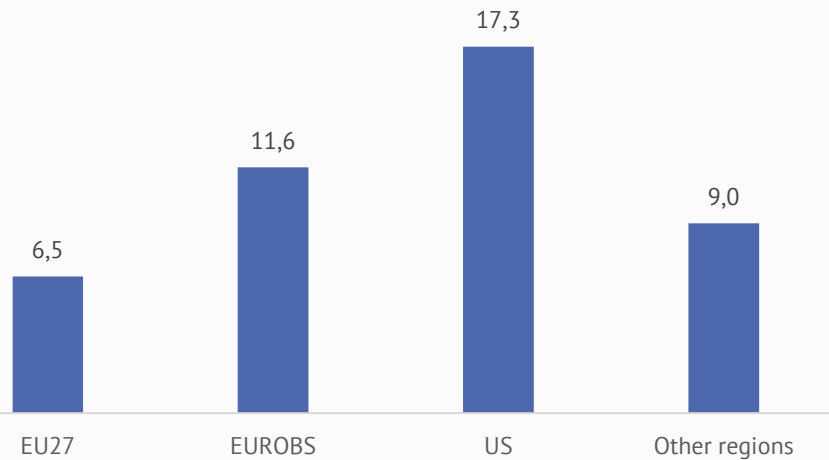




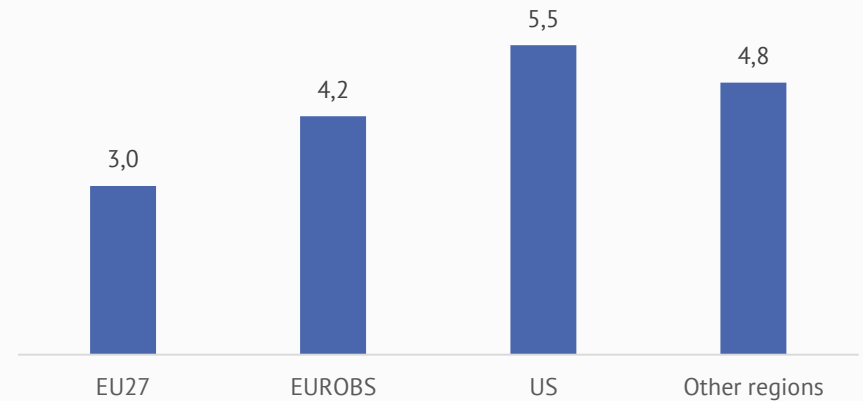
# And on services, EU27 titles tend to circulate less than titles of other regions

- ▶ On average, EU films were present in 6,5 TVOD catalogues and 3 SVOD catalogues, less than films of all other regions.
- ▶ US films circulated the best also on services, followed by other European films and films of other regions for all VOD services.

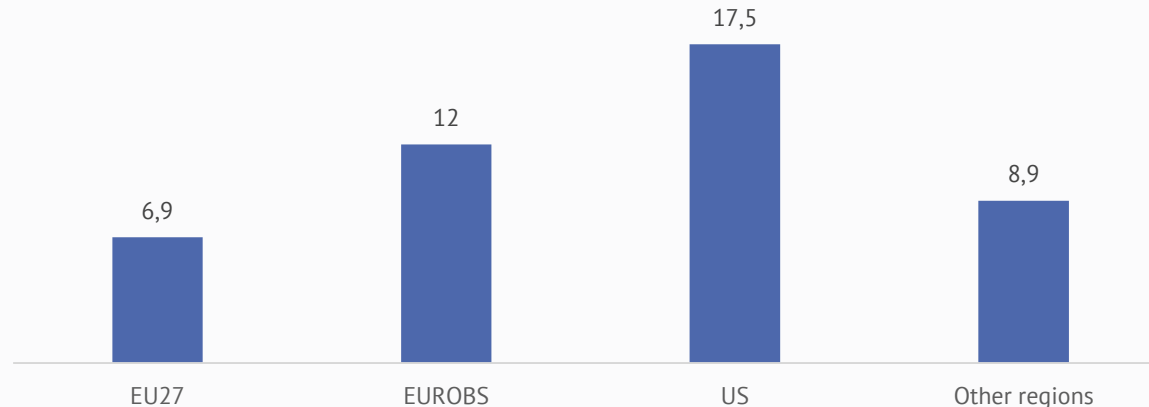
TVOD – Average circulation of titles on services by region of origin

## B.4 – Focus on services' core business and ownership

### **Services owned by tech had the highest number of films** in their catalogues, followed by pure VOD players

- ▶ 70% of all films found on TVOD were on services owned by tech companies (Apple, Microsoft, Google, Amazon) and 35% of all films found on SVOD were on services owned by tech players (Amazon, Apple).
- ▶ 30% of all films were found on SVOD services owned by pure VOD players (Netflix, MUBI, Filmin, FilmoTV) and 13% on TVOD (FilmDoo, Chili, Flimmit).

### **The origin of films in catalogues varies by the core business of service owner**

- ▶ On TVOD and SVOD, services owned by film distributors and TV players had the largest share of EU27 films in their catalogues, while the lowest share was found in the catalogues of tech players.
- ▶ Services owned by tech, telecom and private equity players had the highest share of US films.
- ▶ On SVOD, tech and pure VOD players had also the highest share of films of other regions.

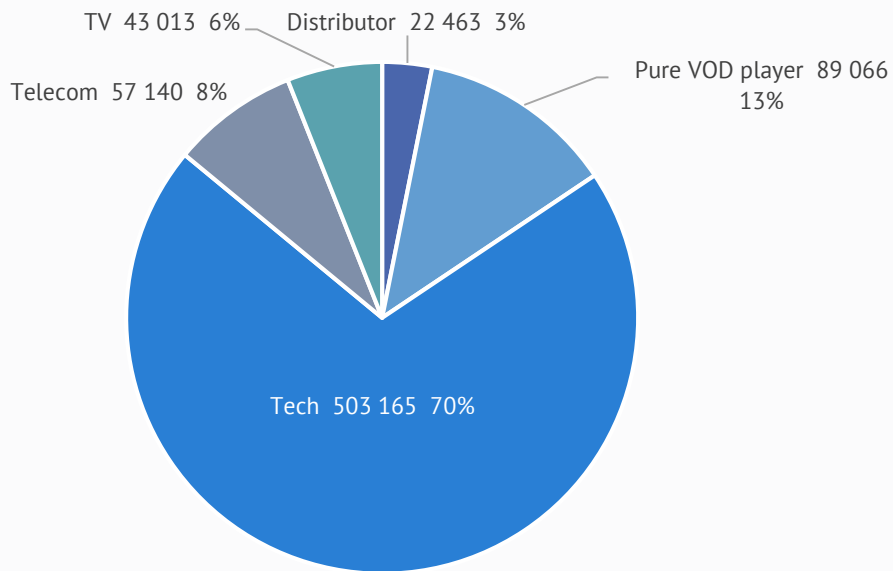
### **Services owned by EU players had the highest share of EU films while services owned by global players offered the largest number of films**

- ▶ EU owned catalogues had on average a 34% share (TVOD) and a 37% share (SVOD) of EU27 films, while global services had a 17% share (TVOD) and a 16% share (SVOD) of EU27 films.
- ▶ With almost 3 times more films on TVOD and 4 times more films on SVOD, global players had a larger film offering than catalogues owned by EU players.
- ▶ Therefore, in absolute numbers, more EU27 films were available on services owned by global players than on EU27 players.

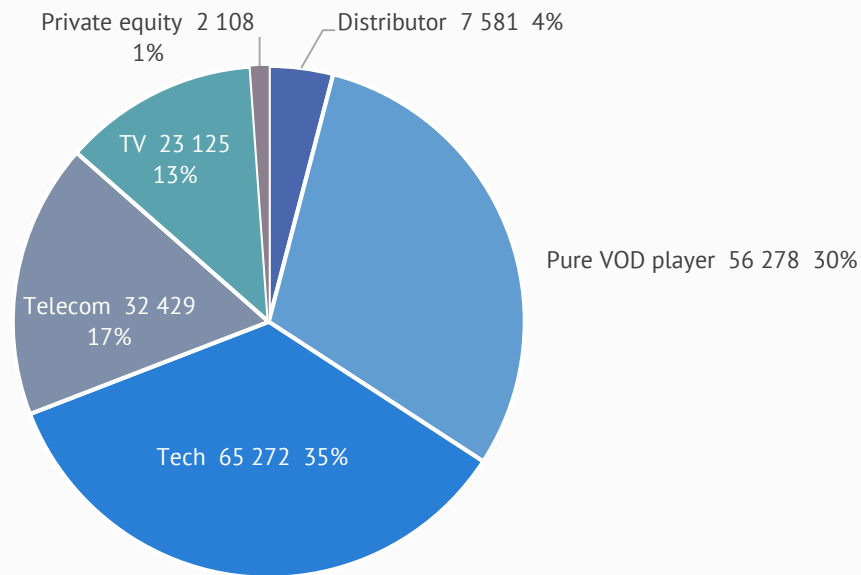
# Services owned by tech players had the highest number of films in their catalogues

▶ **Tech and pure VOD players** such as Netflix had the **highest number of films in their catalogues**.

SVOD – Number of films by core business of service owner



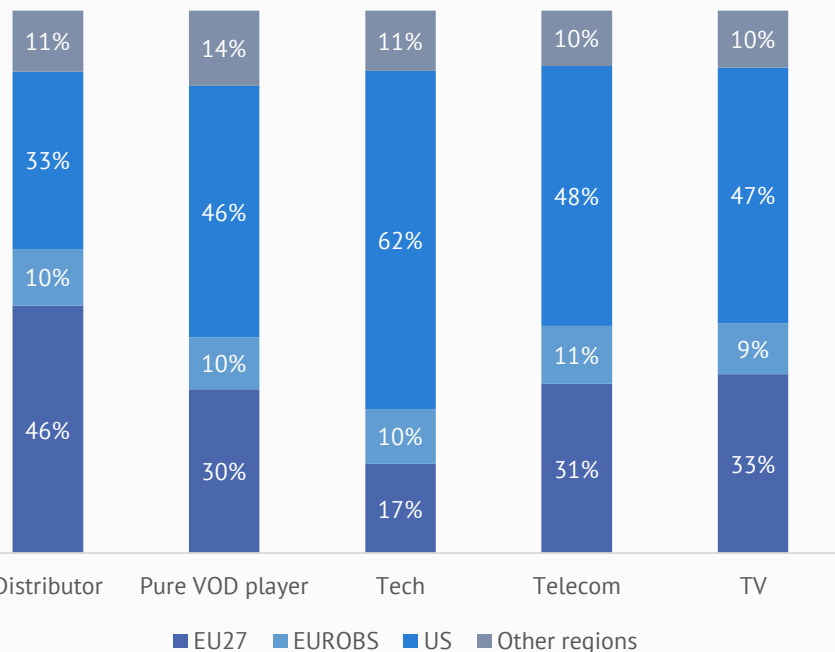

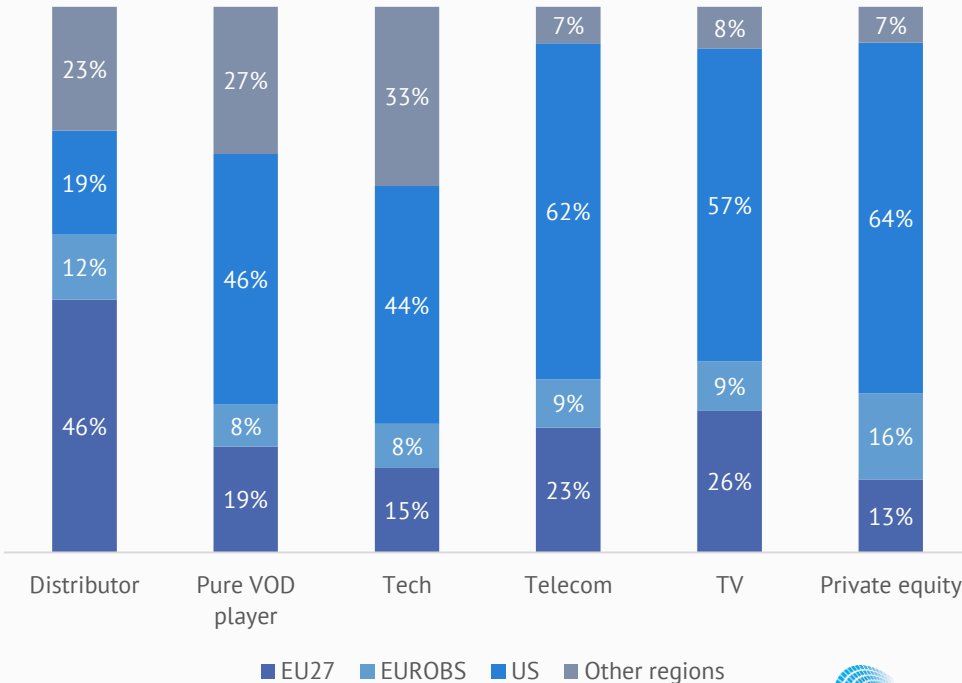
# Sharp differences in the composition of catalogues by core business of service owners

- ▶ Services owned by film distributors, TV and telecom players had the highest share of EU27 films.
- ▶ Tech and private equity players offered the smallest share of EU27 films.

## TVOD – Share of films by core business of service owner



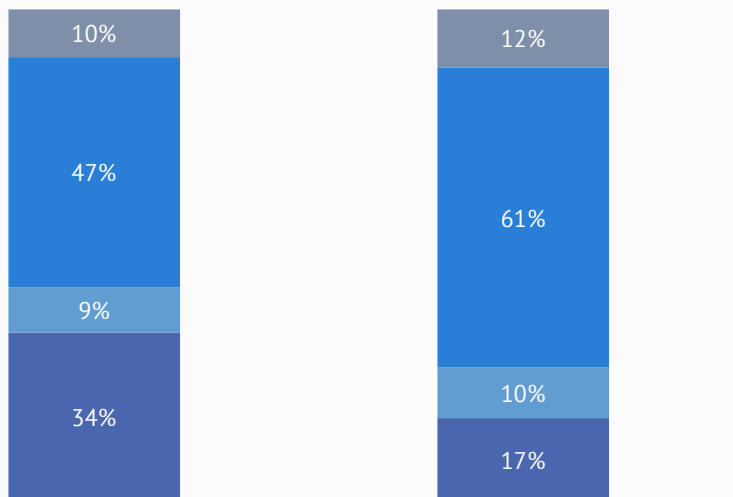
## SVOD – Share of films by core business of service owner



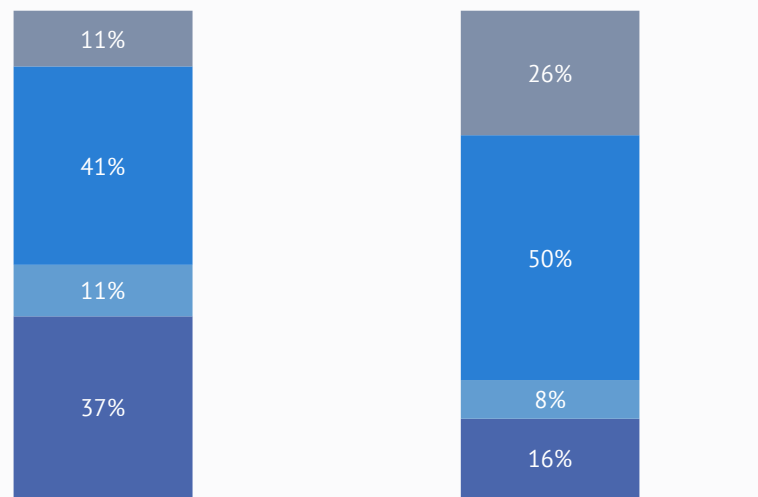
# Higher share of EU27 films for EU27 owned services...

The share of EU27 films in the catalogues of EU27 owned services was higher, with 34% on TVOD and 37% on SVOD while global services had a share of EU27 films of 17% on TVOD and 16% on SVOD.

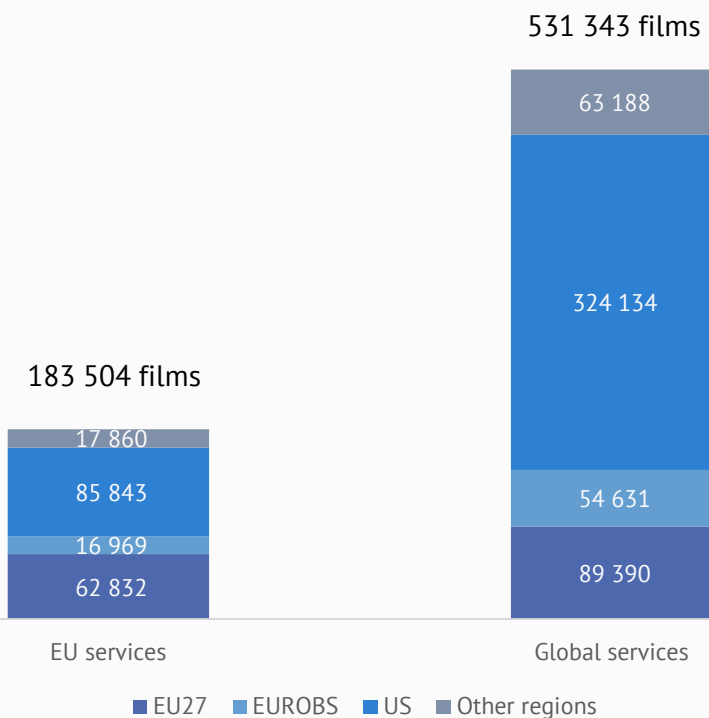

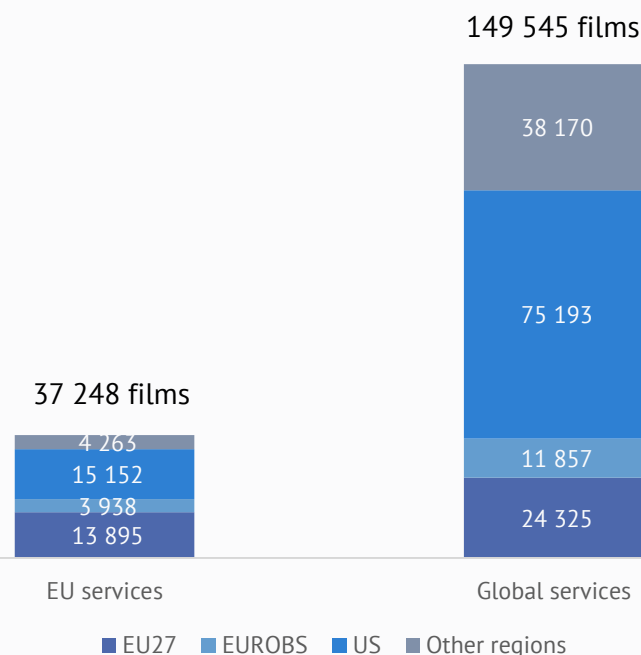

## B.5 – Composition of catalogues by national and EU27 non-national films

On TVOD, 36% of all EU27 films were of national origin, 27% on SVOD

- ▶ EU27 non-national films were the main source of EU films for both types of services.
- ▶ The share of national films was of course higher in the catalogues of larger film producing countries of the EU27.

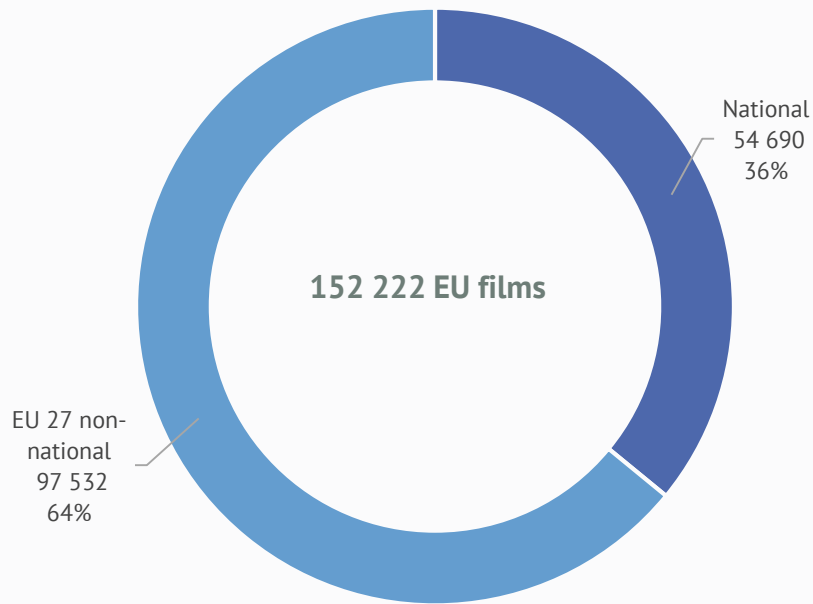
Both on TVOD and SVOD, national services had a much higher share of national films than multi-country services, which relied more on EU27 non-national films for their EU27 film offering

- ▶ With a share of 58% of national films of EU27 films on TVOD and 53% on SVOD, national services had a higher share of national film offering.
- ▶ For multi-country services, national films represented 30% of all EU27 films on TVOD and 22% on SVOD.
- ▶ This shows that national services, for TVOD and SVOD, tended to cater to national tastes in their film offering for EU27 film content.

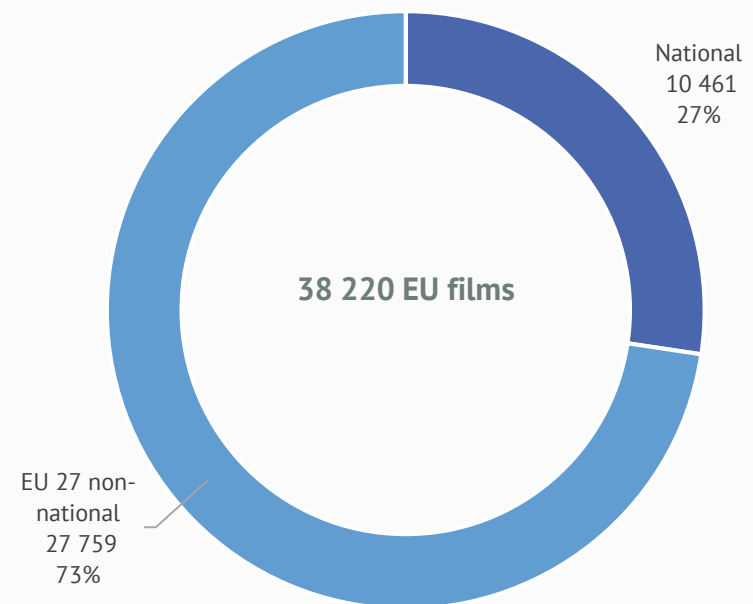

SVOD - Split of national and EU27 non-national films



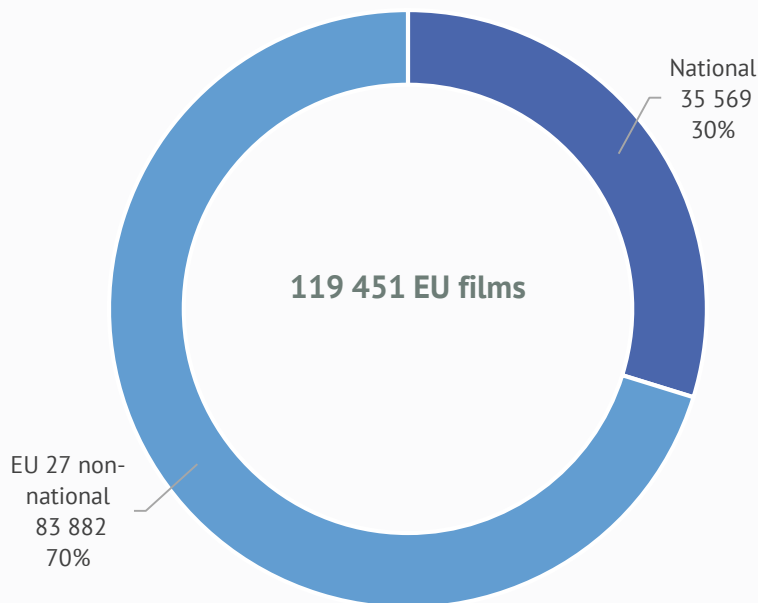

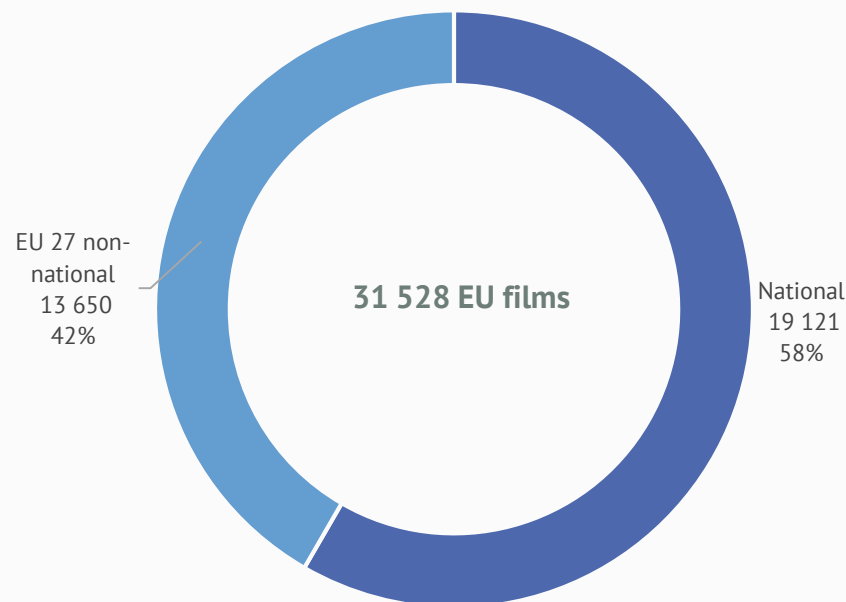

- Split of national and EU27 non-national films



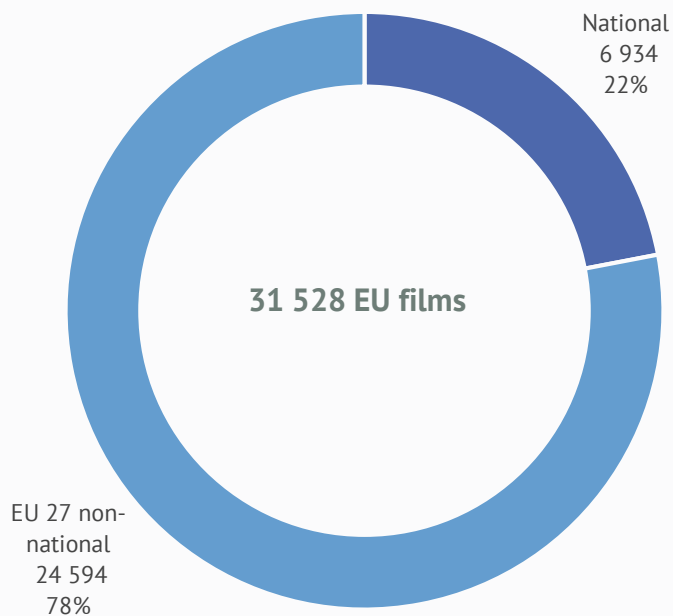
**TVOD national services**  
- Split of national and EU27 non-national films



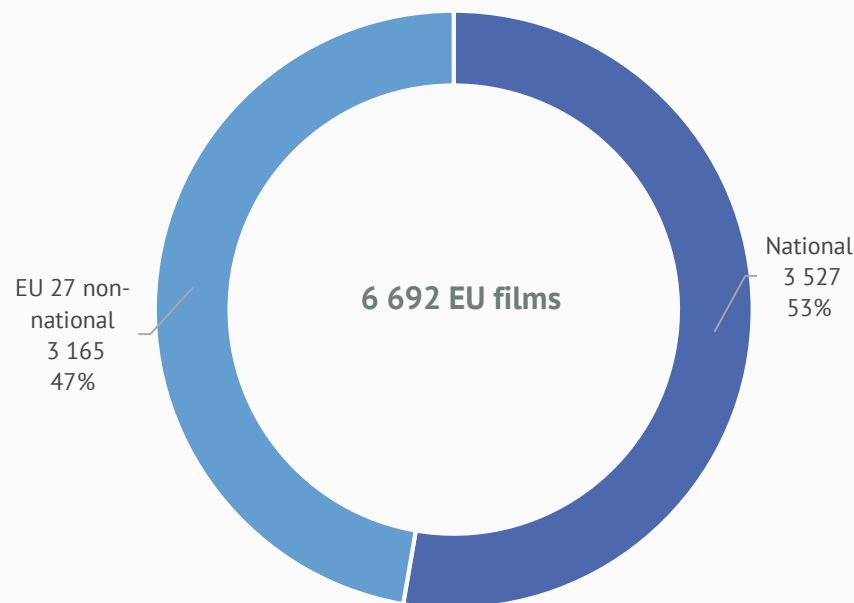

## B.6 – Focus on the export of EU27 films in the EU27, on TVOD and SVOD

Only EU27 non-national films were considered

**French films were the most exported films on TVOD and SVOD**, making respectively up 30% and 26% of all exported EU27 films

- ▶ German films ranked second with 22% of all exported films on TVOD and 19% on SVOD.
- ▶ Italian films were the third most exported EU27 films on TVOD while Spanish films ranked third on SVOD.
- ▶ EU-4 (France, Germany, Italy and Spain) films represented 68% of all EU27 film exports on TVOD and 66% on SVOD.
- ▶ Spanish film titles circulated the best among these EU-4 titles with on average 4,1 export countries on TVOD and 5,2 on SVOD.

**French films were the most exported EU27 films on national and multi-country services, on TVOD and on SVOD**

- ▶ With 31% and 33% of all exported EU27 films in national TVOD and SVOD catalogues, French films were the first source of imported films on national services.
- ▶ They were also the first source of EU27 non-national films on multi-country services, with 30% on TVOD and 25% on SVOD.

**Films from EU27 smaller film producing countries represented a much smaller share of EU27 film exports but when these titles countries managed to get exported, they circulated better on average than titles from larger producing countries**

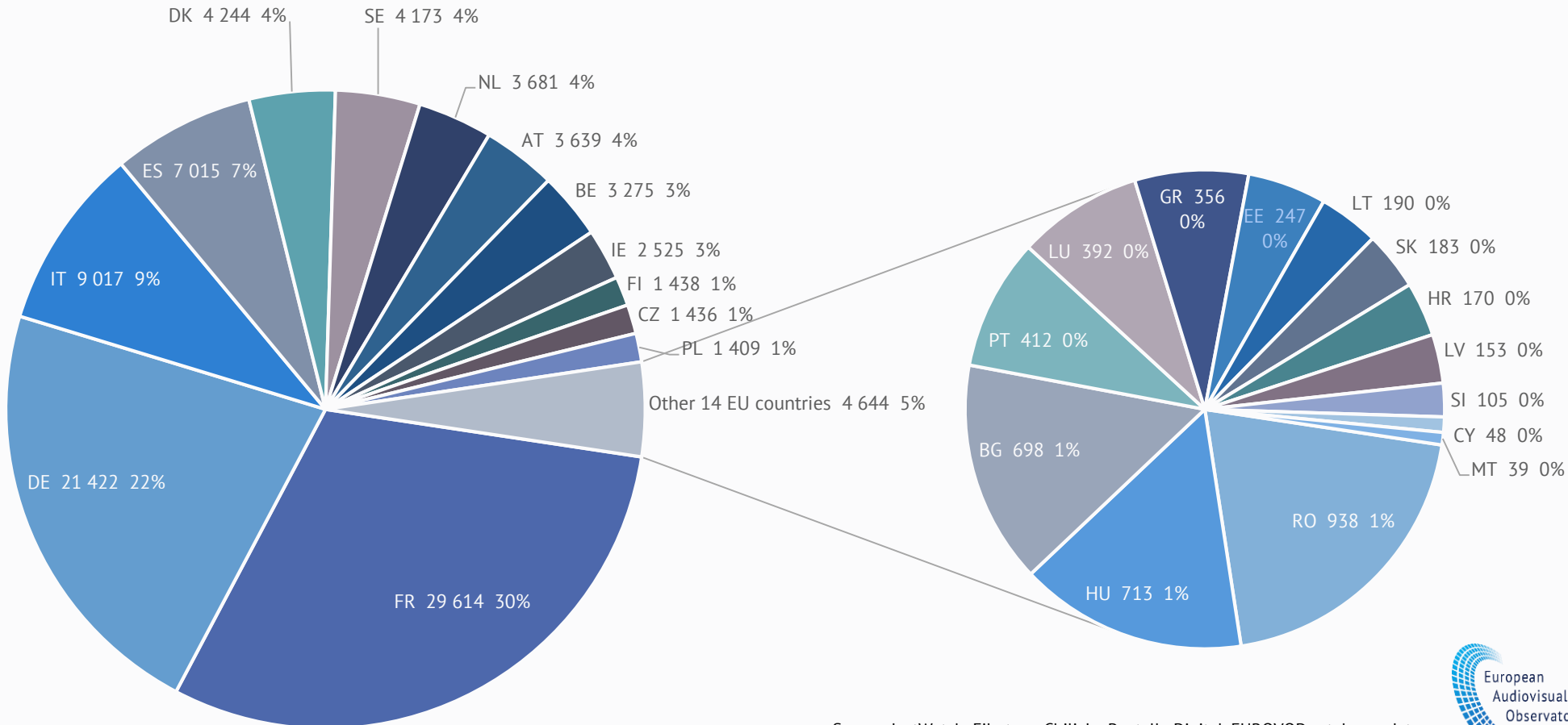
As a rule of thumb, the lower the volume of titles, the better the average country circulation.

**For other European films, British films made up the bulk of films with 81% of all EUR OBS films on TVOD and 75% on SVOD**

# Which EU27 countries exported the most films on TVOD?

- ▶ French films dominated the export of EU27 films on TVOD services with 30% followed by the other 3 biggest film producing countries in EU27.
- ▶ Nordic countries, Dutch, Austrian, Belgian and Irish films completed the top 10 export countries for EU27 films while remaining 14 EU27 countries exported less than 5% of all EU27 films.

TVOD – Number of EU films exported outside of their national market by country of origin

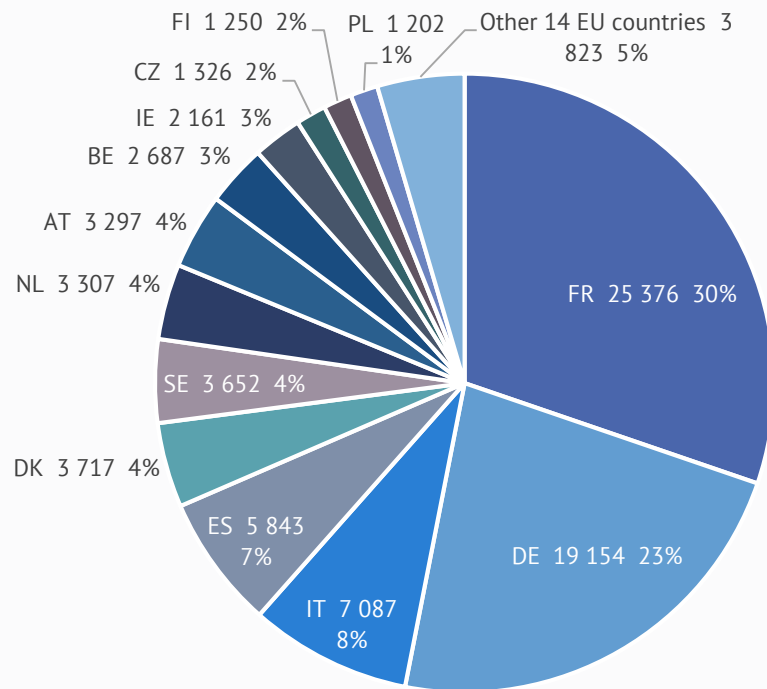

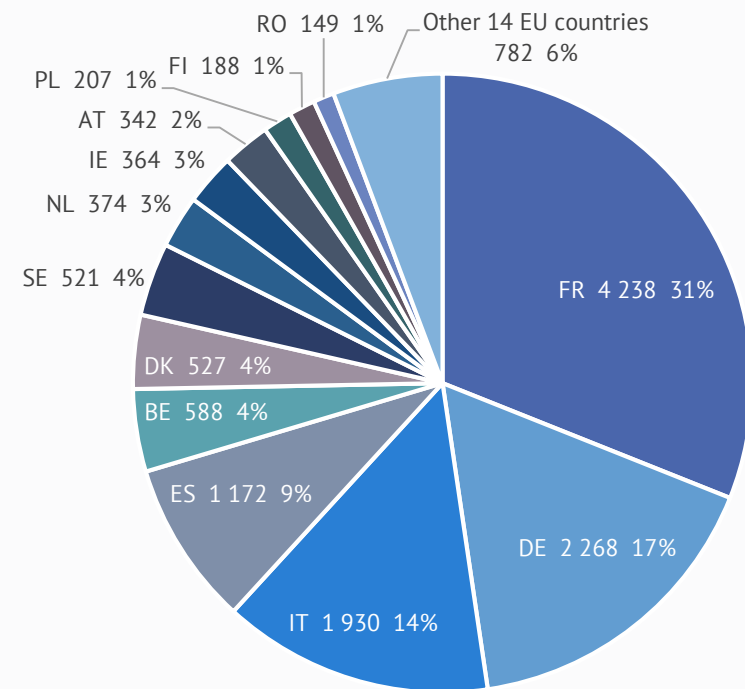

## Export of EU films in 24 national TVOD catalogues

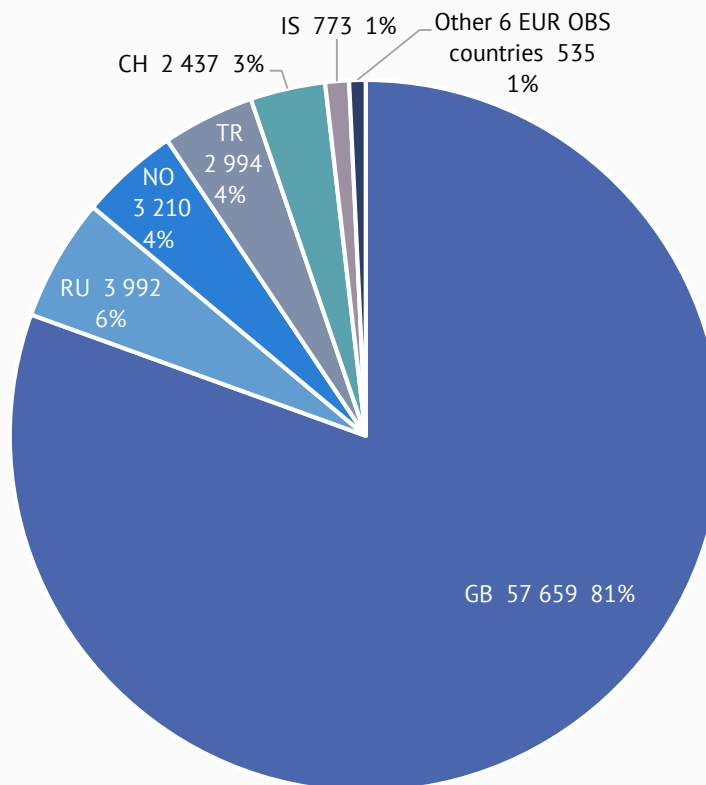

# Which other European countries exported the most films on TVOD?

- ▶ **British films dominated the export of other European films** on TVOD services with 81% of all EUR OBS films available on TVOD services.

TVOD – Number of EUR OBS by country of origin

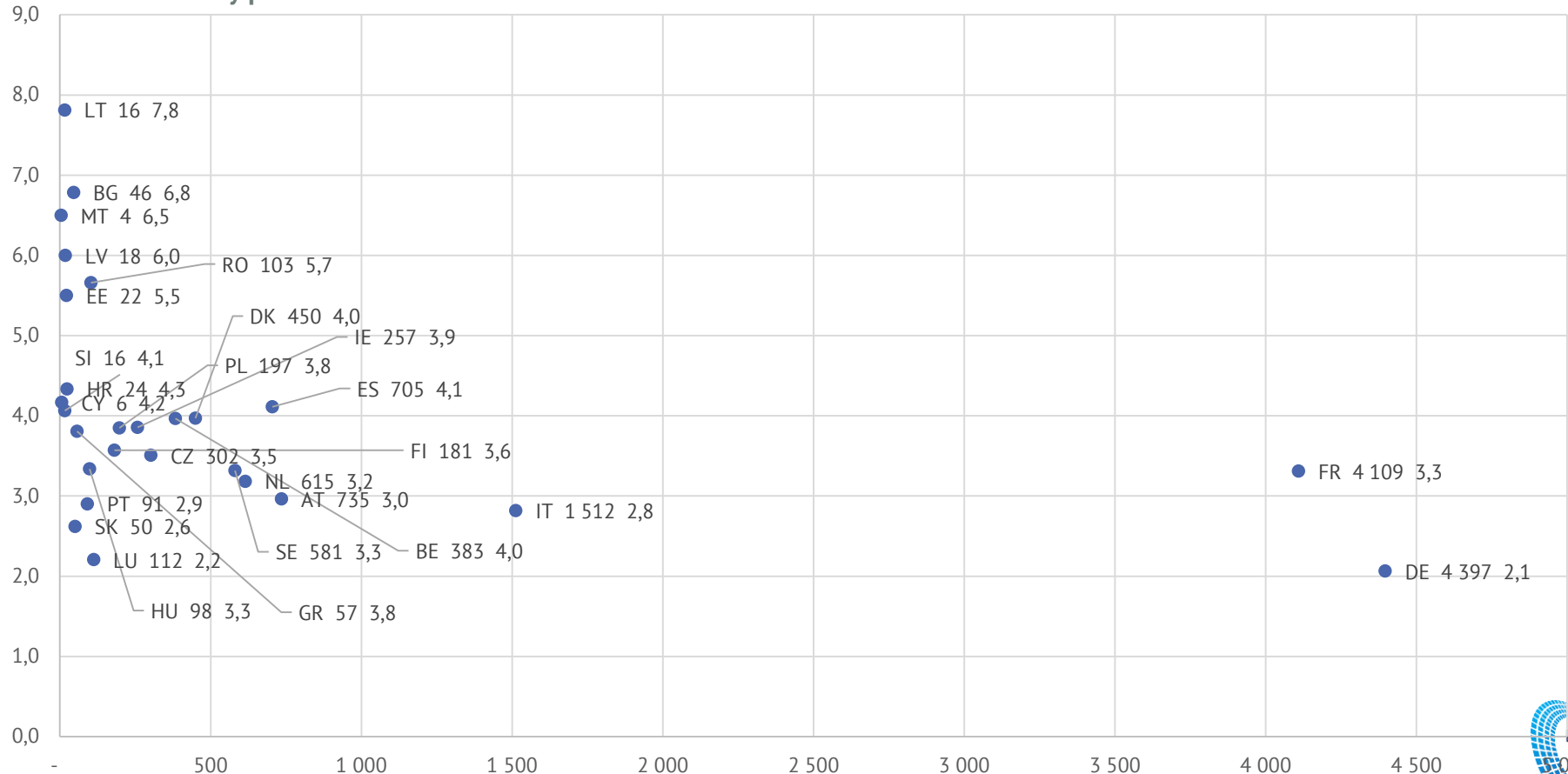

# And how many unique film titles were exported and present on average in countries?

- Countries with a lower number of films exports had a better country circulation – a low number of titles enhanced circulation.
- Spanish titles were the best circulating titles from EU-4 when they were exported, followed by French, Italian and German titles.

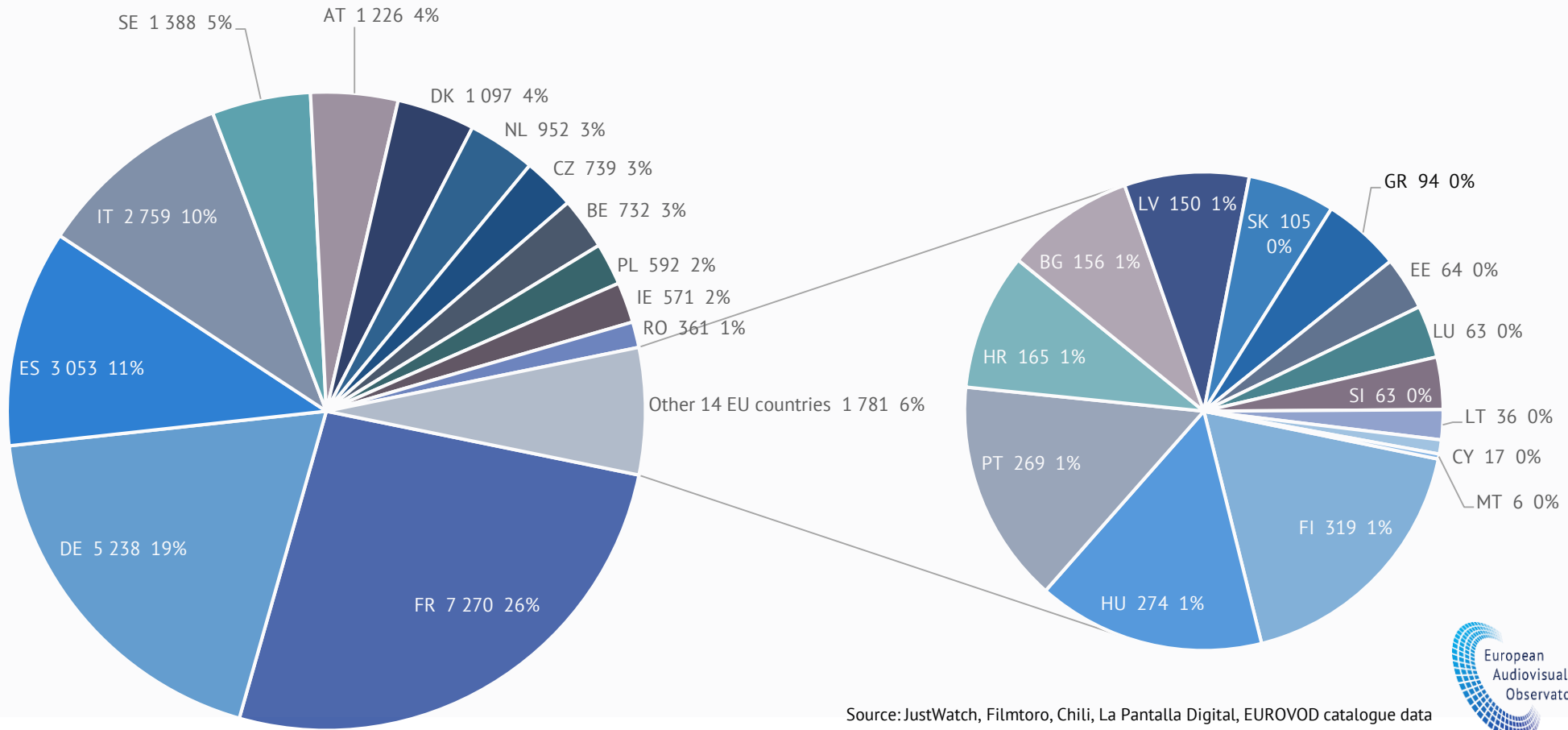

# Which EU countries exported the most on SVOD?

- As it was the case for TVOD, France was also the top film exporter on SVOD with 26% of all EU27 film exports while EU-4 made up 66% of all exported EU27 films.
- The proportion of the bottom 14 export countries was also comparable, at 6% of all EU27 film exports.

SVOD – Number of EU films exported outside of their national market by country of origin

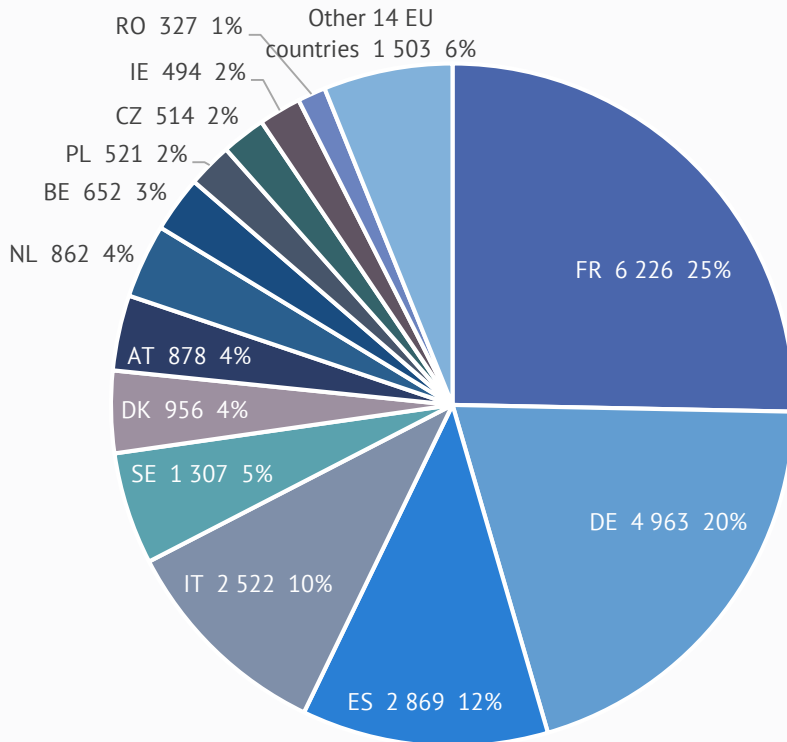

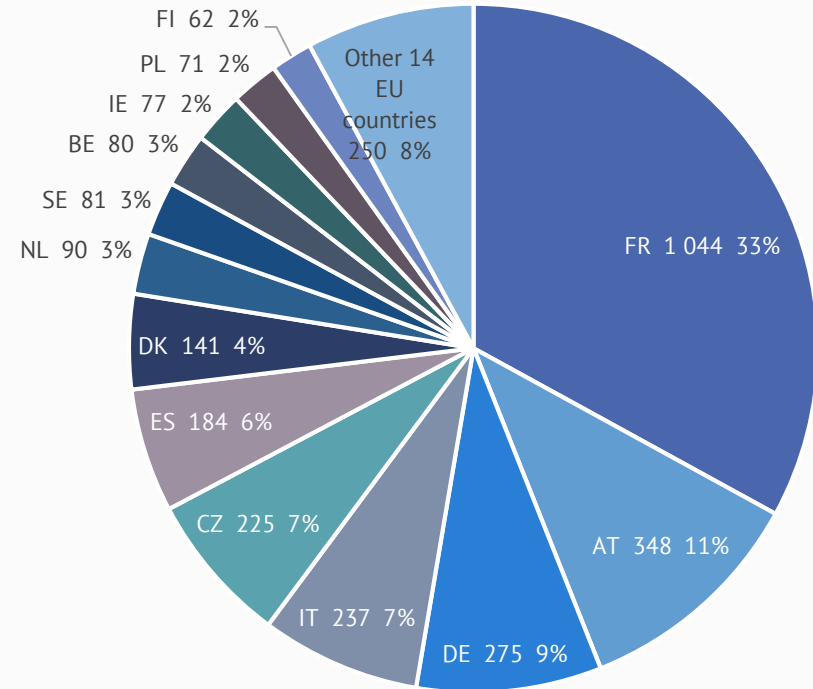
# Comparable proportions of films on SVOD as on TVOD for multi-country and national services

- ▶ For multi-country catalogues French, German, Spanish and Italian films represented 67% of all exported EU27 films.

Export of EU films in 25 national SVOD catalogues

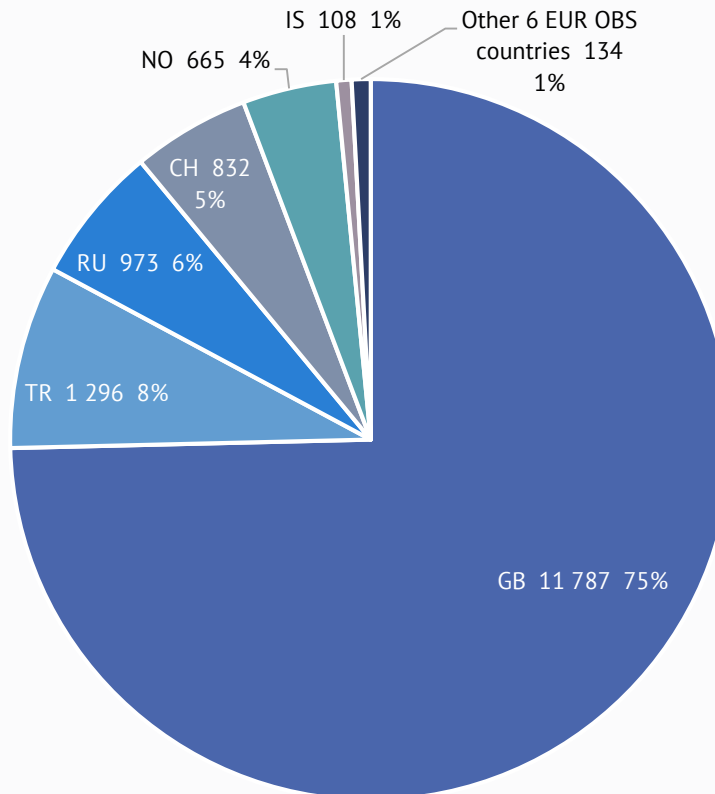

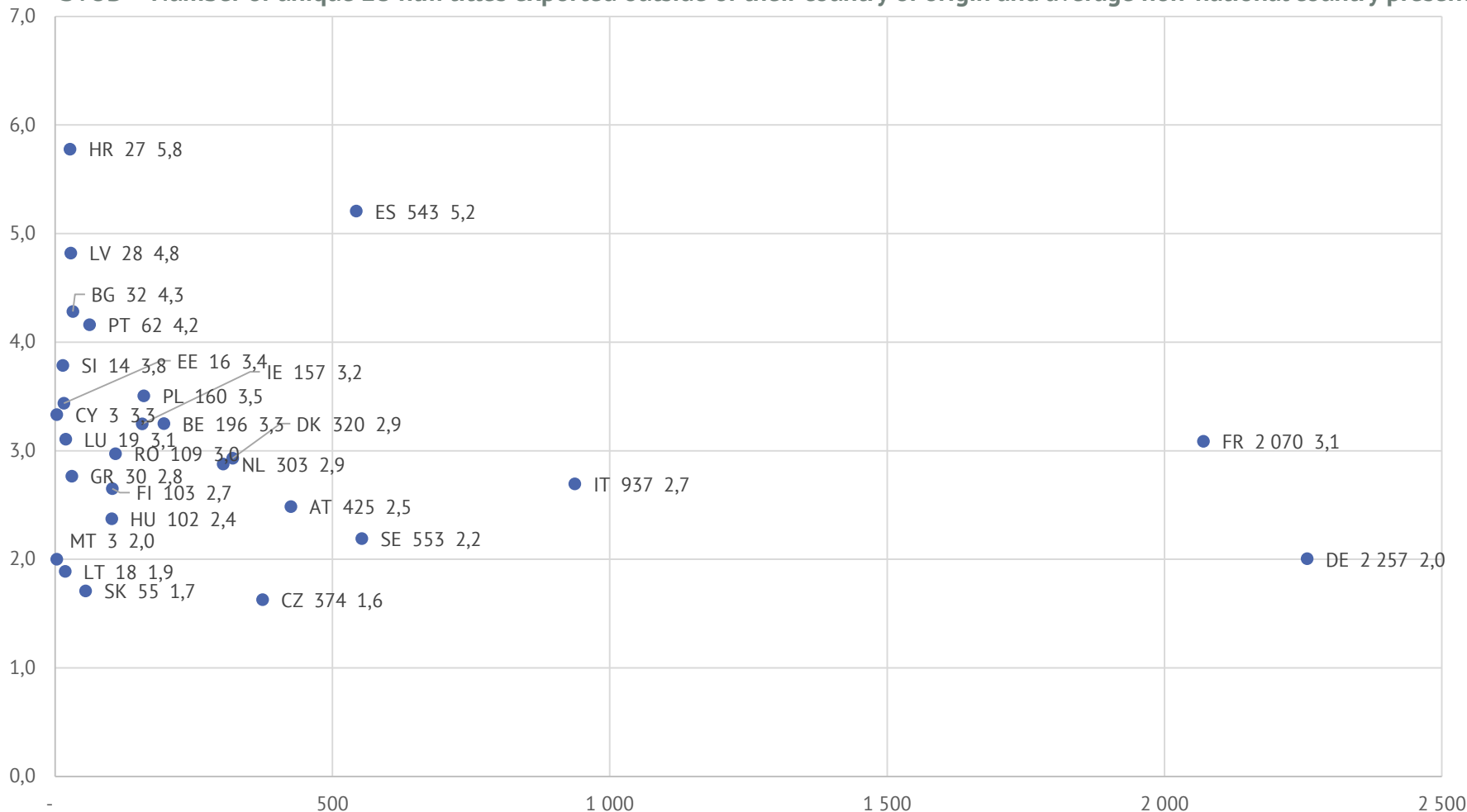
SVOD – Number of EUR OBS films by country of origin

# Top 20 EU27 film titles exported on SVOD services

- ▶ French titles represented 11 titles in the top 20 list, followed by 2 Belgian titles and 7 titles from other EU27 country (Germany, Slovenia, Italia, Spain, Poland, Bulgaria, Denmark).
- ▶ 14 titles were co-productions of which 7 with the United States and 7 between at least 2 EU27 countries.

# C.1 – Size of TV content catalogues

TV content in this section was analysed in number of cumulated TV seasons. Some indicators are also shown in number of cumulated TV episodes.

**TVOD catalogues were bigger than SVOD catalogues in average number of seasons, while SVOD catalogues were bigger in median number of seasons**

- ▶ On average, TVOD catalogues were bigger in number of TV seasons than SVOD catalogues.
- ▶ The median SVOD catalogue was bigger than the median TVOD catalogue, because more SVOD services counted a bigger TV content volume, as it is their core business.

**Multi-country TVOD services were the biggest in average number of seasons**

- ▶ Multi-country TVOD services had almost twice the average size of multi-country SVOD services.
- ▶ Multi-country VOD catalogues showed a larger average number of seasons than national VOD services

**Huge disparities in absolute numbers of TV seasons for TVOD and SVOD services**

- ▶ Multi-country services (both TVOD and SVOD) had a much higher amount of TV seasons than national services, which seems to be a matter of scale.
- ▶ SVOD services showed to be more focused on TV content and TVOD services, on films.

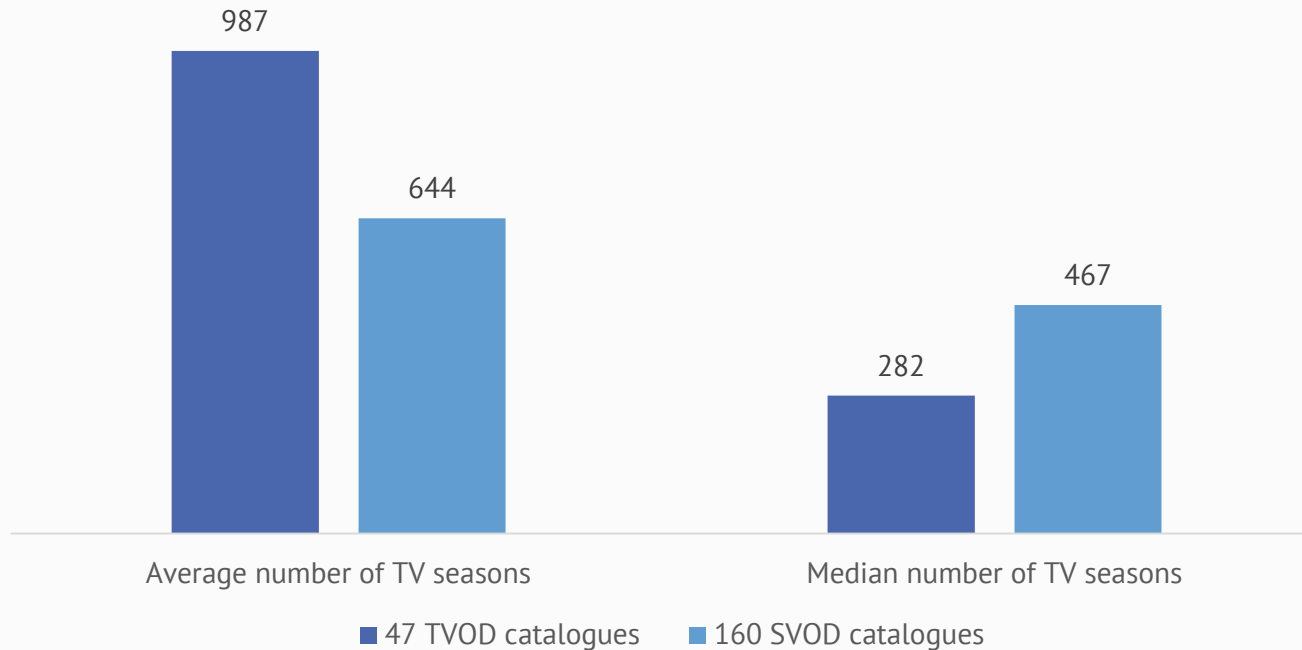

# Strong differences between TVOD and SVOD services in the number of TV seasons

- ▶ On average, TVOD catalogues had 53% more TV seasons than SVOD catalogues.
- ▶ The median SVOD catalogue, though, was 66% bigger than the median TVOD catalogue, because TV content being their core business, more services counted a significant volume of seasons.
- ▶ While 7 TVOD services counted 3 000 or more seasons, only 2 SVOD services counted around 3 000.

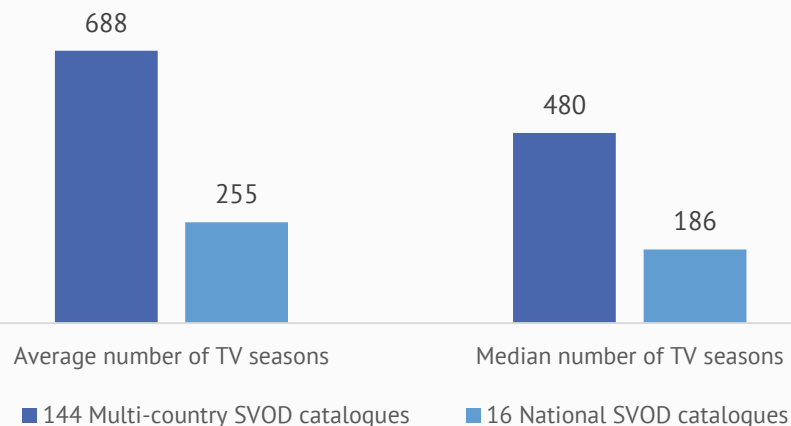
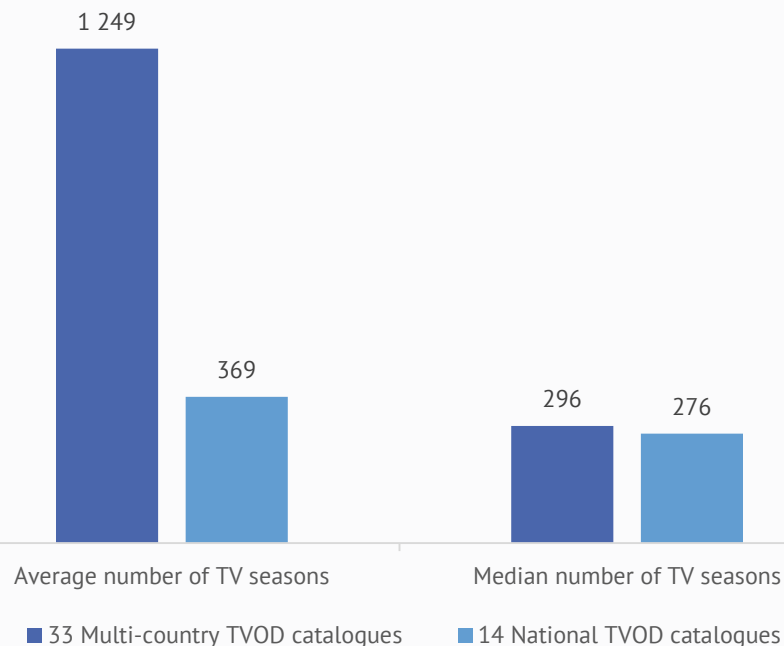


# Also, strong differences between national and multi-country services

- ▶ Multi-country catalogues showed a larger average number of seasons than national services, with an average difference of 880 TV seasons for TVOD and 433 for SVOD services.

Average and median size of SVOD catalogues, in number of seasons

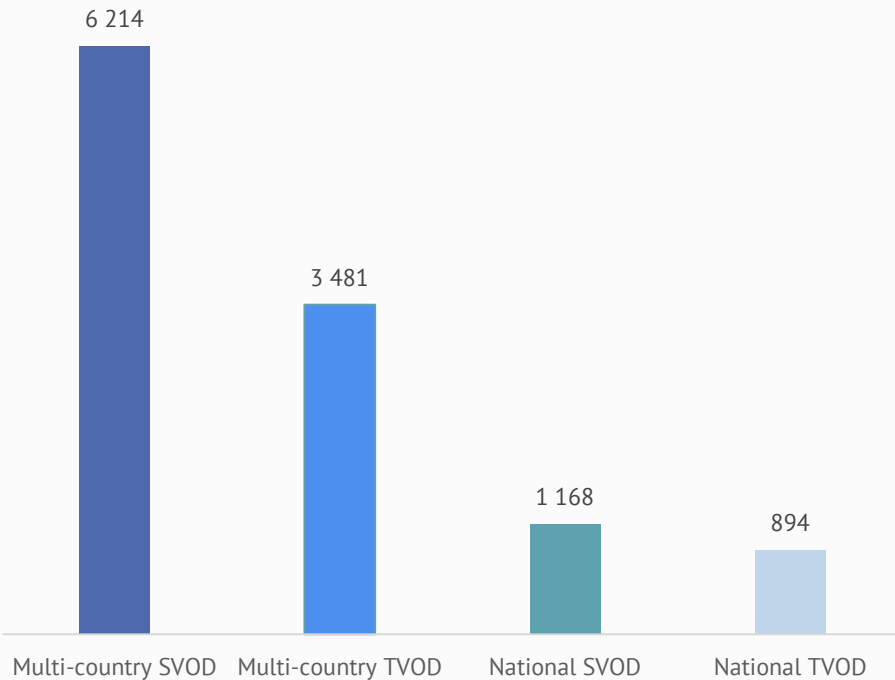

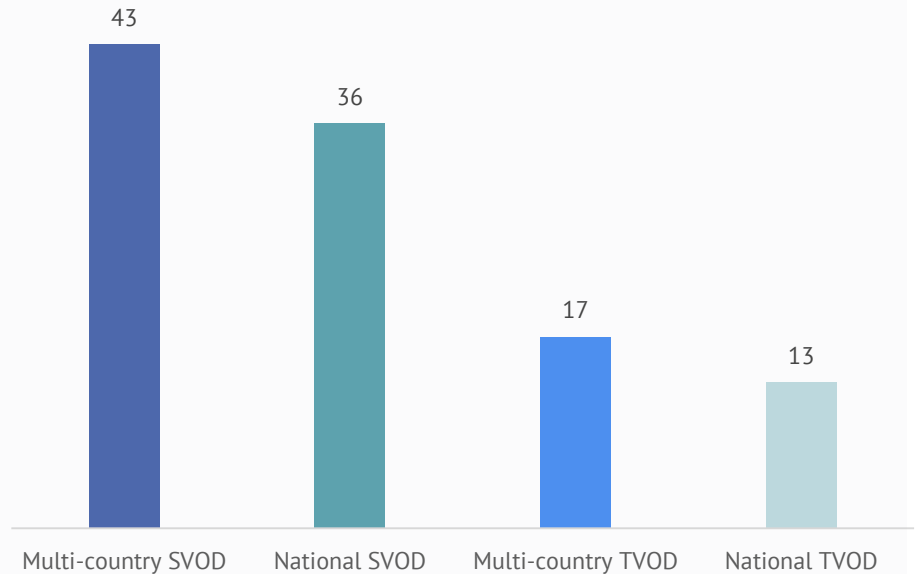
# Huge disparities in absolute numbers of TV seasons for TVOD and SVOD services

- ▶ Multi-country services (both TVOD and SVOD) had a much higher amount of TV seasons than national services, which seemed to be a matter of **scale**.

**Minimum** number of seasons in catalogue by business model

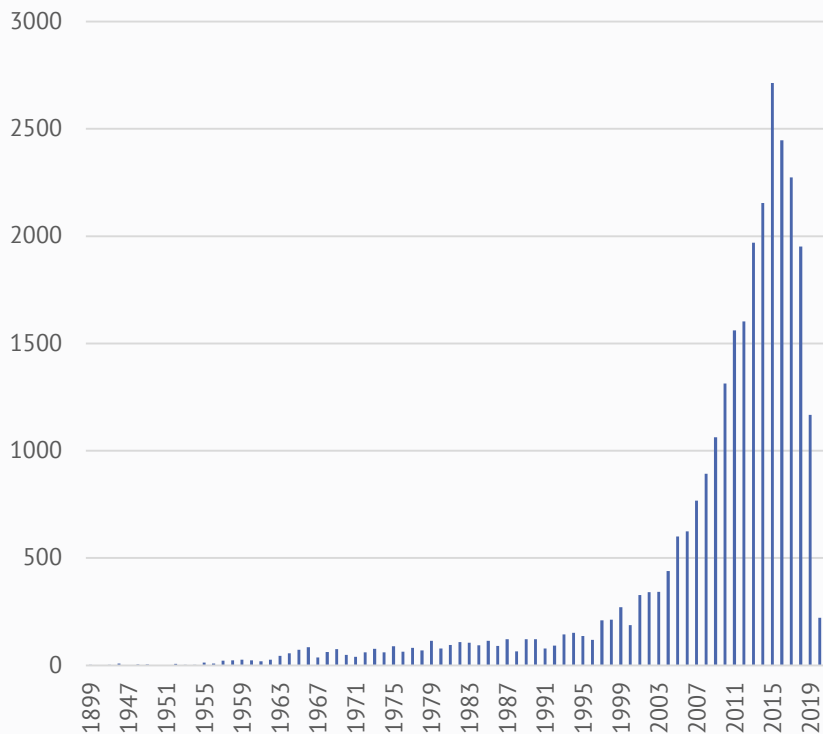

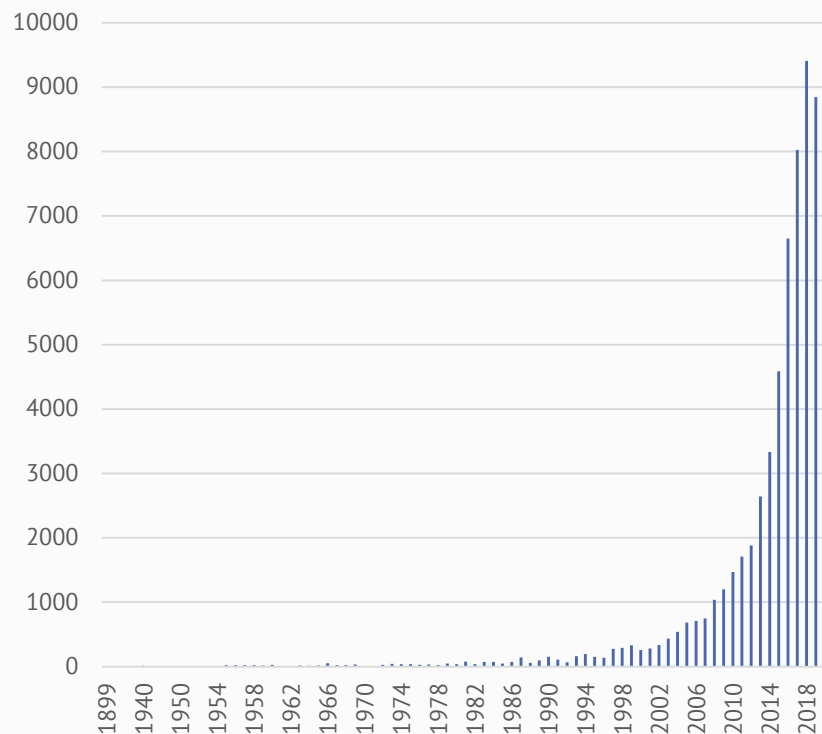

## C.2 – Unique TV contents available in VOD catalogues

### Over 21 000 unique TV seasons were available in VOD catalogues, 23% from EU27

- ▶ 23% of all (21 124) unique seasons were of EU27 origin and 37% of US origin.
- ▶ EU4: German (39%), French, Spanish and Italian TV seasons represented 75% of all unique EU27 seasons.
- ▶ Other European seasons, with the integration of British content, represented 19% of all available.

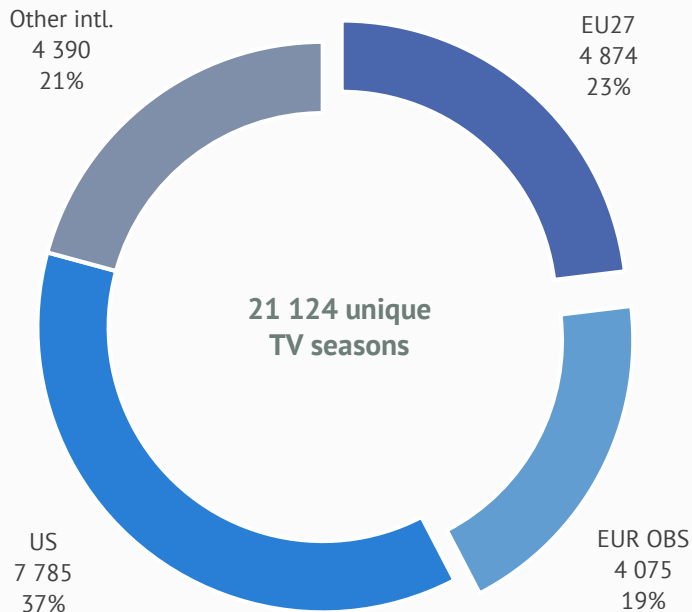

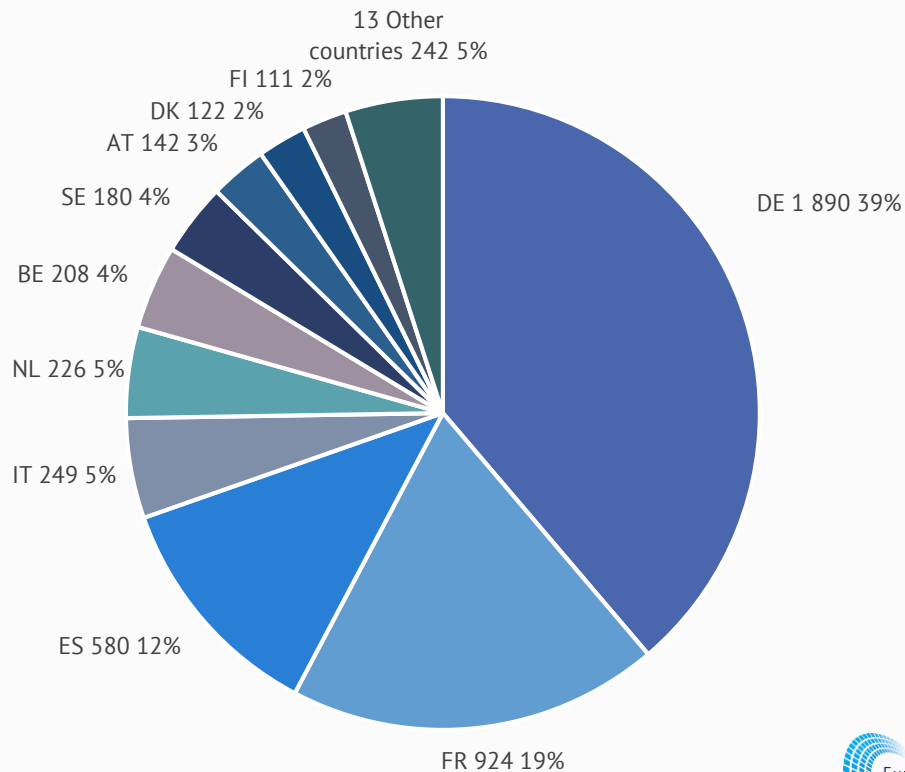

Origin of unique EU27 seasons in VOD catalogues by country of origin

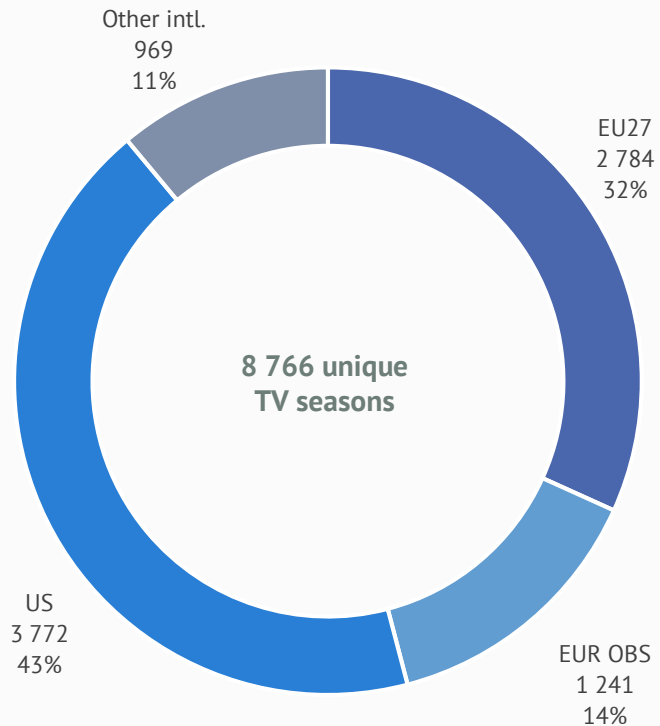

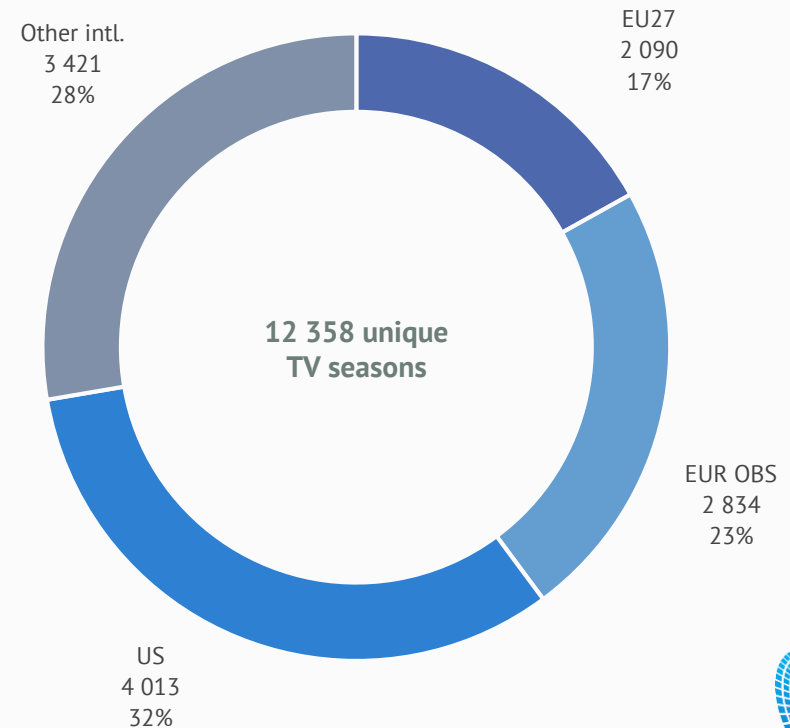

Origin of unique TV seasons in SVOD catalogues

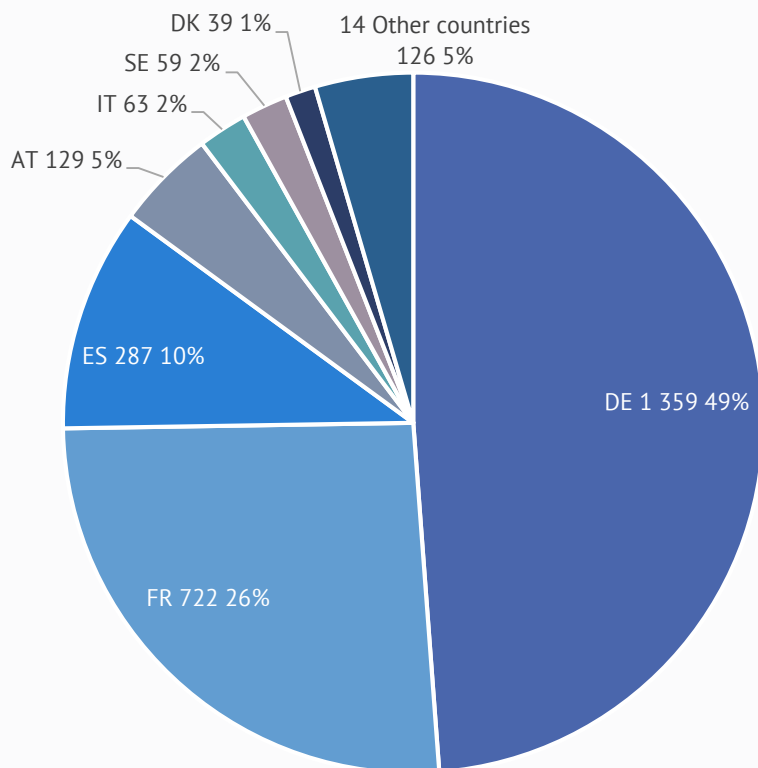

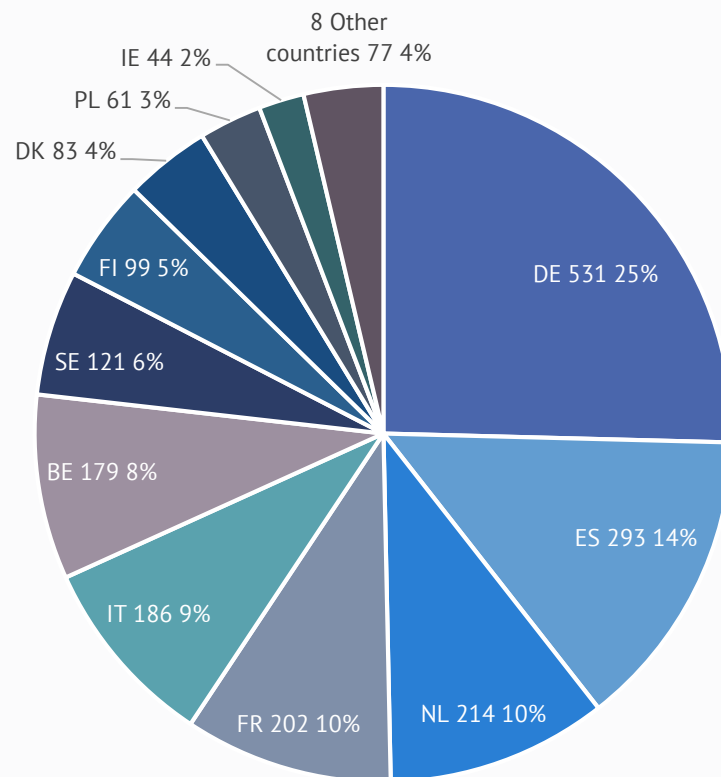

Origin of unique EU27 TV seasons in SVOD catalogues

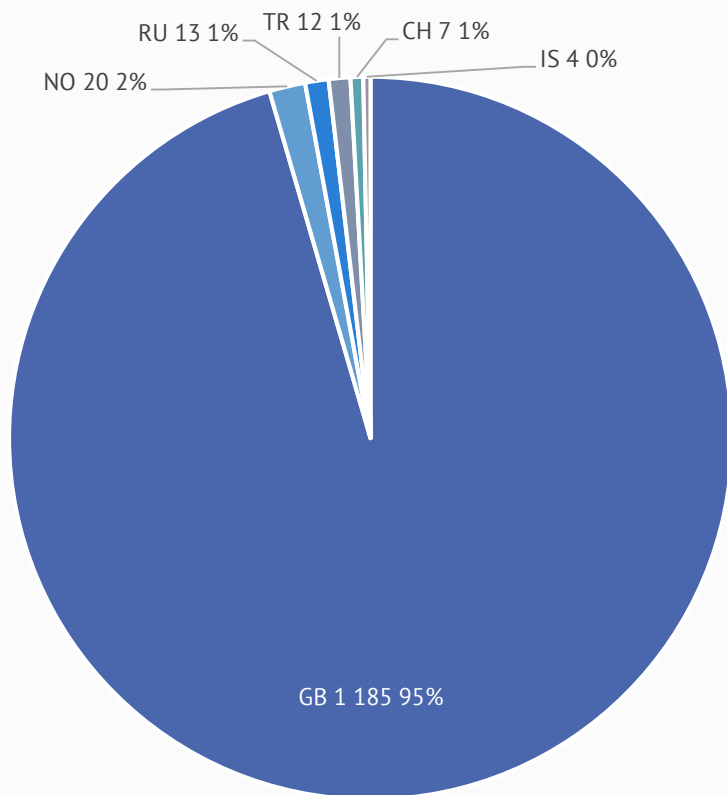

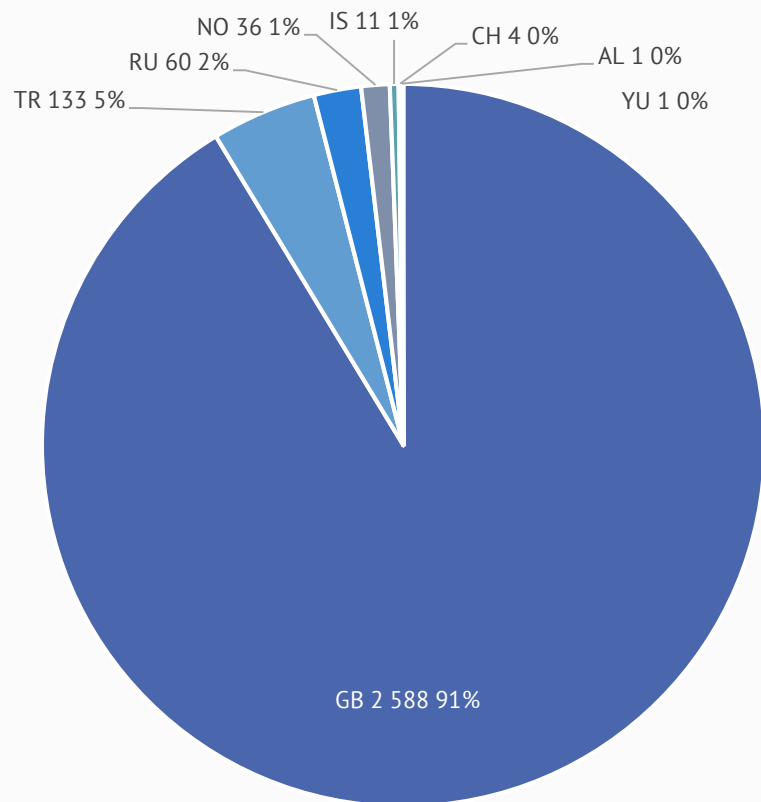

## C.3 – Origin and circulation of cumulated TV content

TV content was analysed here in **cumulated number of seasons**, with some indicators in **cumulated number of episodes**.

### ORIGIN

#### **24% of cumulated TV seasons on TVOD are of EU27 origin, but only 10,5% on SVOD**

- ▶ On SVOD services, EU27 content decreased from 17% unique seasons to 10% cumulated seasons.
- ▶ US TV seasons, over half of all cumulated content in VOD, multiplied by 13 times in SVOD and by 7 times on TVOD their unique presence.
- ▶ There was more TV content from outside the US or Europe (26%) than European (23%) in SVOD catalogues.

#### **US TV content counted more seasons, while Other international counted more episodes**

- ▶ Episodes from outside the US or Europe represent almost one third of all TV episodes in SVOD catalogues (29%), and were mostly composed of Japanese, Canadian and Korean animation and drama.

#### **The difference between the share of EU27 and of all European TV seasons was significant on SVOD**

- ▶ If other European countries (incl. UK) are considered, the **European share is 37% for TVOD and 23% for SVOD**.

#### **National VOD services presented the highest shares of EU27 TV seasons**

- ▶ National TVOD services complemented their offering with other European content, while national SVOD catalogues relied more on other international content.

#### **Multi-country VOD services relied more heavily on US seasons, but offered more European content in volume**

- ▶ EU27 TV seasons represented 22% on multi-country TVOD services but just 10% on SVOD services.

## C.3 – Origin and circulation of cumulated TV content

TV content was analysed here in **cumulated number of seasons**, with some indicators in **cumulated number of episodes**

### CIRCULATION

#### **EU27 TV seasons** circulated in a smaller **number of countries** than other origins

- ▶ 32% of EU27 unique TV seasons represented only 24% of all cumulated content on TVOD, while on SVOD, 17% of EU27 unique TV content represented just 10% of cumulated. This is explained by the **lower circulation of EU27 content than other origins, with an average of 2,4 countries on TVOD and 3 on SVOD.**
- ▶ US and other regions TV seasons travelled best, crossing borders more easily than European content.

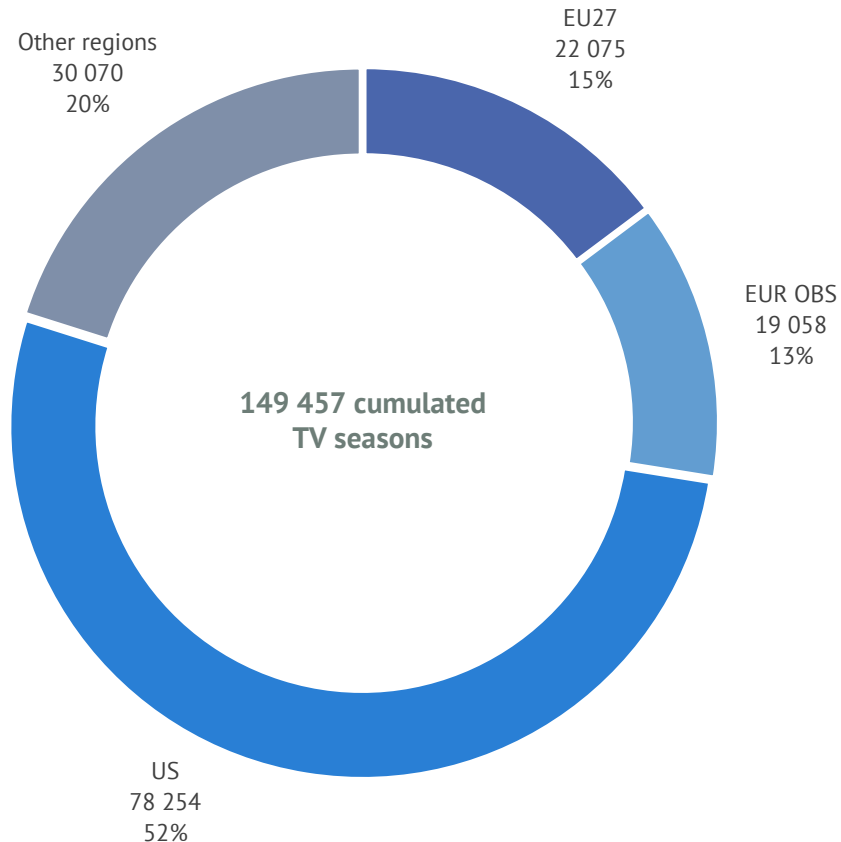
#### And **on catalogues**, EU27 TV content tended to circulate less than seasons from other regions

- ▶ On average, EU27 TV seasons were present in 5 different TVOD catalogues and in 3 SVOD catalogues.
- ▶ On TVOD, other European seasons (including GB) were found on an average 7,8 catalogues.

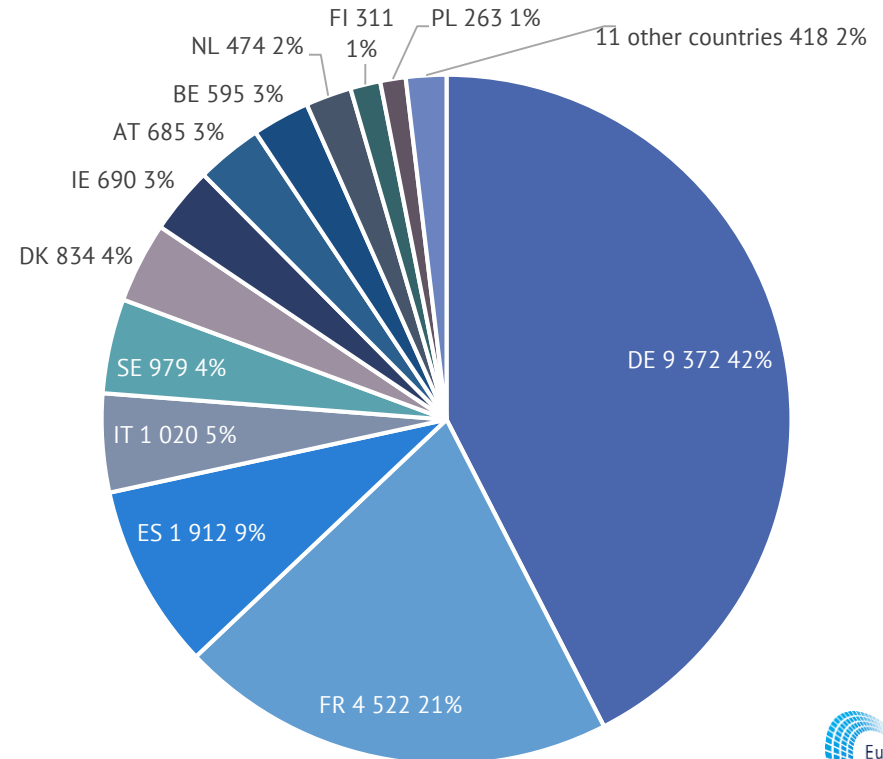

Origin of cumulated EU27 seasons in 207 VOD catalogues, by country of origin



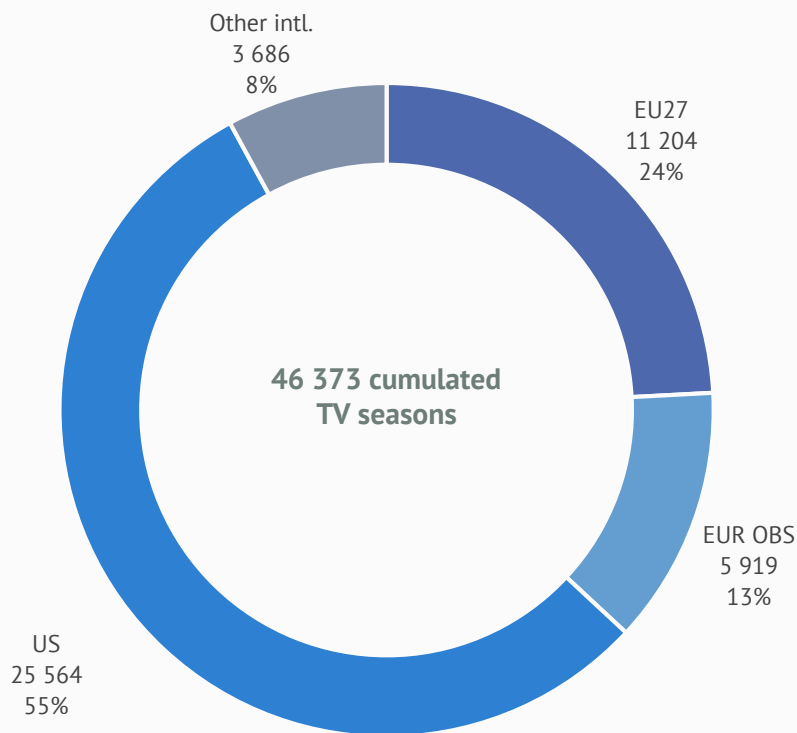

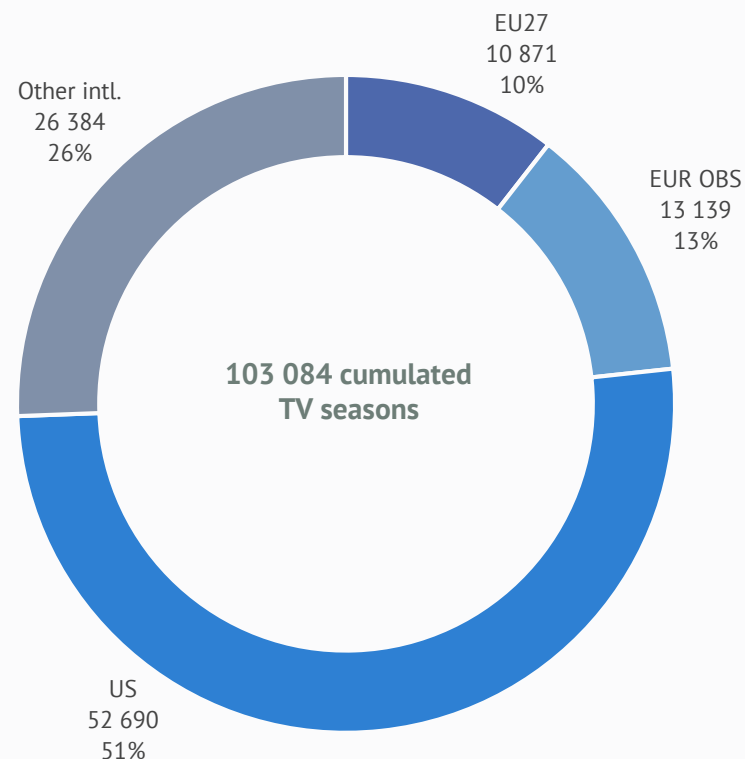

- ▶ On SVOD services, EU27 content decreased from 17% **unique** seasons to 10,5% **cumulated** seasons.

Origin of TV seasons in 160 SVOD catalogues



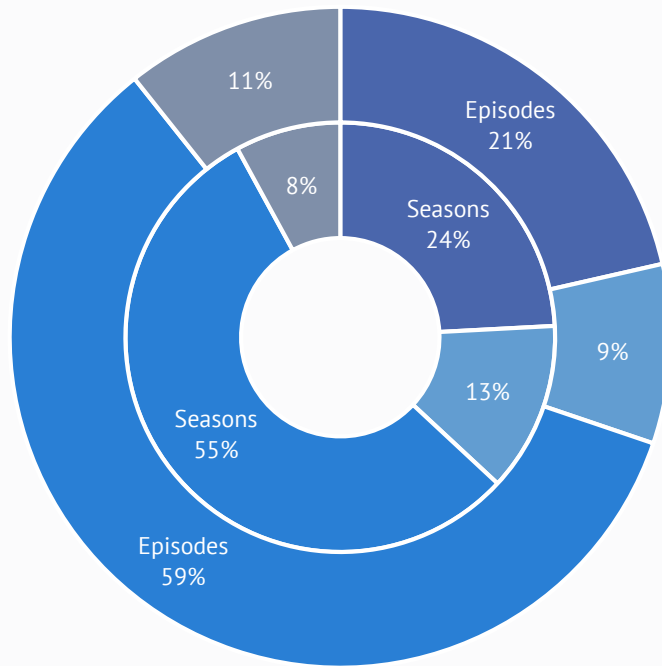

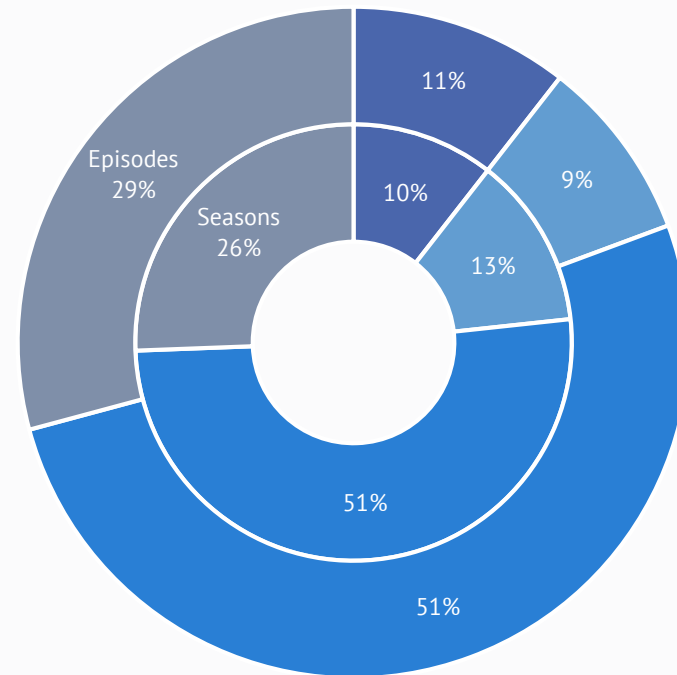

Origin of TV titles, seasons and episodes on SVOD



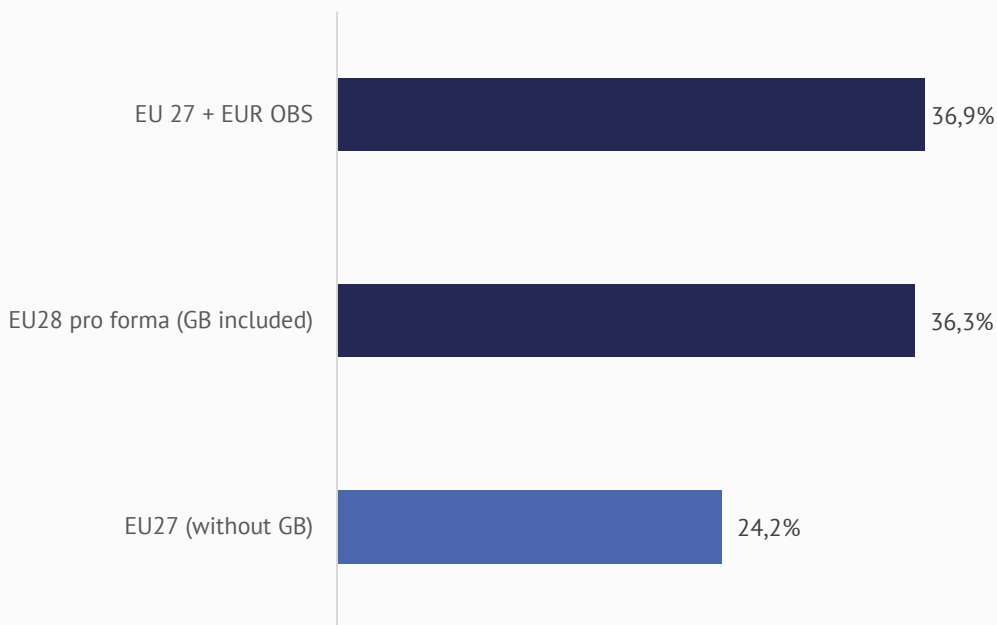

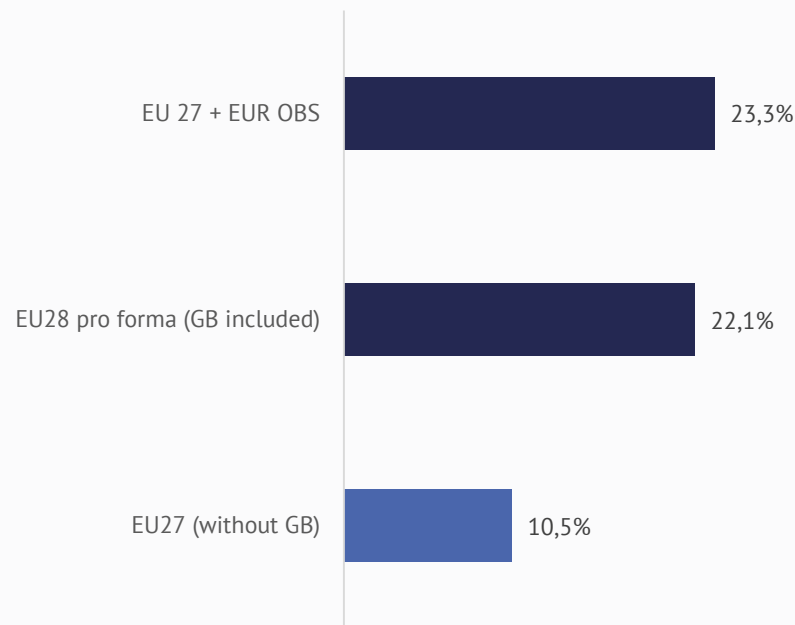
# The difference between the share of EU27 and of all European seasons was significant on SVOD

- ▶ Share of European TV seasons varies strongly depending on which countries qualify as “European”.

- ▶ If other European countries are taken into account, the share was 37% for TVOD and 23% for SVOD.
- ▶ Depending on whether British TV seasons were counted as European content or not, it increased the share of European seasons by 13% for both TVOD and SVOD.

Origin of TV seasons in 160 SVOD catalogues

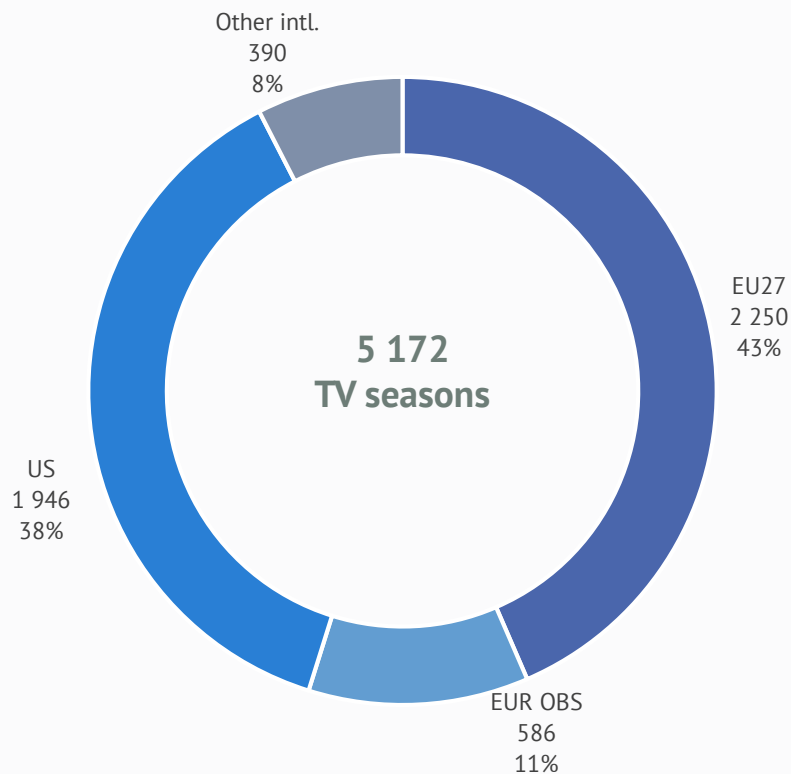

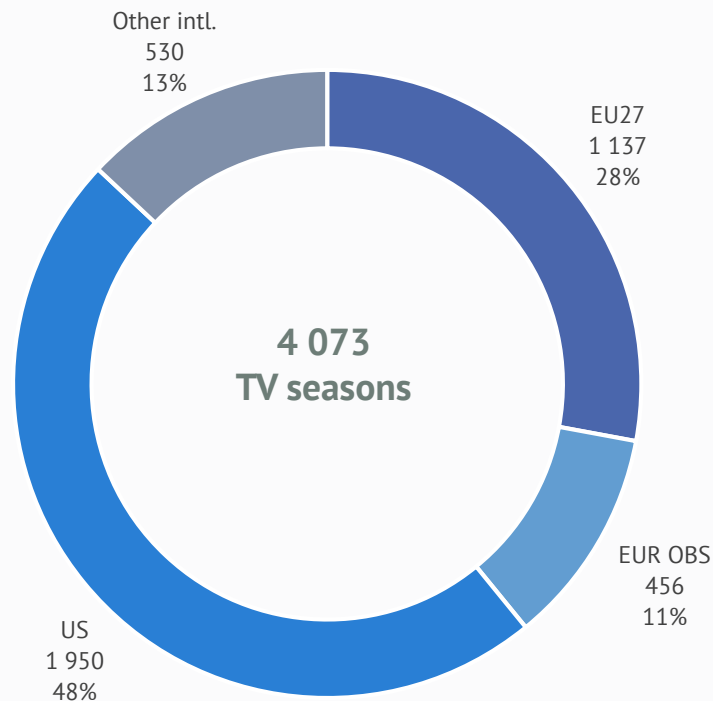
# National VOD services presented the highest shares of EU27 TV seasons

- ▶ National TVOD services relied more on EU27 TV seasons (43%) than SVOD services (28%) but both types took care of their national audiences. More than half content on TVOD was European.
- ▶ Stronger reliance on US TV seasons of SVOD national services (48%) than that of TVOD services.
- ▶ National TVOD services complemented their offering with other European content, while national SVOD catalogues relied more on other international content.

Origin of TV seasons in 16 national SVOD catalogues

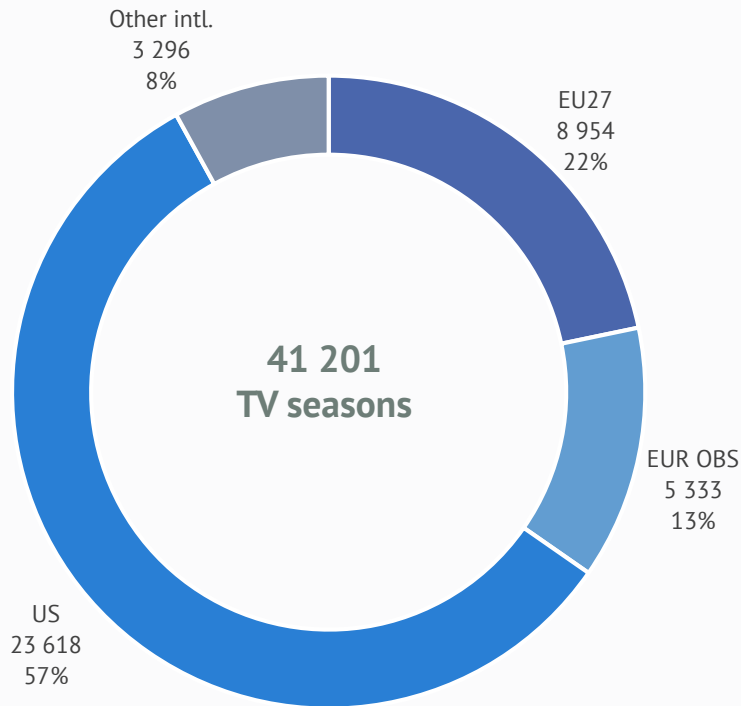

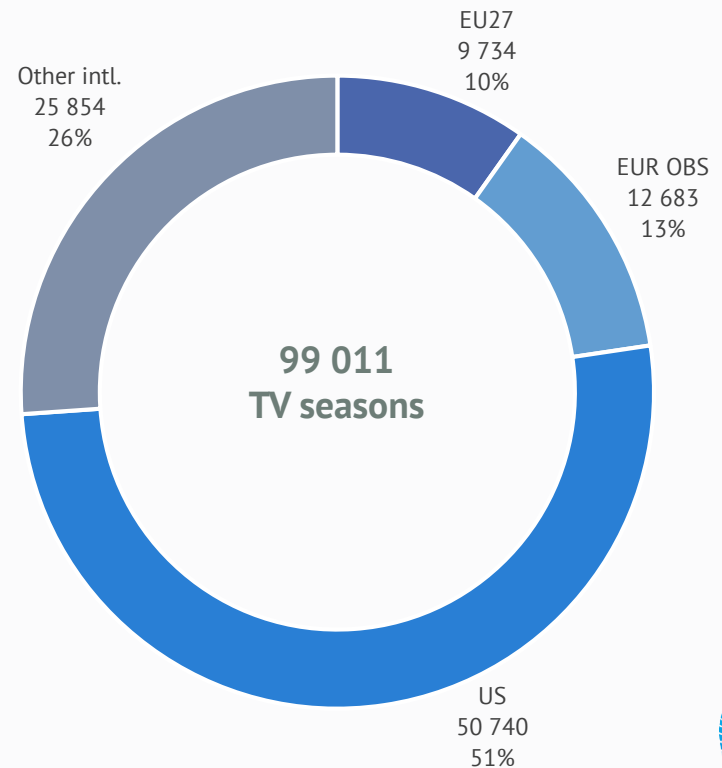
# While multi-country VOD services relied more heavily on US TV seasons

- ▶ EU27 TV seasons represented 22% on multi-country TVOD services but just 10% on SVOD services.
- ▶ Multi-country TVOD services relied more heavily on US TV seasons (57%), but SVOD offered more volume.
- ▶ SVOD catalogues had conversely the highest share of other international TV seasons (26%), even bigger than all European (EU27 and other European) TV seasons together.

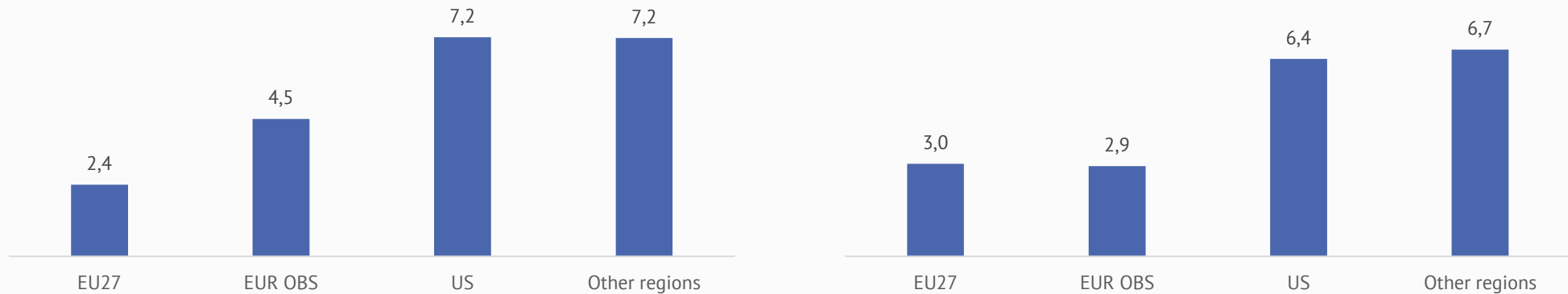


# EU27 TV seasons circulated in a smaller number of countries than other origins

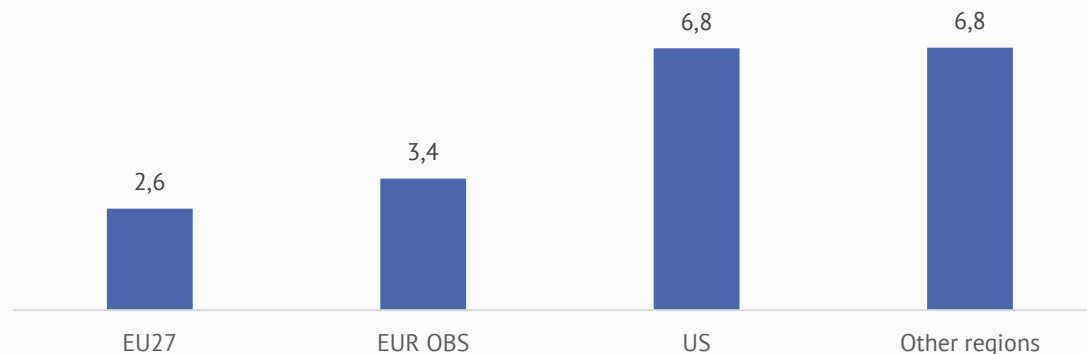
- ▶ 32% of EU27 unique TV seasons on TVOD represented only 24% of all cumulated content, and 17% of EU27 unique TV content on SVOD represented just 10% of cumulated. This **is explained by the lower circulation in countries of EU27 content**, with an average of 2,4 countries on TVOD and 3 on SVOD.
- ▶ **US and other regions TV seasons travelled best**, crossing borders more easily than European content.

All VOD services – Average circulation of TV seasons in countries by region of origin



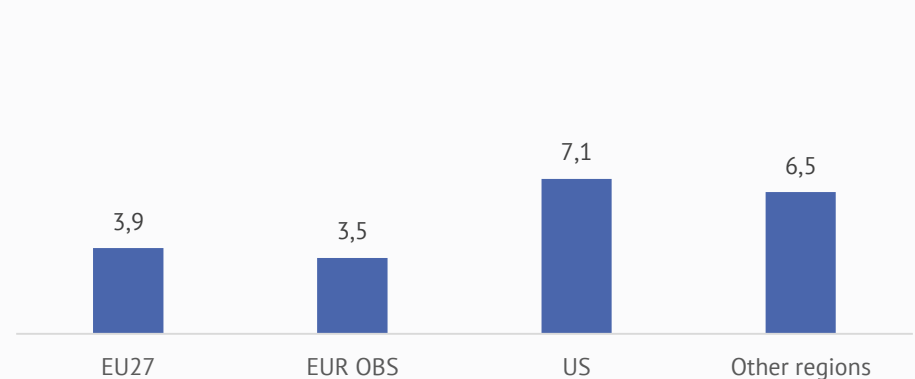
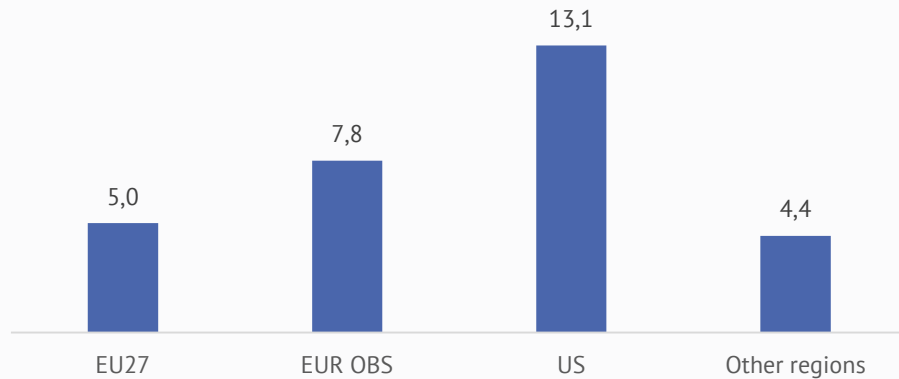

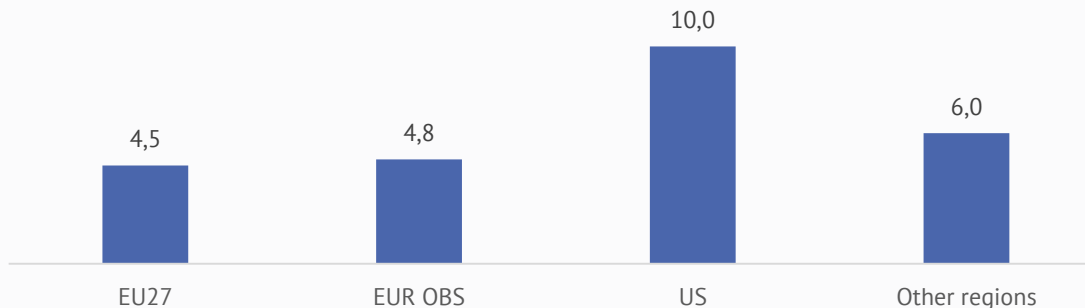

## C.4 – Focus on services' core business and ownership

**Services owned by tech on TVOD, and by pure VOD players, Tech or Telecom on SVOD have the highest number of TV seasons in their catalogues**

- ▶ 69% of all TV content on TVOD was on tech services (Amazon, Google, iTunes, Microsoft)
- ▶ 50% of content on SVOD was found on pure VOD players (Netflix, Crunchyroll, Hayu).

**Sharp differences in the composition of catalogues by core business of service owners**

- ▶ Services owned by distributors, telecom (Orange, Sky) and TV players (Maxdome, Canal VOD) showed the highest share of EU27 TV seasons on TVOD,
- ▶ Services owned by TV (Viaplay, Disney+) and distributors showed the largest EU27 TV content on SVOD.
- ▶ For SVOD, Pure VOD players (Netflix) built their catalogues on US and Other international TV seasons.
- ▶ The highest share of US seasons was found in SVOD services operated by telecom (Sky) and tech (Amazon) players, and in TVOD on Pure VOD (Chili) and tech players, all of them rounding 69% of US content.

**Higher share of EU27 TV content for EU27 owned services...**

- ▶ The share of EU27 TV seasons in the catalogues of EU owned services was higher, with 35% on TVOD and 29% on SVOD while global services had a EU27 seasons share of 19% on TVOD and 8% on SVOD.
- ▶ SVOD global services showed a higher share of Other international content (27%) than European content.

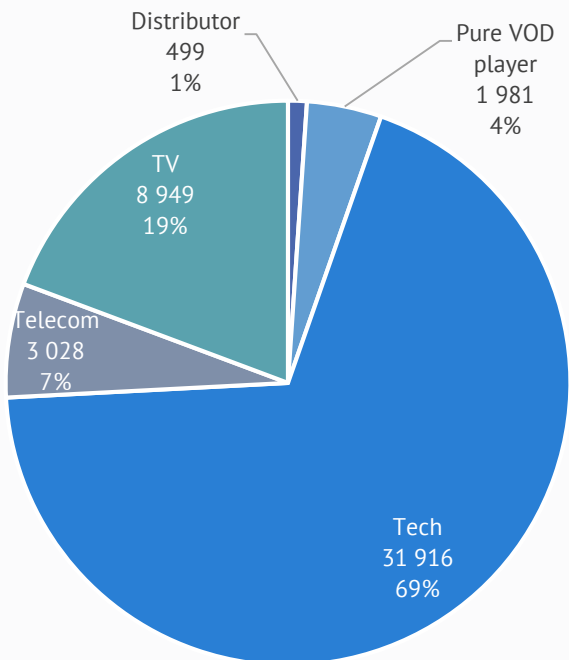

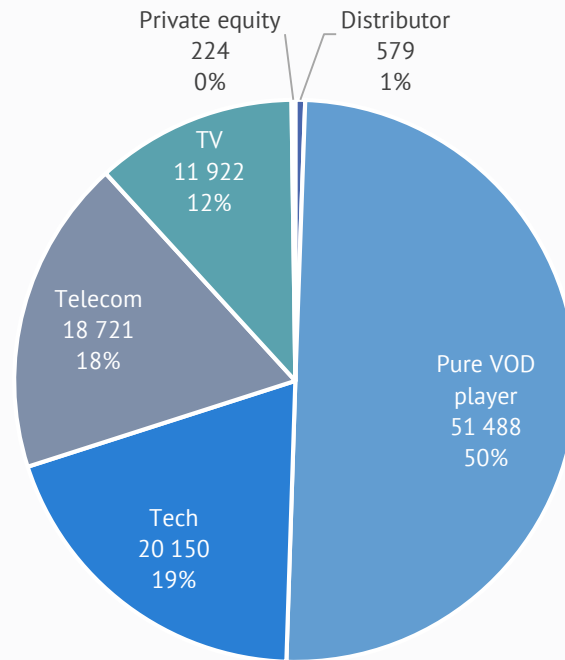

SVOD – Number of TV seasons by core business of service owner



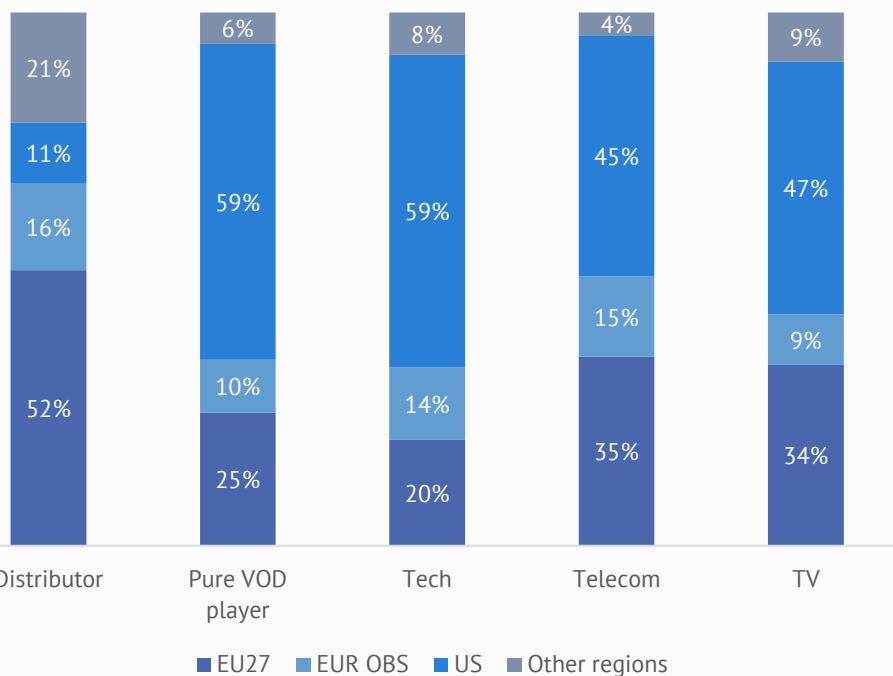

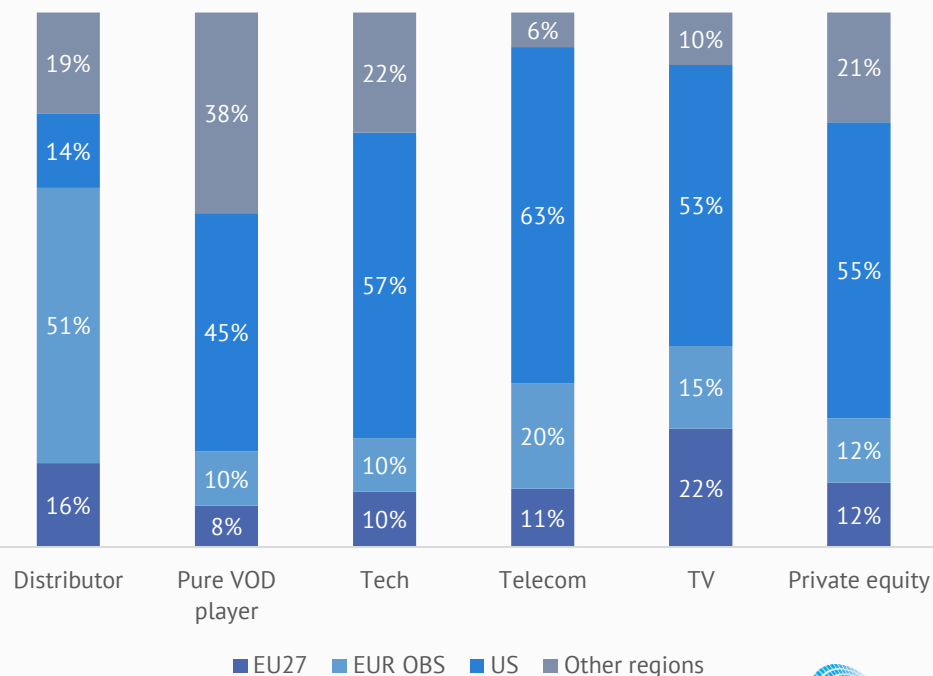

SVOD – Share of TV seasons by core business of service owner

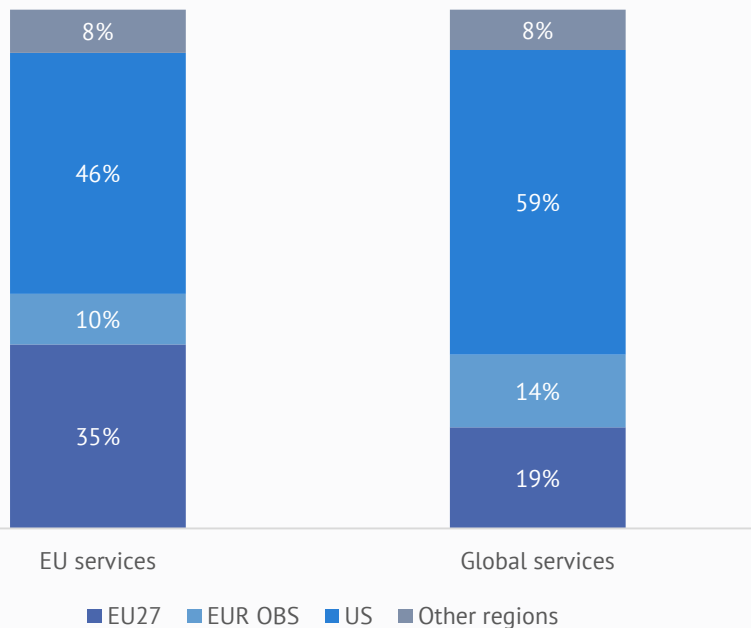

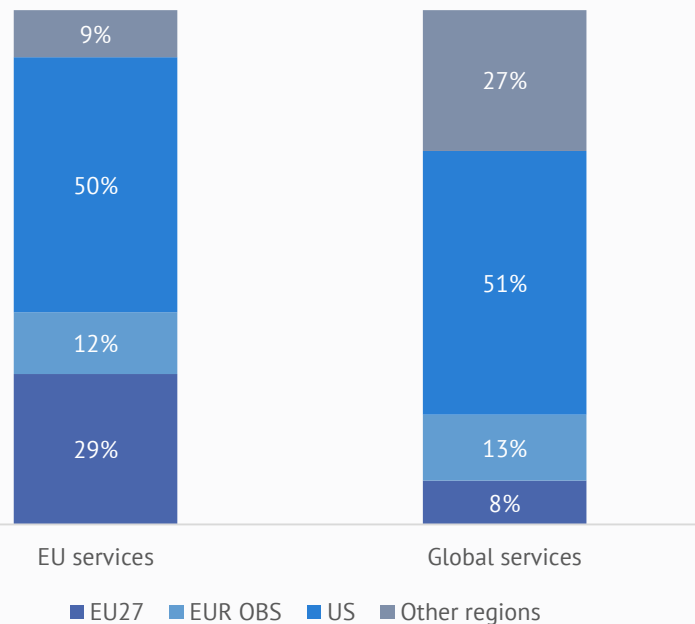

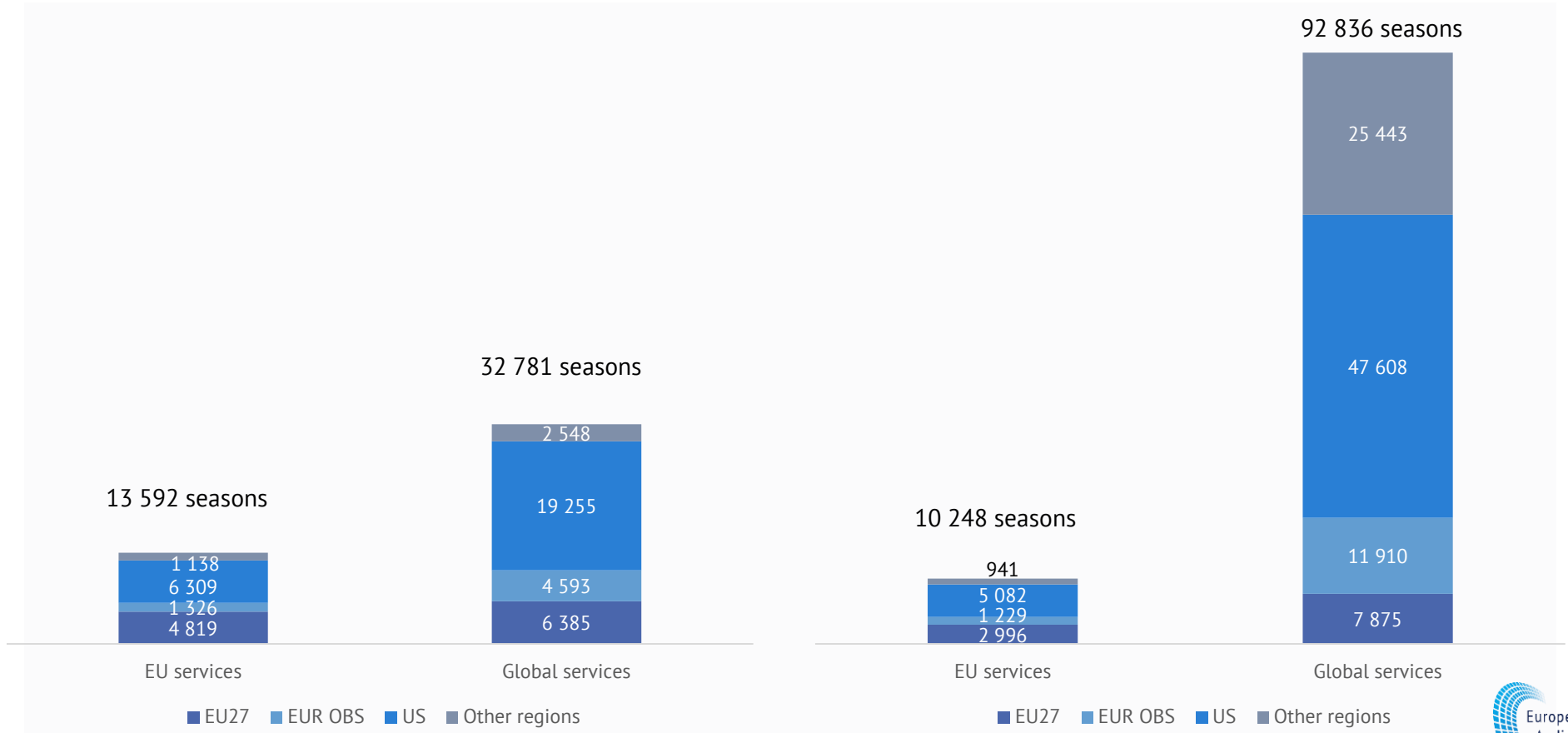

# C.5 – Composition of catalogues by national and EU27 non-national TV contents

TV content on this section was analysed in **cumulated number of seasons**.

## National TV seasons on TVOD vs EU27 non-national content on SVOD

- ▶ EU27 TV content catalogues on TVOD was composed by more than half of national seasons (56%).
- ▶ On the contrary, EU27 non-national TV seasons represented almost the majority (72%) on SVOD: for some services (Netflix, Amazon) the worldwide rights acquisition of content made European content available on all their European catalogues.

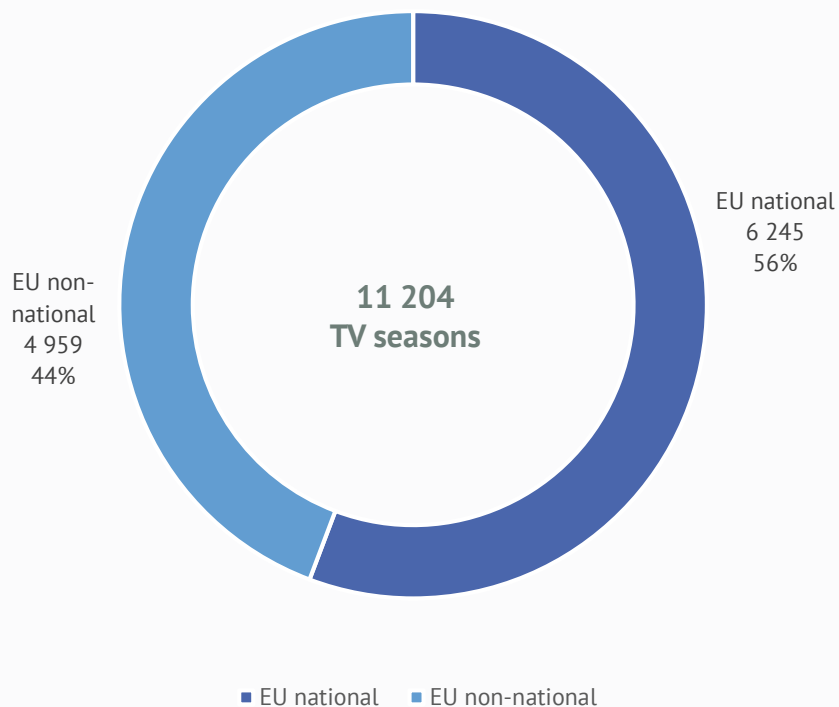

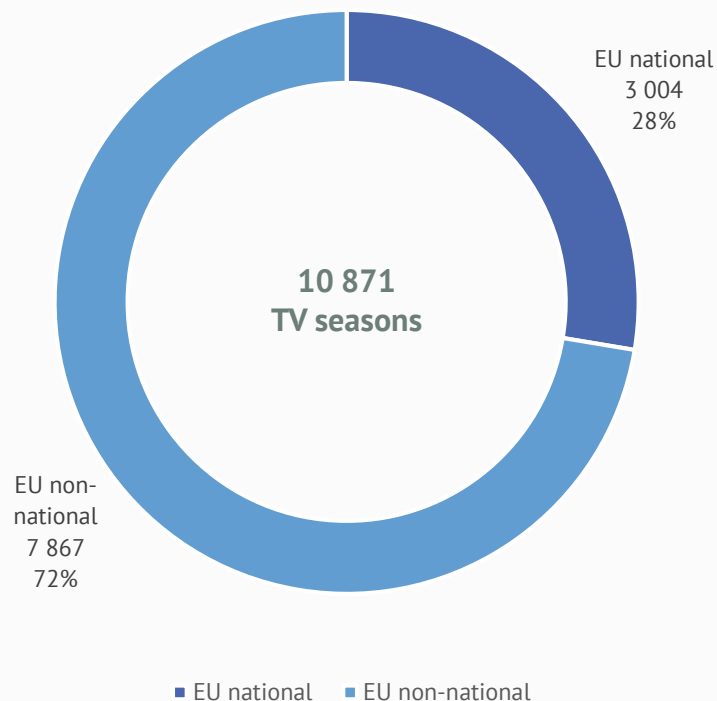

SVOD - Split of national and EU non-national TV seasons

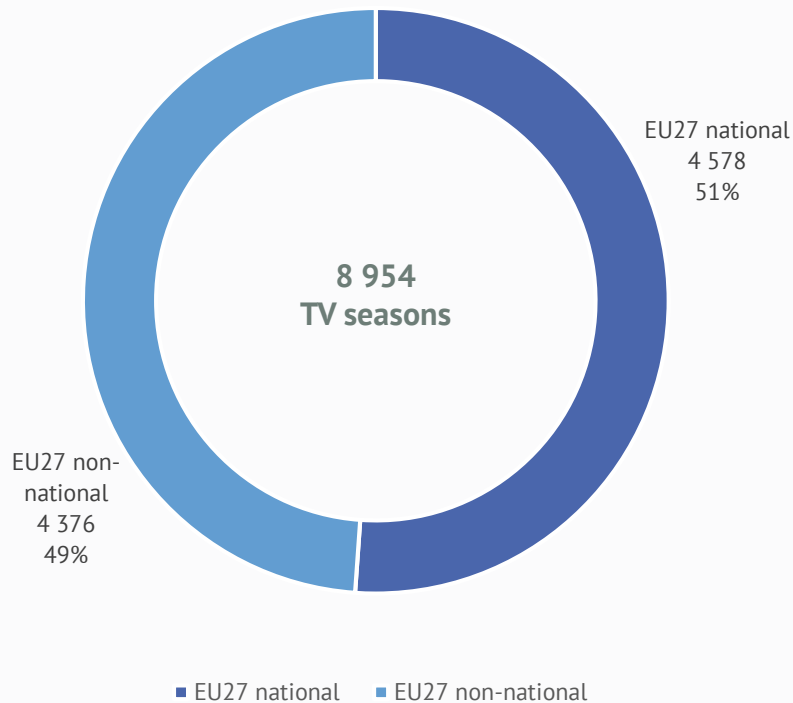

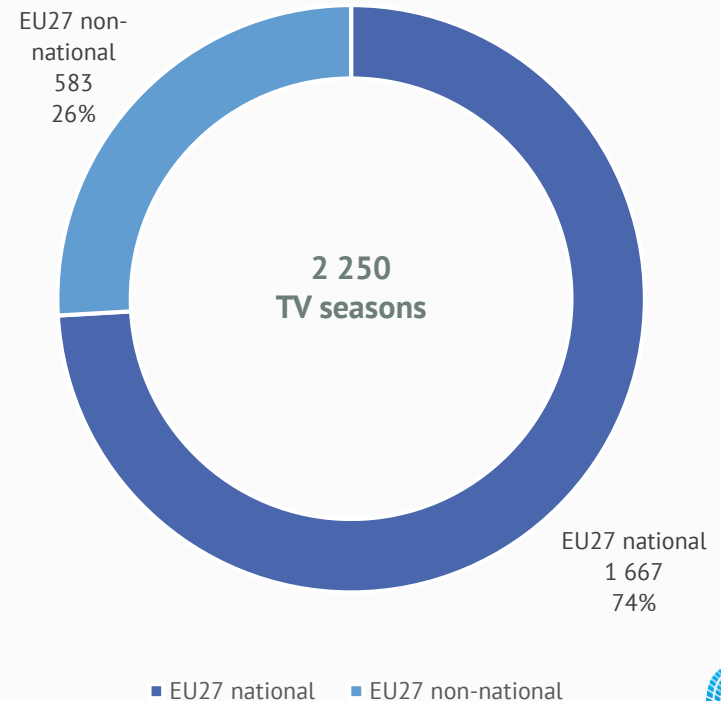

TVOD national services - National vs EU non-national seasons

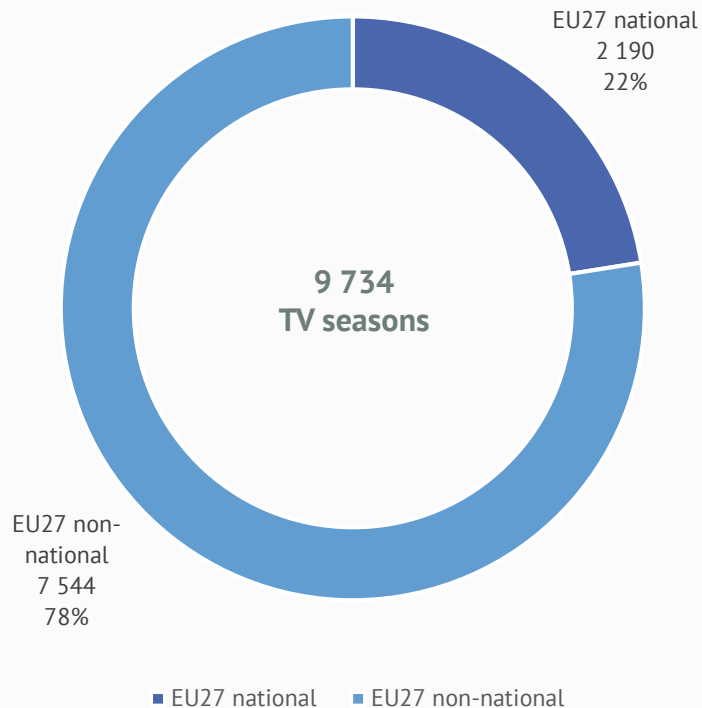

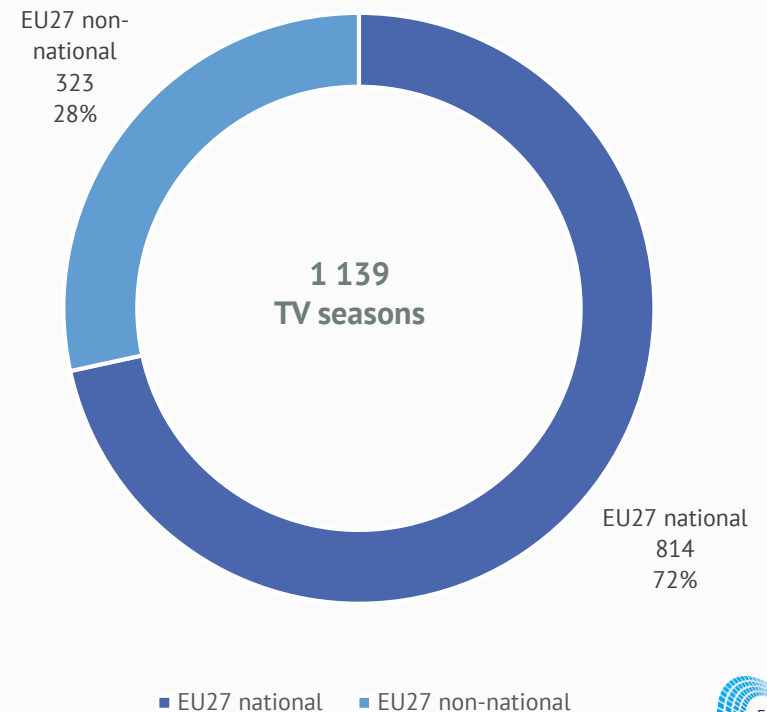

## C.6 – Focus on the Export of European TV contents in EU27, on TVOD and SVOD

TV content was analysed in **cumulated number of seasons**. Only EU27 non-national content is considered.

### **On TVOD services, German TV seasons dominated the export of EU27 TV content (with almost half of the offer)**

- ▶ French exported seasons appeared second in volume, followed by TV seasons from Nordic countries, Austria, Italy, Ireland and Spain.
- ▶ On multi-country TVOD services, almost half of EU27 exported content was of German origin, and together with French, Swedish and Danish they represented 78% of the offer.
- ▶ **With the United Kingdom being accounted as Other European country after Brexit, British TV seasons dominated the export of EUR OBS TV content on TVOD services with 95% of total.**

### **On SVOD, France appeared as the top TV content exporter with 25% of all EU27 exports**

- ▶ EU4 (France, Germany, Spain and Italy) provided 67% of all EU27 TV seasons exported on SVOD.
- ▶ Multi-country and national SVOD services both showed EU4 main origin of exports (67%), but if French content showed always first, the other three countries showed alternating provision shares.
- ▶ **As for TVOD, British TV seasons made up the lion share of Other European seasons on SVOD with 90% of all.**

### **A big presence in number of seasons did not ensure a better export of content**

- ▶ Countries with a lower number of TV seasons available showed a better country export rate.

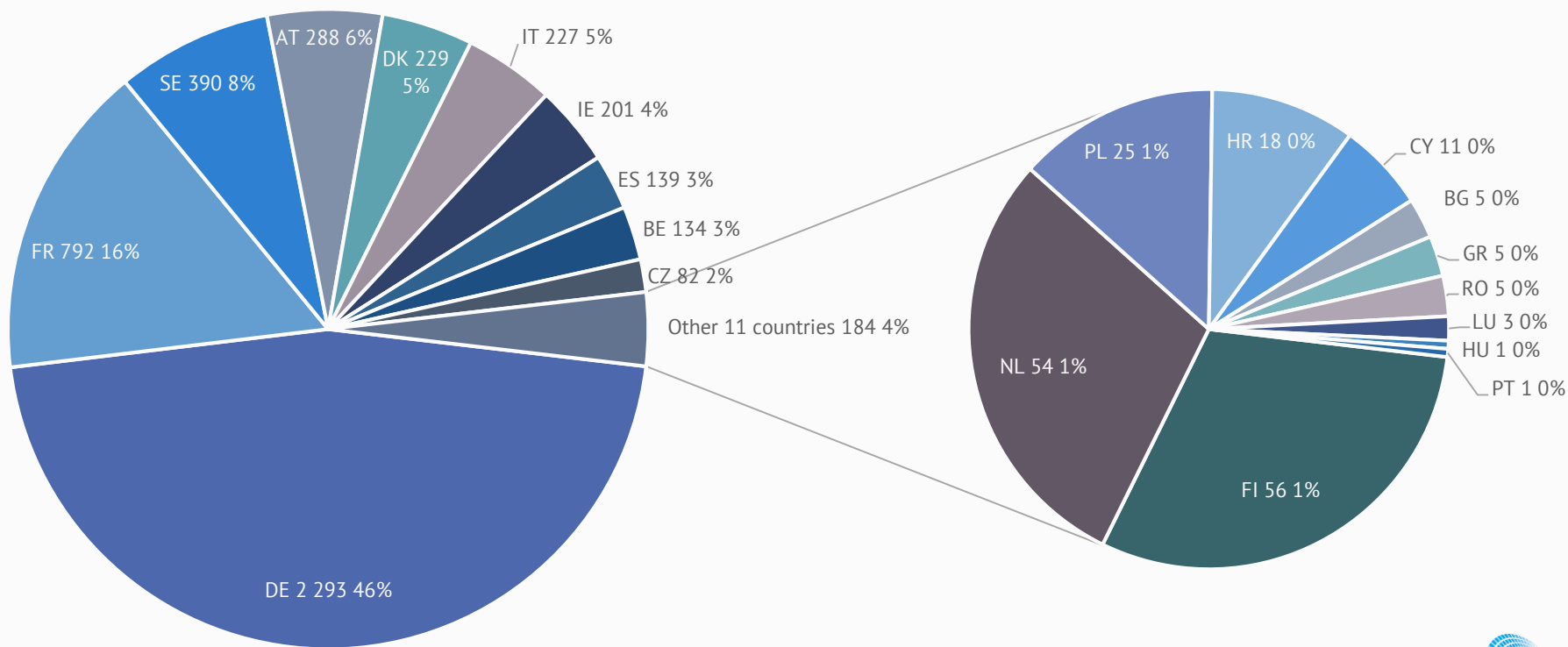
### **Better export rates on SVOD than on TVOD. Recent High-end series reached most countries in export**

- ▶ High-end series (counting 2 to 13 episodes per season) were exported to more countries than longer formats, notably on SVOD catalogues where they represented 81% of EU27 exports.

# 21 EU27 countries exported their TV content on EU27 TVOD services

- ▶ German TV seasons, with almost half of the offer (\*), dominated the export of EU27 TV content on TVOD services, while French exported seasons appeared second in volume.
- ▶ Nordic countries, Austrian, Italian, Irish, Spanish, Belgian and Czech TV seasons completed the top 10 export countries, while other 11 EU countries exports represented only 4% of all EU seasons exported.

TVOD – Number of EU27 TV seasons exported outside of their national market, by country of origin

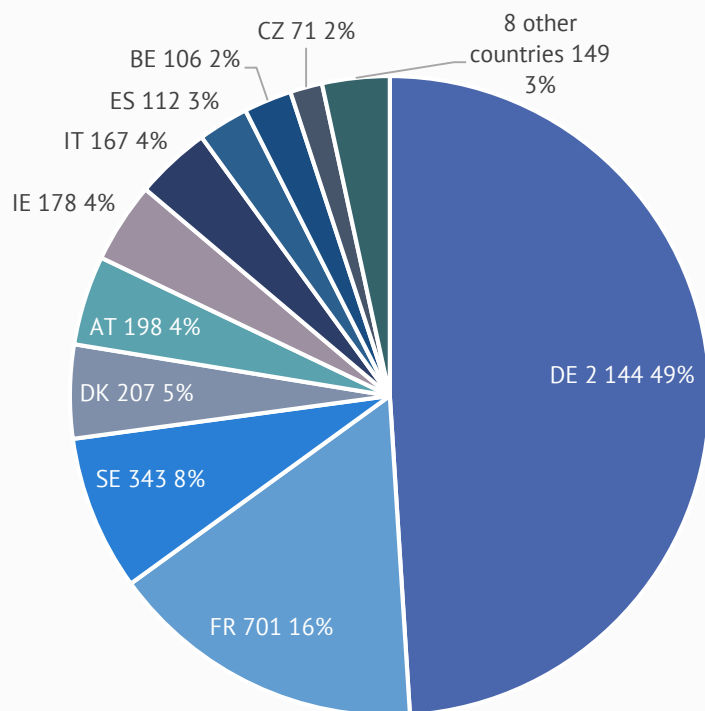

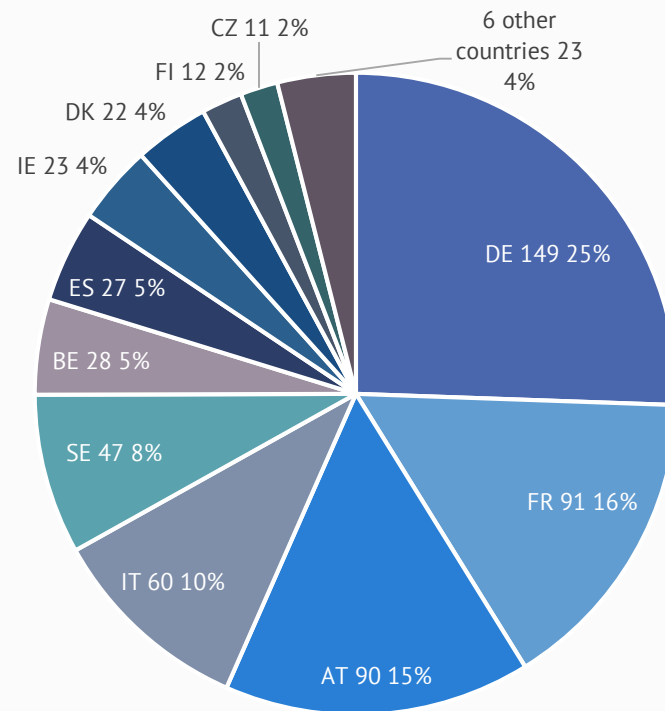

Export of EU TV seasons in 14 national TVOD catalogues



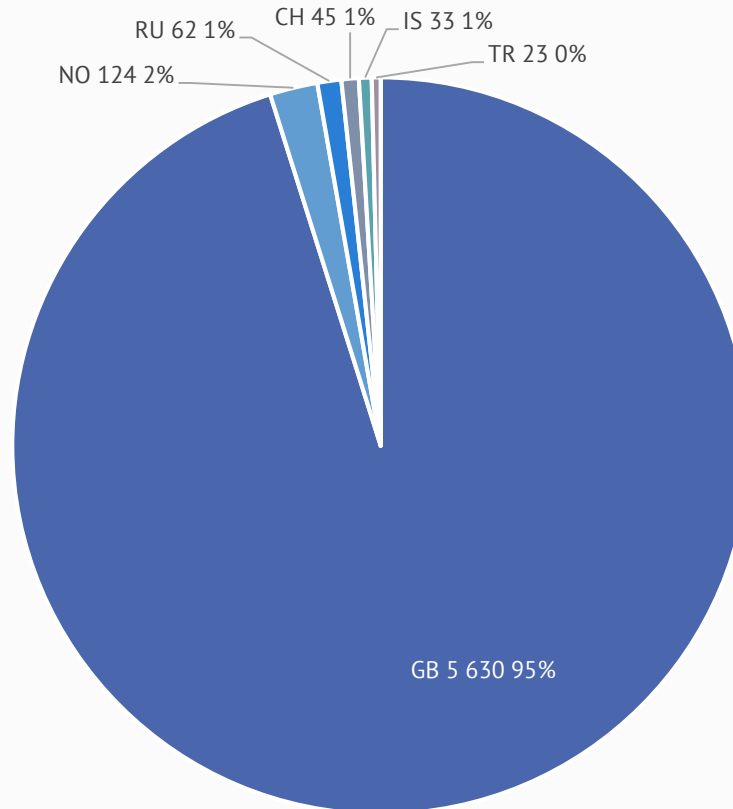

TVOD – EUR OBS TV seasons by country of origin

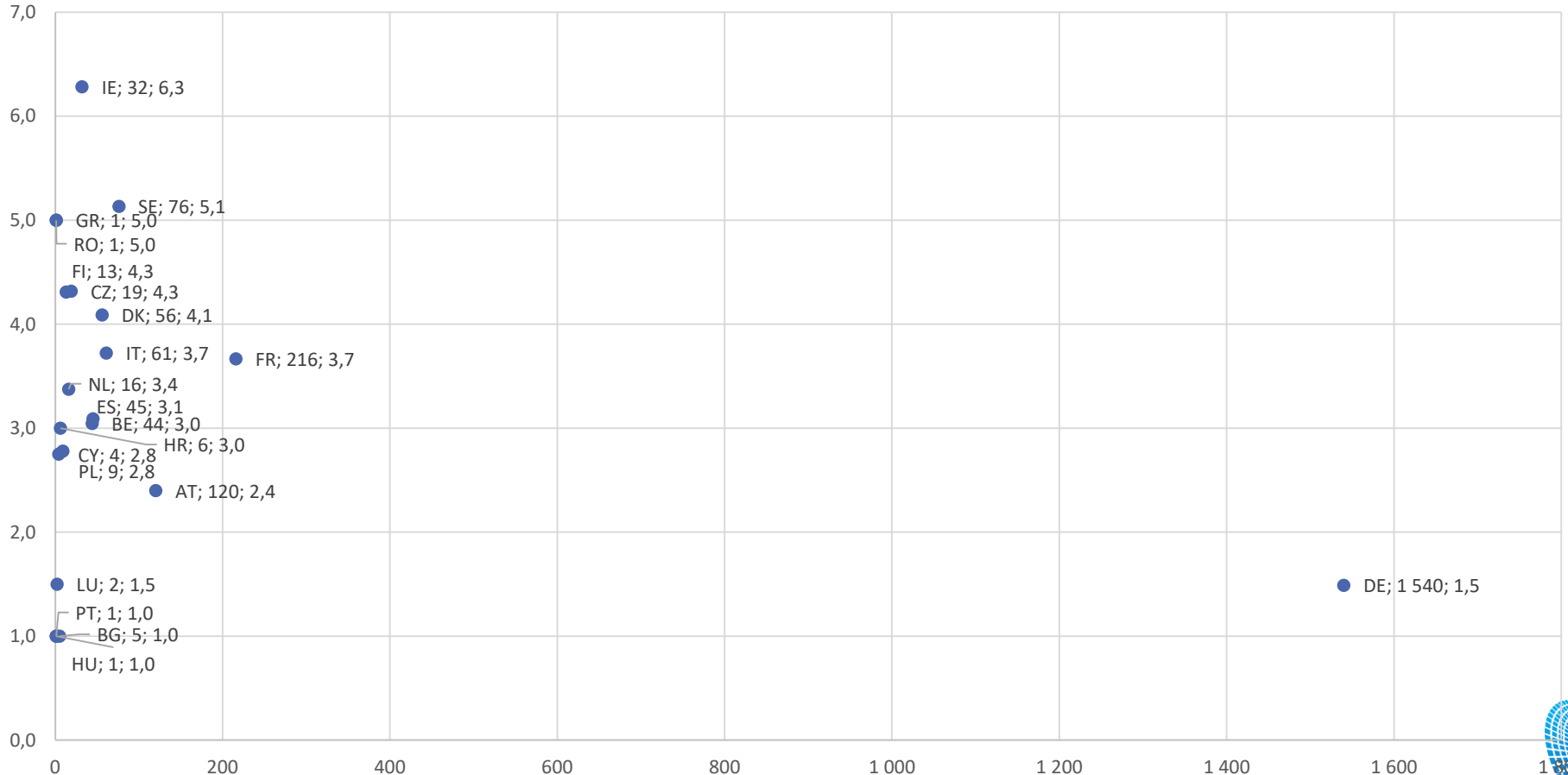

# A big presence in number of seasons does not ensure a better circulation of content

- Countries with a lower number of TV seasons had a better country circulation, as opposed to German numerous seasons but exported only in an average 1,5 countries.
- French and Italian TV seasons showed the best (and equal) average exports circulation, but there was 3,5 times more French content.
- Culturally close countries were targeted export territories: 98% of Austrian content was exported to Germany, and 94% of German, to Austria

- ▶ The top list is completed by Nordic animated TV seasons (2 from Denmark and 1 from Finland).

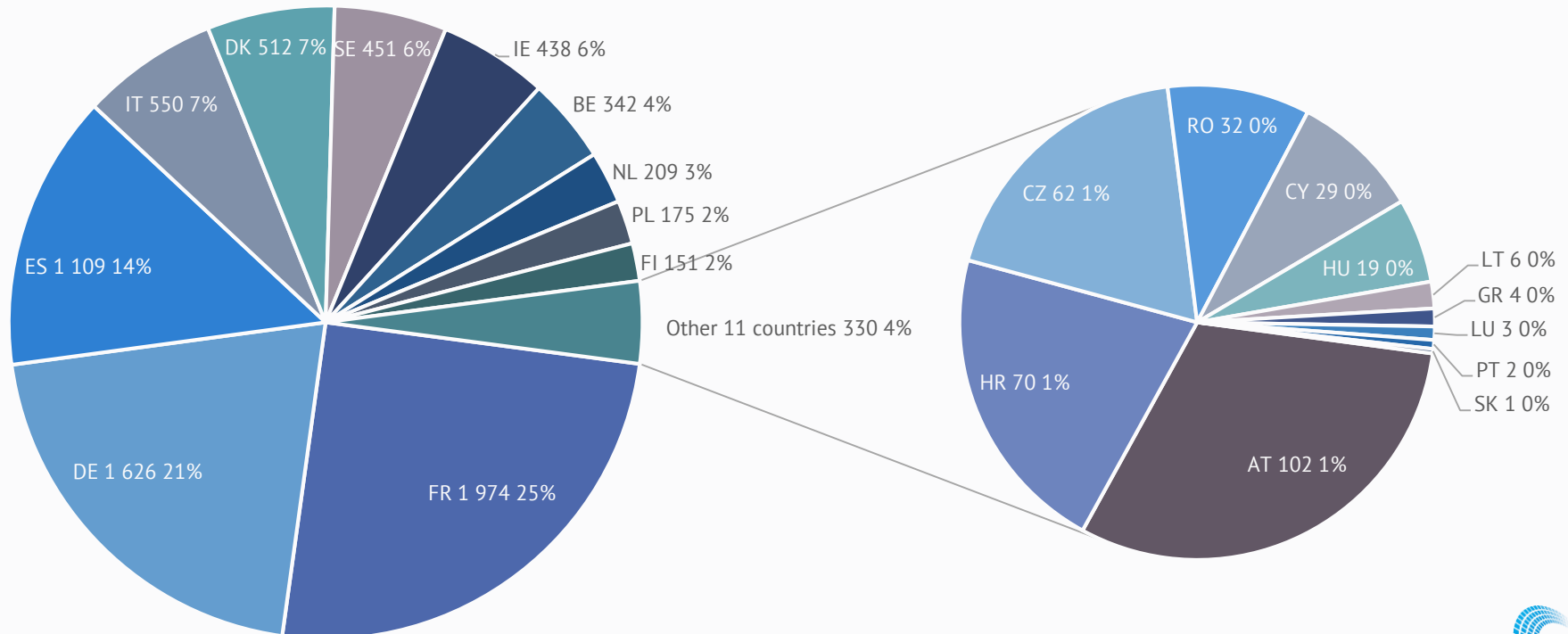

# 22 EU27 countries exported their TV content on EU27 SVOD services

- ▶ On SVOD, France appeared as the top TV content exporter with 25% of all EU27 exports while EU4 (FR, DE, ES, IT) provided 67% of all EU27 TV seasons exported on SVOD.

SVOD – Number of EU TV seasons exported outside of their national market, by country of origin

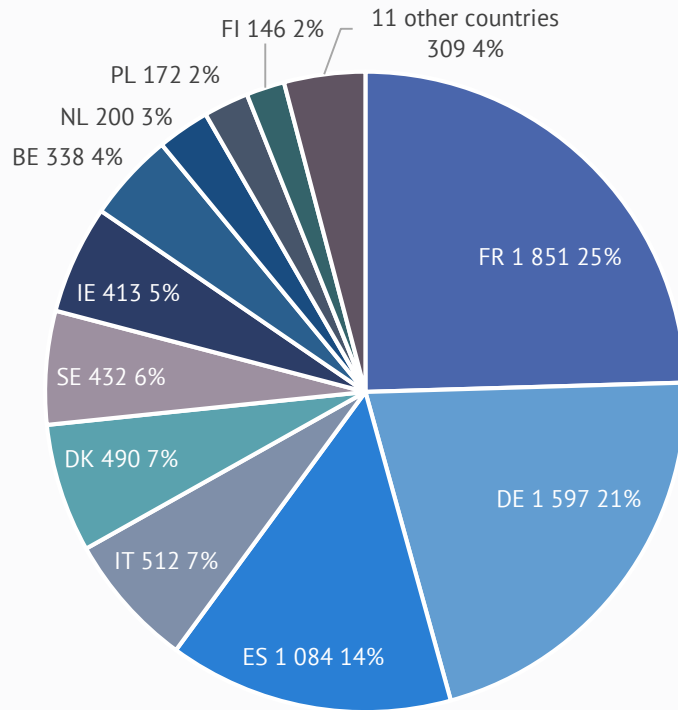

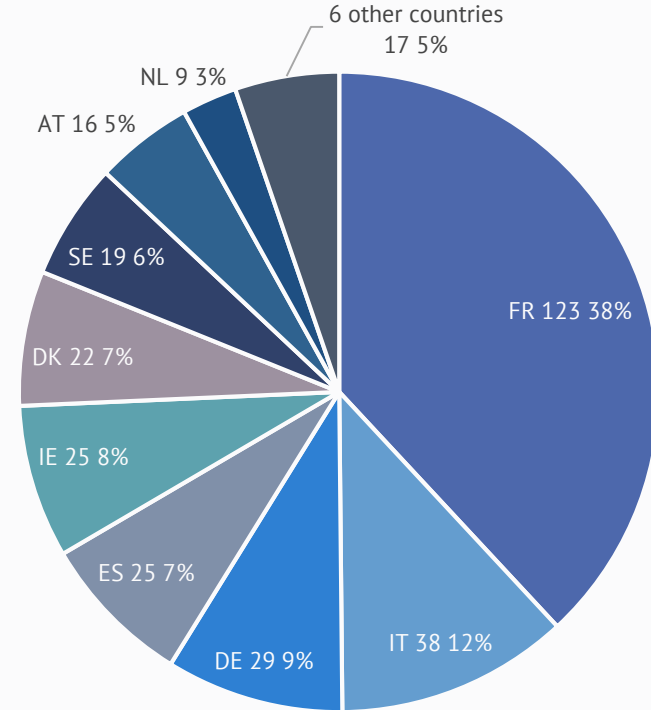

Export of EU TV seasons in 16 national SVOD catalogues

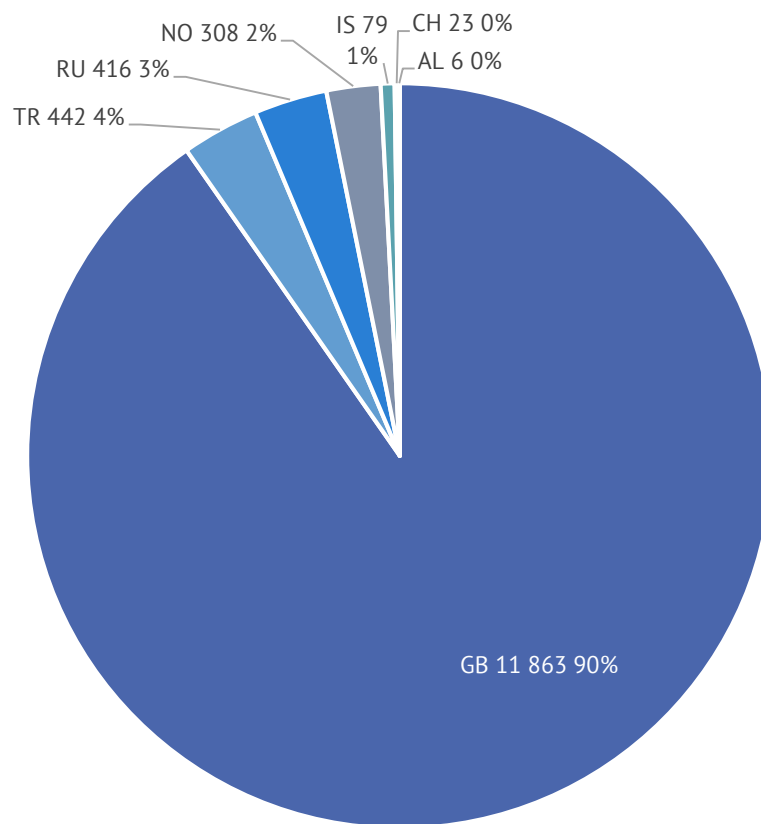

SVOD – EUR OBS TV seasons by country of origin

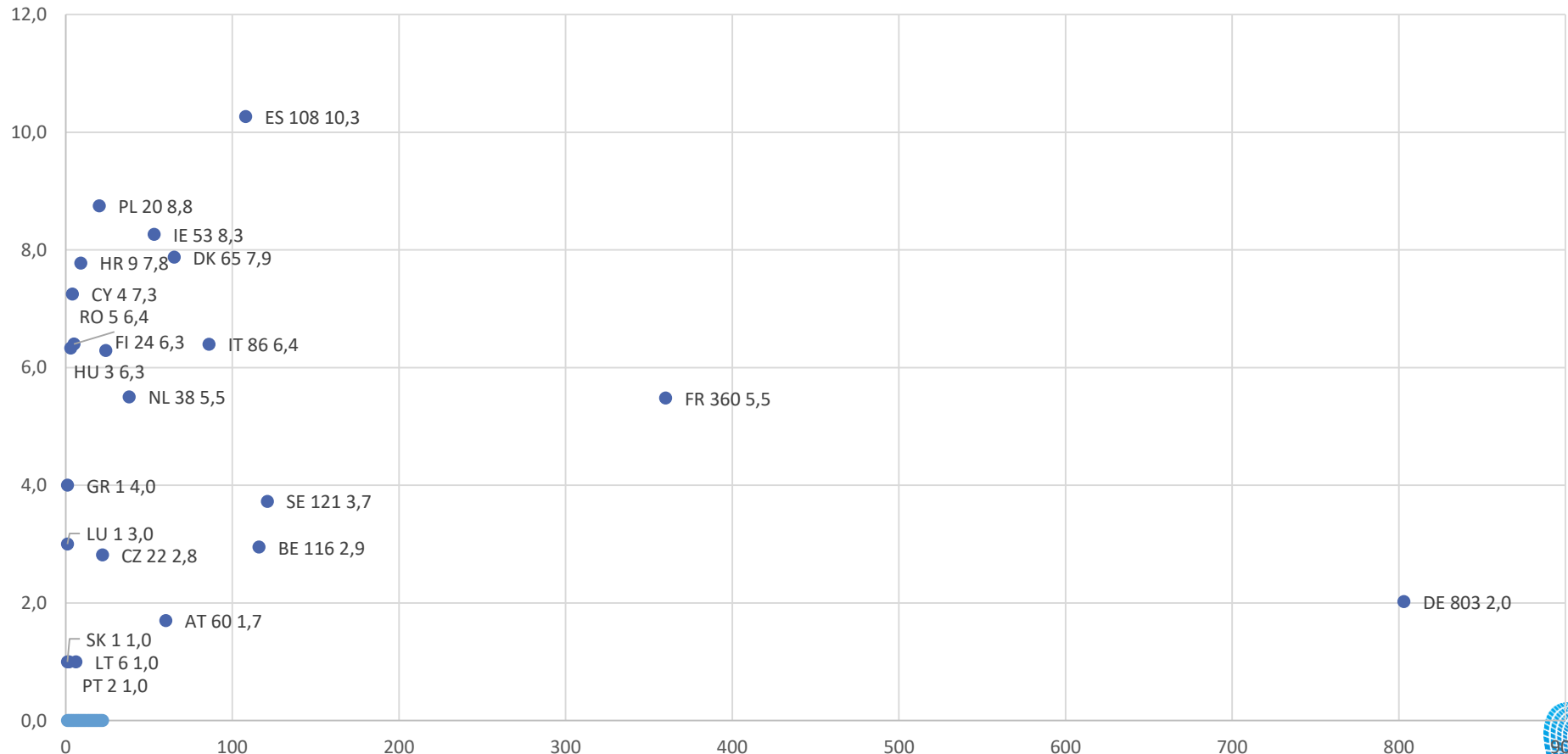

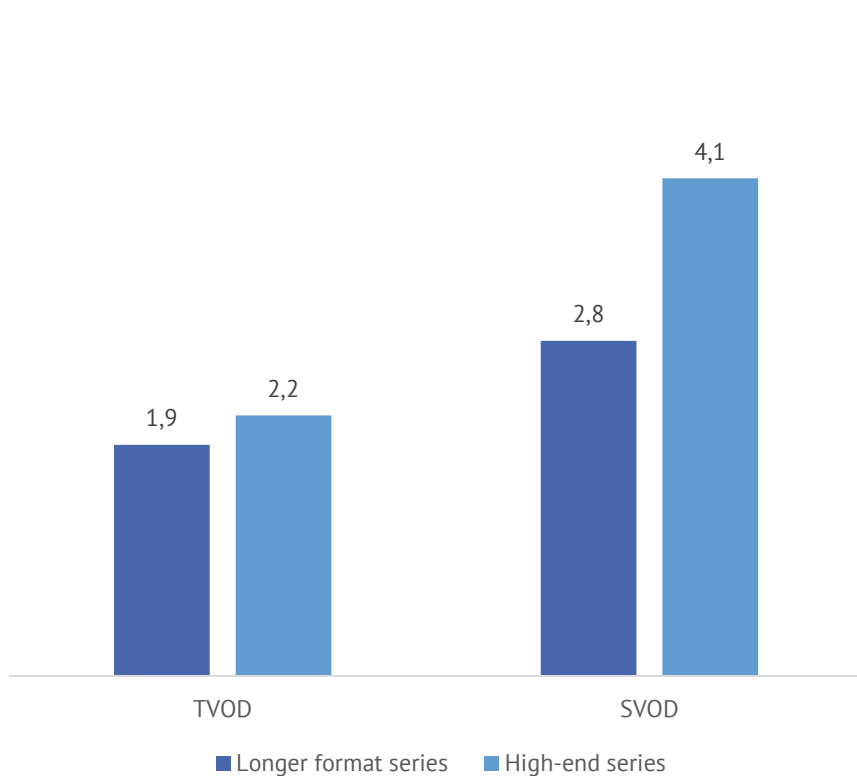

# Focus on series format: recent High-end series were best exported format, on SVOD

- ▶ EU27 TV content was exported (beyond the country of origin) to more countries on SVOD than on TVOD.
- ▶ High-end series (series counting 2 to 13 episodes per season) were more exported than longer formats.
- ▶ **Recent high-end series** (2010-2020) were the **most exported format**, reaching in average 5,5 countries of export on SVOD. They represented **81% of total EU27 exports on SVOD** and 52% on TVOD.
